He needs a little push.

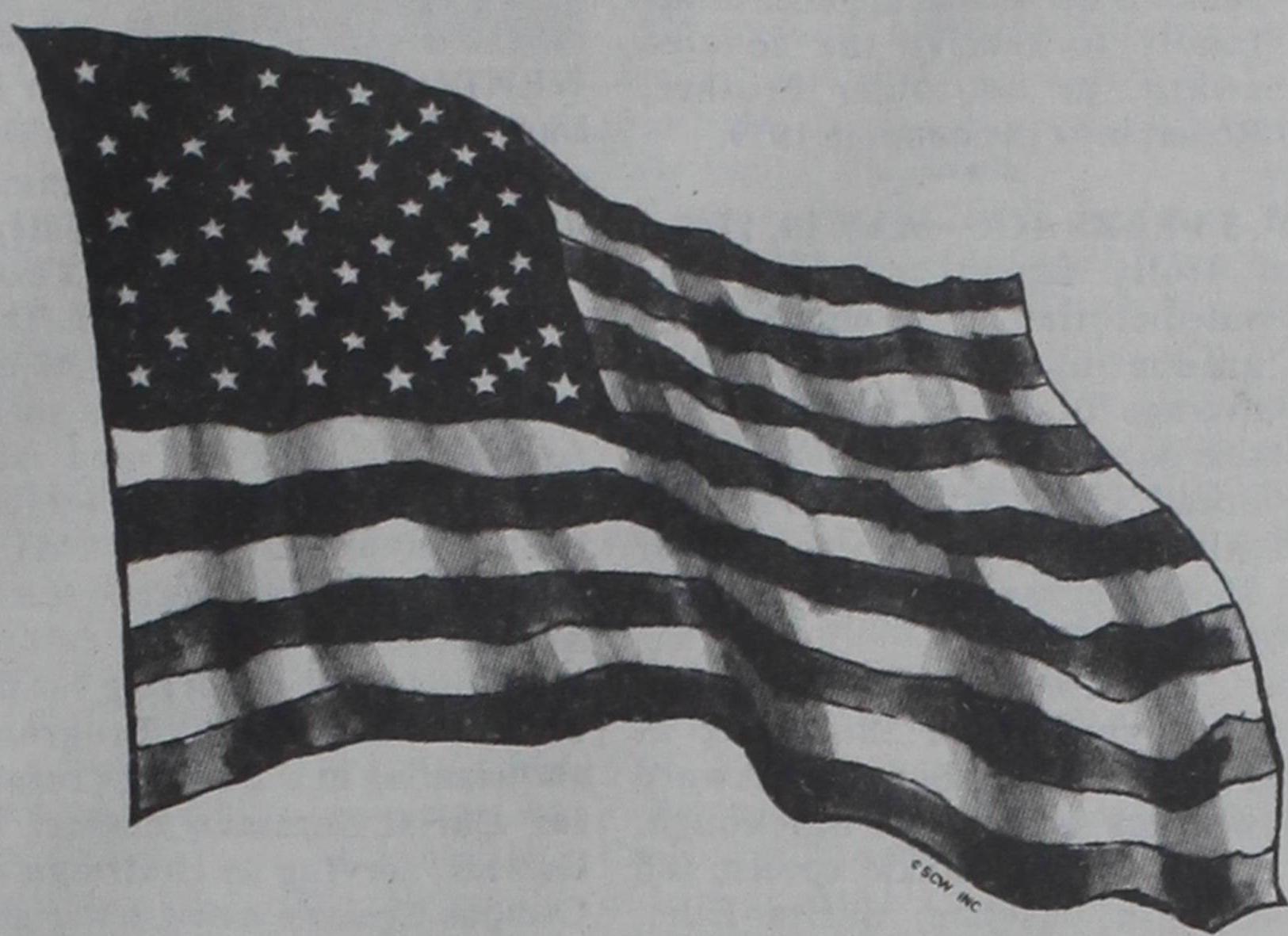
But it still holds true you'll find your Quayle,

## We Raised The Flag

The morning of November 11, 1943, started off as usual; hot and humid! These were the days when we were real short on food and sleep. For breakfast, a piece of bacon maybe two inches long, half a tablespoon of powdered eggs, half of a hard tack (about the size of and looked like a ginger snap) and a third of a canteen cup of coffee. This would be our big meal for the day, plus plenty of coconuts to pick up off the ground to eat.

