## Mutual Fund Assets Reach $\mathbf{\$ 1}$ Trillion

The beginning of 1990 marke the year that, for the first time, million Americans reached a total of $\$ 1$ trillion in assets. "This increase from the $\$ 95$ billion in assets on January 1, 1980," reports The Investment Company
Institute, the Washington-based voice for the mutual fund industry. Institute president David Silver
recalled in his annual report, some recalled, in his annual report, some
of the significant events in mutual In 1924 the first mutual fund was established in Boston. By 1933 regulations were needed throughout the securities industry. The Securities Act of 1933 met this
need by regulating the registration and offering of new securities to the public. This included mutual
fund shares. The Securities Exchange Act of
1934 charged the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) with the task of providing a fair and equitable securities market. This
was followed by The Investment Company Act of 1940, which structured the framework for the
mutual fund industry. These major pieces of legislation
and the regulatory agencies they and the regulatory agencies they
created still direct the securities industry, of which mutual funds are a vital part.
