So are Richard Nixon and Franklin Delano Roosevelt, as both descended from William Swift of Sandwich, Massachusetts. Jimmy Harrisons. Both of the Adamses, Calvin Coolidge, Millard Fillmore and William Howard Taft are all descended from a colonial settler. If George Washington was the father of our country," then a lad might be called the "mother of our country."