After breakfast we were just loafing around, these island were now secure and all we had to do was build a Navy base with no tools or supplies!

Mr. Murphy came up to us and said "We just got word that Ol' Bull (Admiral Halsey) is coming to see us today. We have won this island with sweat, blood and human lives. Looks like if any of you boys had any respect for the men we have lost, you would see to it that our flag would be flying when he gets here."

That's all that was said, so Okie and me took my machete and went back in the jungle and found a tree that suited the purpose, cut it down and trimmed it up. Joe Fincher got the flag--we don't remember where or who from, and we don't remember how we attached it to the tree flagpole--but we commented on the fact, "Wish we had a bugle and someone to play colors," or a record player with the Star Spangled Banner to play.

I thought that it was a clear day that morning, but when we looked up at the Ol' Red, White and Blue, flying so free, we had to wipe water out of our eyes. It was so good as we sat down on a log to rest and watch the other fellows as they would come out of the jungle into our little clearing of a camp. They would be stooped, a little hungry, sleepy and tired, but when they spotted Ol' Glory flying, they were able to stand a little straighter, give a sharp salute, then wipe a tear out of their eyes.

That American flag that morning was everything that we were not, but wanted to be. Up above the rot and filth of the hot, steamy jungle floor, with rotten coconuts, land crabs and centipedes. Its Red, White and Blue colors were so fresh and bright and clean and free, flying above with so much energy and life about it. That's where God's children belong! That had to be the first American flag to ever fly over these Treasury Islands, of the Northern Solomons in the Southwest Pacific.

P.S.--There were no flag-burners in this bunch of men.

Mia Jennings is the class valedictorian. She has been extremely active in various school and community activities.

