Castro County teams.

It will be the 39th
year for the two schools to meet on the gridiron, and every game has been a district match. Dimmitt is not only the only team on Friona's

38 consecutive years, but also the 38 consecutive years, but also the
only team to have been in the same district with the Chieftains all of this time.
Down through the years, Dimmitt has had by far the most success in the series. The Bobcats
hold a whopping 40-19-1 lead in the series, but Coach Morton's personal record is $2-2$ vs DHS.
The Bobcats have been ranked as the area's top defensive team all season, allowing just 184 yards per game. Contrast that to the 373.6 yards per game the Chieftains are averaging, and something will have
