Modern medicine has come up with
surgical corrections for myopia. In radial
surgical corrections for myopia. In radial
keratotomy, the ophthalmologist makes a series of incisions in the comea's surface. new laser device to reshape the cornea is also being used, on experimental basis.
An evaluation study supported by the National Eye Institute gave the surgical procedure mixed reviews. As many as 43 per cent of th soon as six months after surgery. And among those who didn become farsighted, 18 per cent still needed glasses for distance vision 5 per cent needed correction for both near and far vision. The new aser technique now being tested is said to be sarer and produce mo table results in correcting myopia.
These expensive new procedures show some promise but, for most people, glasses