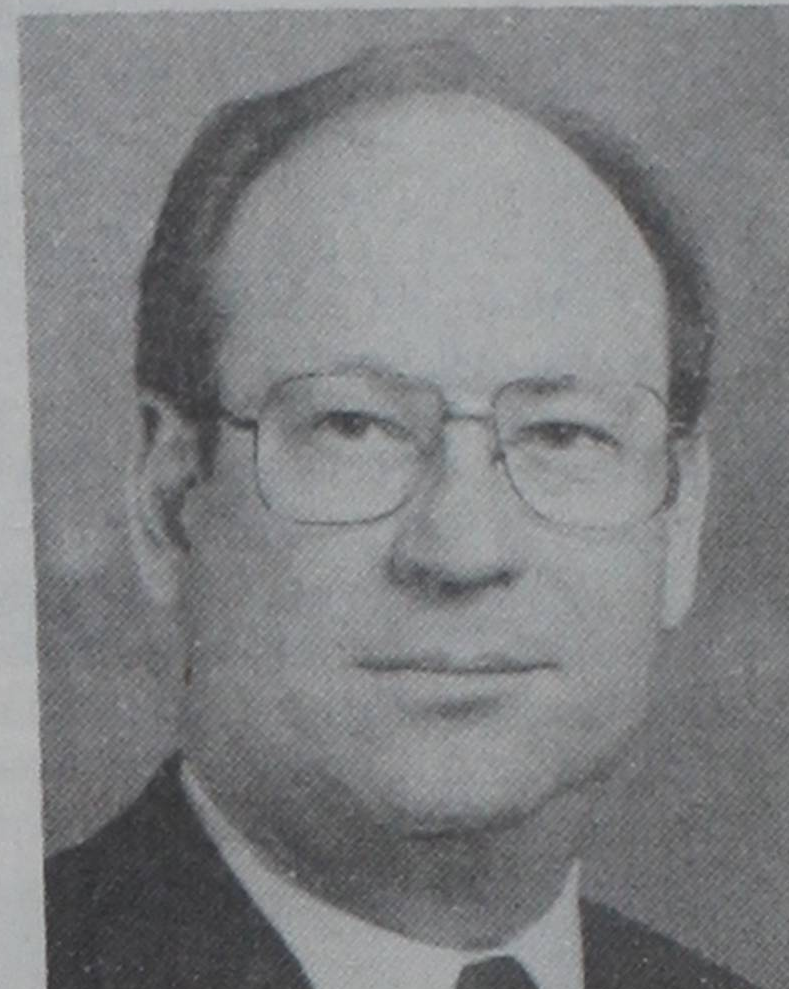

Fielding visited with the group expressing Excel's position on the situation. As was stated at the meeting at Excel last week, "Excel cannot continue to do business in Texas unless something can be done to curb the expense of the worker's comp insurance program.

Fielding stressed that Excel is very committed to doing everything possible to help solve the problem. The major problem involves a very small percentage of the Excel workers who, with the help of some attorneys and doctors, abuse the system.

Excel officials have continually expressed their desire to take care of their employees. Thousands of dollars have been spent to provide a safe working environment and employees with legitimate work-related injuries will be cared for.

At the same time, Excel is

committed to stop fraudulent use of the system which is putting the jobs of at least 2500 people in jeopardy, as well as the continued operation of their facilities in Texas.

"The entire economy of this area is very strongly related to the cattle feeding industry, and even those who think they have no direct connection to agriculture should be concerned, because the livelihood of most of the people in Friona is, in fact, related to agriculture and particularly the livestock industry," said Kathryn Goddard, Chamber of Commerce spokesperson.

He was a first team all-district runningback as a junior and senior; football captain two years, and played basketball three years.

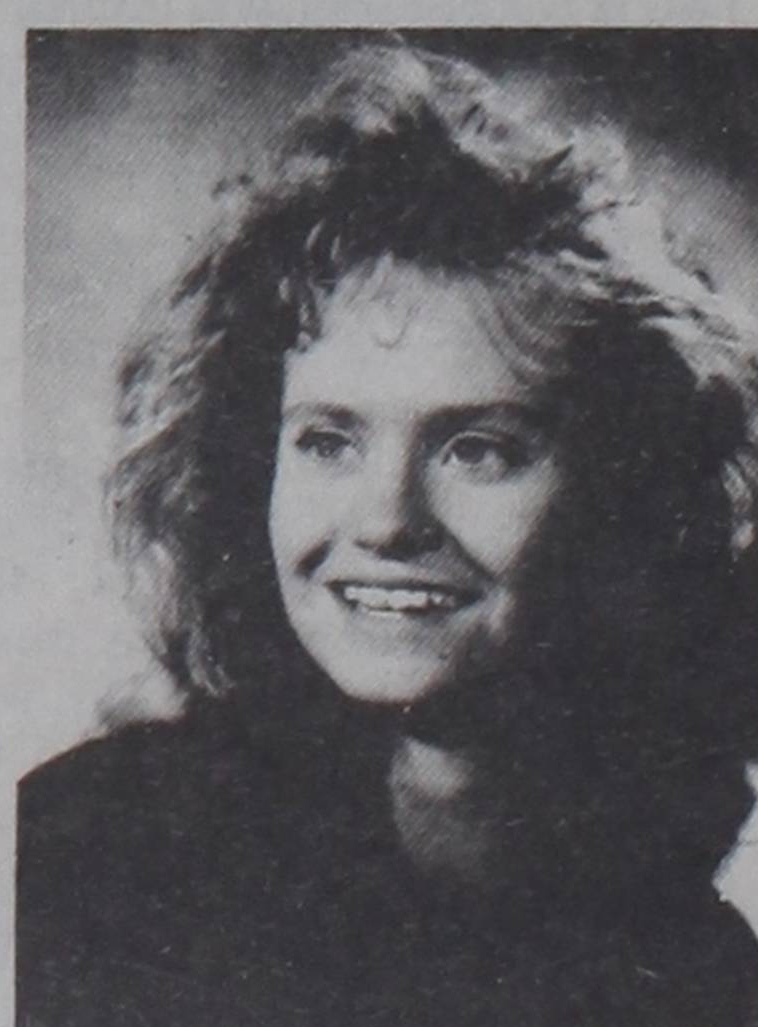
He was class favorite twice, most popular and most friendly two years.

# Friona Flashbacks

....from the files of The Friona Star

## 60 YEARS AGO--MAY 9, 1930

Steel workers have arrived in Friona and started work on the new elevated water tank, which is to supply the water works system. When completed, the tank will have a capacity of 50,000 gallons. It is known as the hemispherical bottom type. Elevated storage will give Friona a water system which will be economical to operate and efficient in service. A small pumping unit fills the tank in a short time and will be able to keep it full at all times to meet the demand. This reserve flows by gravity to all parts of the system. The tank is to be elevated to a distance of 92 feet above the ground which means the water will always have a gravity pressure of at least 40 pounds.

## 55 YEARS AGO--MAY 10, 1935

The Baptist congregation has purchased a part of the J.L. Landrum building on Euclid Avenue and moved it to the lot adjoining their church property. The building is being converted into a cottage to be used by the pastor as a parsonage. The carpentry work is being supervised by Rev. E. Ray Lansdown, assisted by members of the congregation.

## 50 YEARS AGO--MAY 10, 1940

Paul Spring, arts and science junior at Texas Technological College, has been elected president of the American Chemical Society to serve during the next school year. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. F.L. Spring of Friona.

## 45 YEARS AGO--MAY 11, 1945

Two Friona girls, Misses Anna Lee and Eula May White, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Ed S. White, were injured near Black Tuesday night, in a car wreck when the car in which they were riding turned over. A blow out on one of the tires was the cause of the mishap. Anna Lee received a severe cut on the leg, but her sister received only minor scratches and bruises.

## 40 YEARS AGO--MAY 5, 1950

Work is now underway on the \$60,000-\$70,000 church building being built for the First Baptist Church in Friona. The new unit will consist of an auditorium with a seating capacity of 500, offices and additional Sunday School facilities. Steel, concrete and brick are being used in this modern functional-designed building. Being supervised by G.G. Gilliland, the plans are from the drawing boards of architects Shaffer and Merrill of Clovis. Rev. Tommie B. Allen is the local Baptist minister, being here since May, 1947.

Contract was let Tuesday morning for a new 250,000 bushel elevator for the Black Grain Company, according to announcement just made by J.R. (Pete) Braxton, manager. This will more than double the present capacity of 200,000 bushels in the elevator just completed.

## 35 YEARS AGO--MAY 6, 1955

Announcement of the honor students of the high school graduating class was made this week by Principal Dillie Kelley. Valedictorian is Gay Cass, who has a four-year grade point average of 95.6. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kenyth Cass. Zelma Fay Beaty is salutatorian with a grade point average of 94.5. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Beaty. Deniese Magness was in third place with an average of 93.3. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H.T. Magness.

## 30 YEARS AGO--MAY 5, 1960

Jackie Hight, a senior student in Friona High School, was injured in a car-pickup wreck about four miles west of Friona on FM 1731 Saturday afternoon about 3 p.m. David Kelley, who works for Doris Buske, was traveling west on the road and stopped at the twin lakes to see how the fishermen were making out. While he was stopped, Hight rammed into the rear of his pickup. Witnesses said the visibility was impaired by dust. The Hight auto, a 1955 Chevy, was a total loss. He was taken to Parmer County Community Hospital, where he was treated for head injuries.

## 25 YEARS AGO--MAY 6, 1965

Danny Murphree will be entered

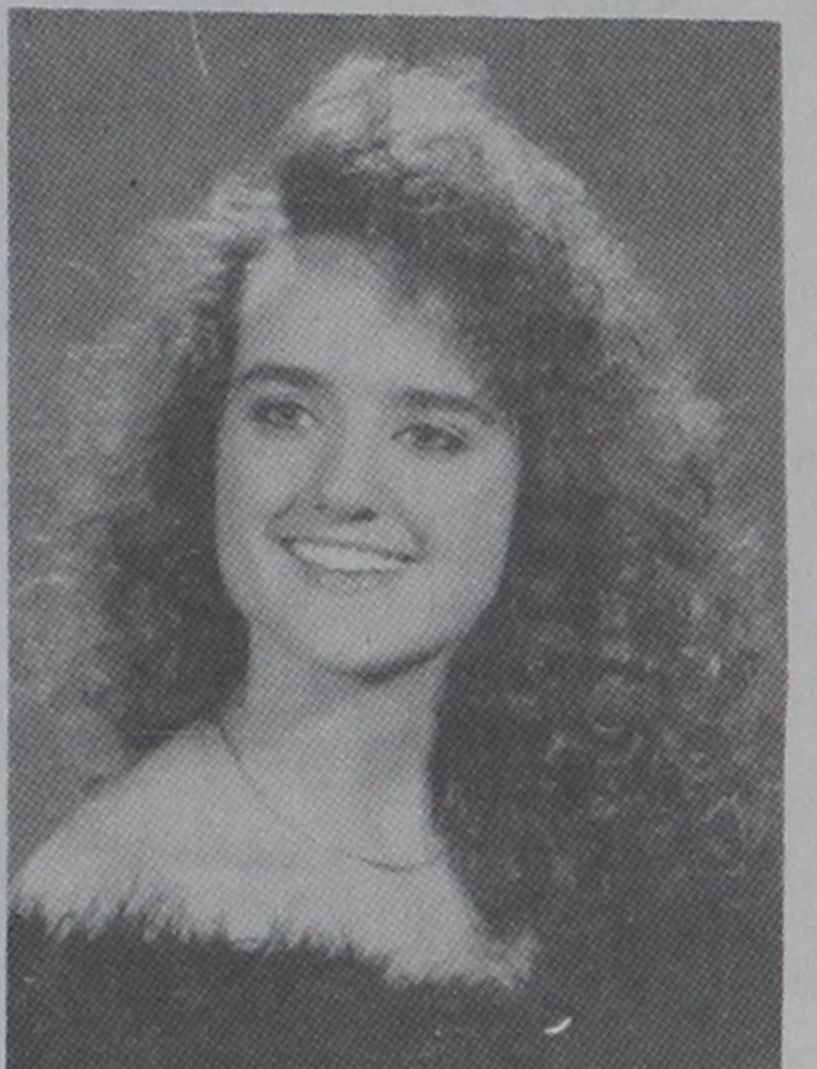

Other areas of discussion will include whether we will establish a bank account for FADA, also if the committee is interested in adopting a fund raiser to help defray costs.

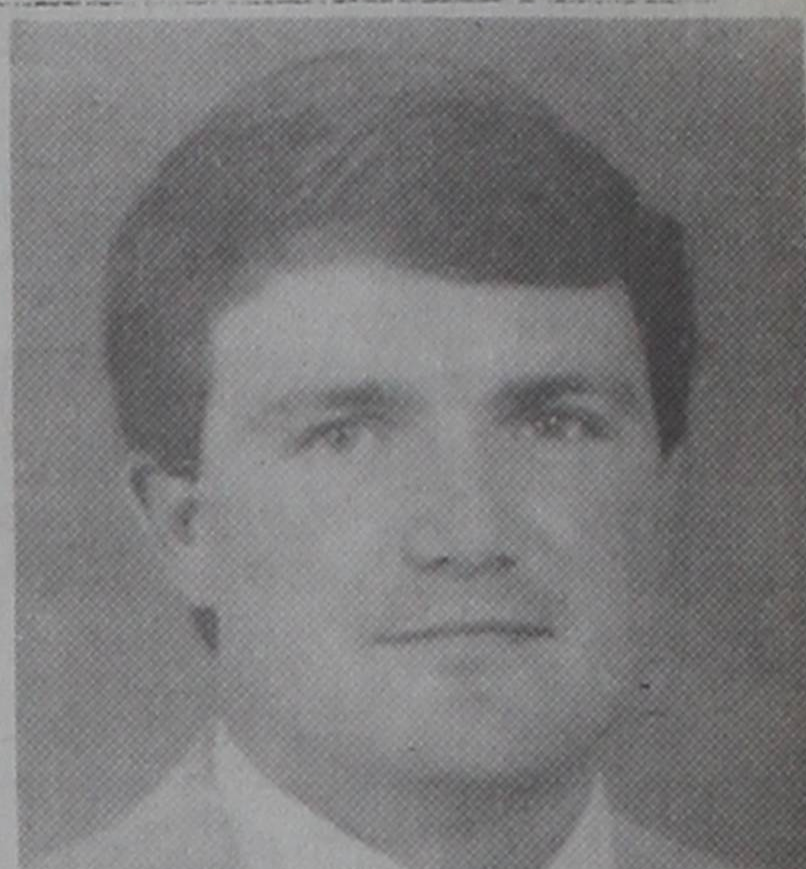

Feedlots within the area served by Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) during 1989 fed the highest number of cattle on record, according to SPS's annual Fed Cattle Survey.

Feedlots in the SPS service area fed 5,468,350 head of cattle, a 2.5% increase over the 1988 total of 5,335,603. The previous record was set in 1987 with 5,406,975 cattle fed.

The survey also showed that the one-time total capacity of area feedlots in 1989 was 2,785,475 head, up from the one-time total capacity in 1988 of 2,758,662 head.

"The 1989 study shows how important cattle feeding is to the area's economy," said Dave Krupnick, SPS manager of agricultural and wholesale marketing. "Although prices for feeder cattle remain up, 1989 was

still a record year for this area."

SPS annually prepares a Fed Cattle Survey covering feedlots in its service area. The electric utility serves a 52,000-square-mile area comprising the Texas and Oklahoma panhandles, the Texas South Plains, eastern and southeastern New Mexico, and southwestern Kansas.

Additionally, the survey found that 4,694,852 cattle were slaughtered last year at 13 beef-packing plants in the SPS service area, Krupnick said. The facilities have an annual slaughter capacity of 4,818,320 head.

"Each year feedlots and packing plants are very cooperative in supplying information for this survey, and we really appreciate that," Krupnick said. "We continue to receive requests from across the United States for this

survey, and it helps highlight this area's agriculture and food-processing industries."

The report also shows that the total number of feedlots in the area has grown to 117, and the one-time capacity of these lots is still on the increase. The report also includes a chart on the ten-year history of fed cattle and the one-time capacity of surveyed feed lots, as well as information on the number of feedlots with 5,000-head capacity or above and a county breakdown of lot capacity and numbers fed.

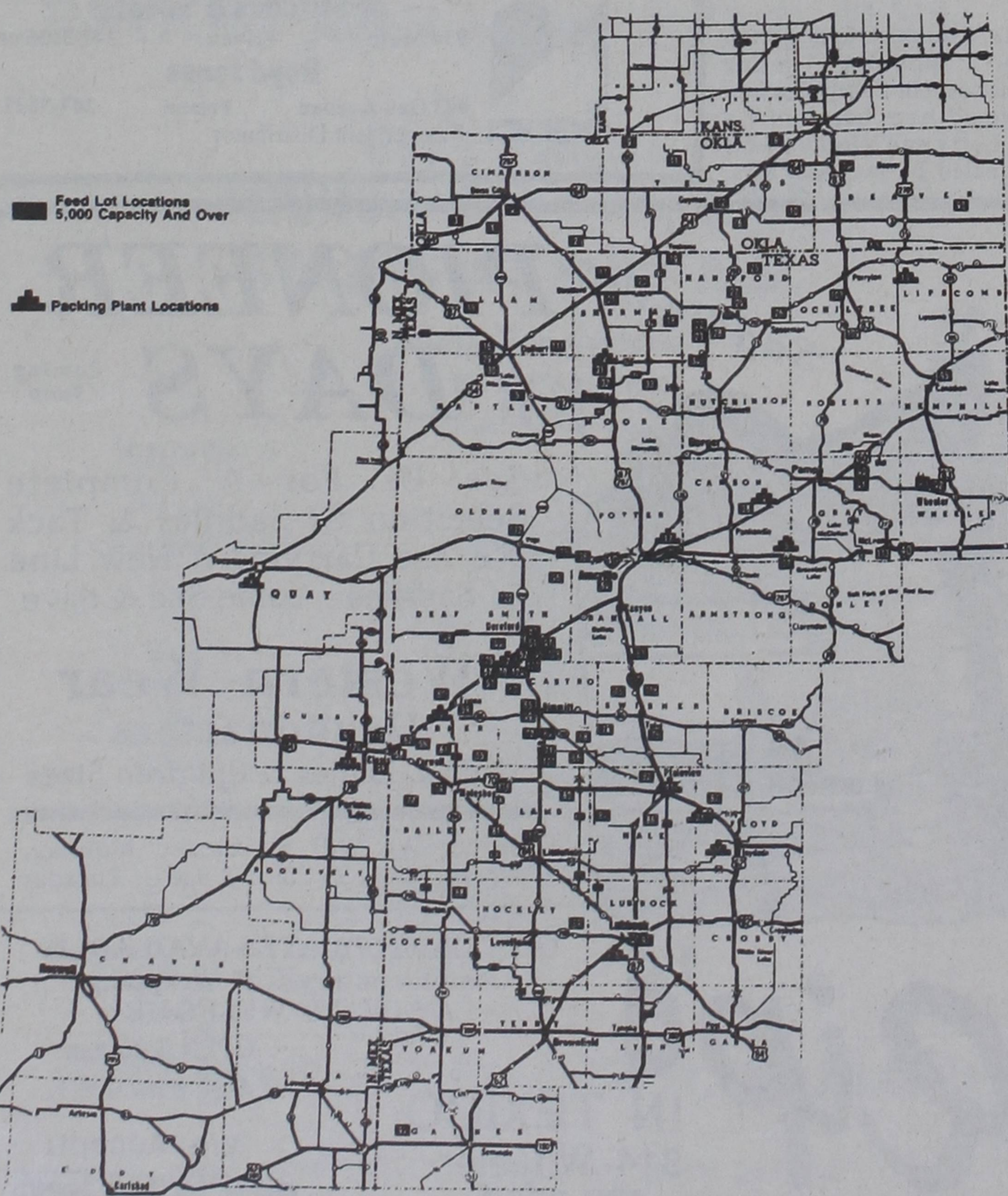

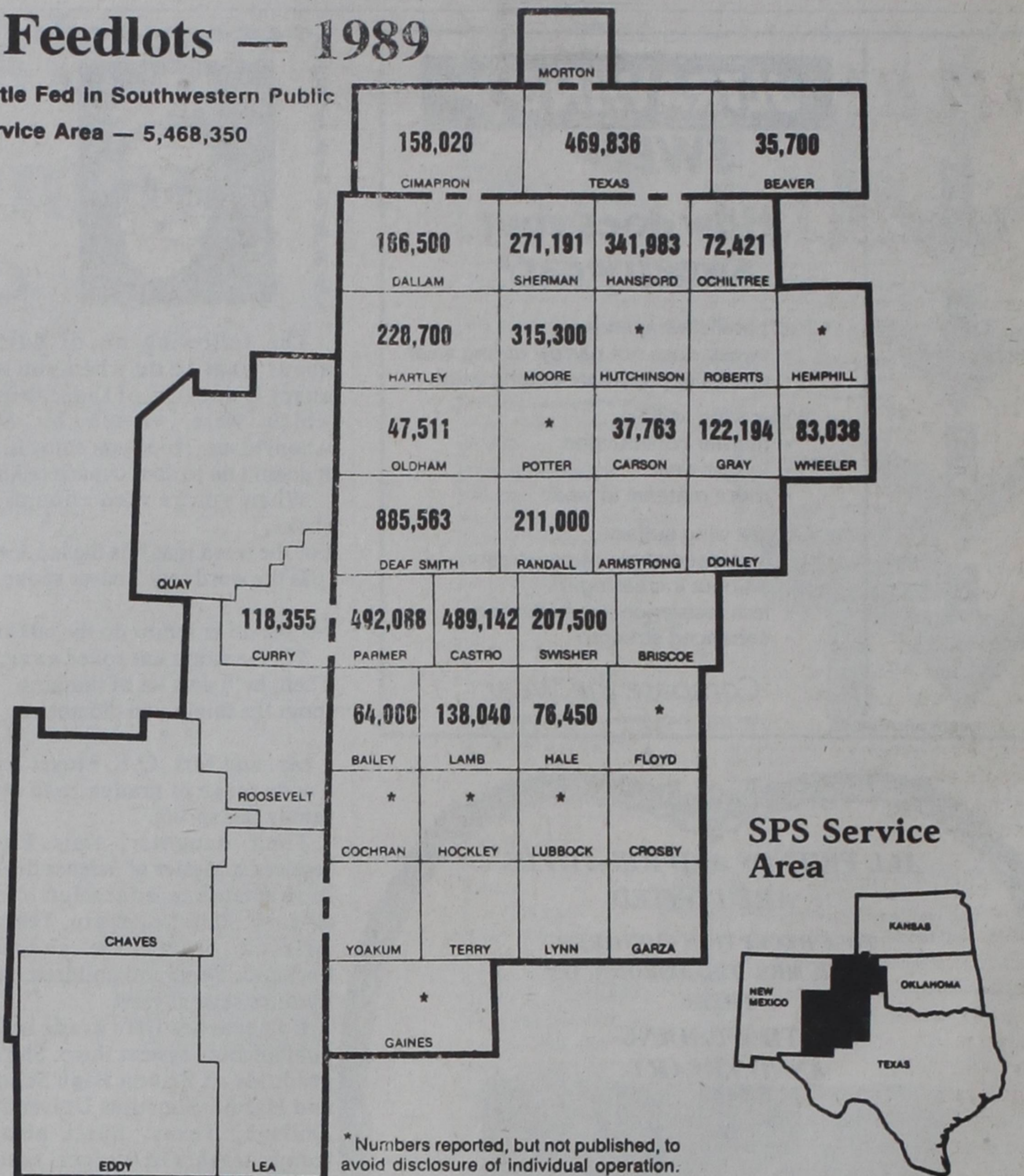

## Packing Plants — 1989

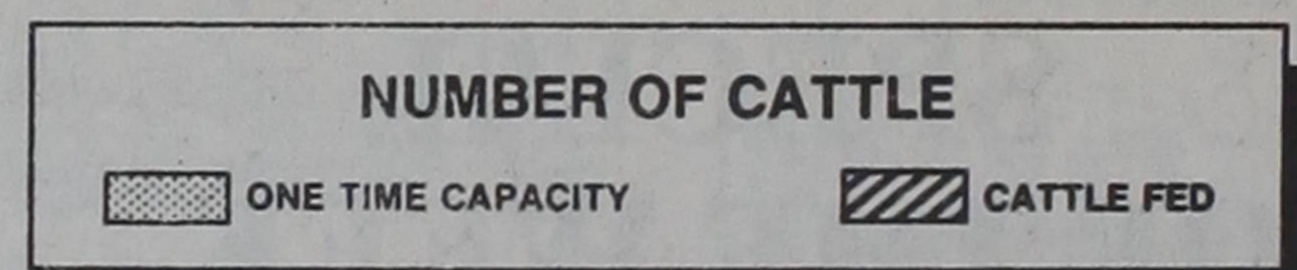
