SUNDAY EVENING BY REP-RESENTATIVE OF THE

Women's Christian Temperance Union. Not Spectacular, but Convincing, and Carrying Weight.

It has been well said that unless one is an exceptional speaker, that one cannot hope to take an old subject, no matter how interesting, and hold an audience satisfactorily. This statement was well brought out Sunday night at the Baptist church when a large congregation attended a meeting held there for the purpose of hearing an address on temperance and prohibition by Miss Phena E. G. Mosher, of New York. The speaker proved to be about the most convincing and satisfactory prohibition talker ever heard in Pecos. It was indeed a most magnificent address and must have carried weight and been of bene-

There was nothing of the spectacular, nothing of the catch-as-catch-can method, nothing of the vulgar, nothing of the vindictive, in the address. It was not an open appeal to passion or to prejudice. It was not an appeal which had for its largest item the demerits of the other side: it was rath r a scientific, meritorious, facts-as-factsare discussion, taking the liquor question from all angles and thoroughly dissecting it, tearing it to pieces, showing in a thousand different ways, medically, scientifically, financially, mentally, how it serves no good purpose and is, in the words of the speaker, "a hideous giant, grown from a dwarf, endeavoring to cast into utter destruction the civilization of America

It was an address with which no one, whether in favor of prohibition or temperance or not, could find fault. And the lady showed that it is not necessary in order to make a convincing prohibition address to damn the other side, as some street workers, to the detriment of the cause, seem to think necessary.

Rev. J. B. Cole presided at the meeting, assisted by Rev. J. F. Hedgpeth, and music was furnished by volunteers from the different city churches. All the churches which regularly hold Sunday evening services gave way in order to give their members an opportunity to be present.

### System to Cover Whole City.

Brady Urges Action. The discussion of the plan and details being ended, Will P. Brady arose and suggested that means to carry the election be considered. This brought on considerable discussions. Everyone present seemed to be of the opinion that nothing short of an earthquake could defeat the Issue. However, Mr. Brady stated an article had appeared in the Record-Times stating that all poll taxes must be paid by Jan. 21 or no vote would be given in the election. He stated he was of the opinion that this information was incorrect. Secretary Harkey arose to state that he had given the information to the Record-Times and was advised that he was in error in the matter, having simply given the information for the purpose of urging people to pay their poll taxes. Mayor Gibson then arose to state that the matter of poll taxes being paid on or before Jan. 21 had also come up for consideration at the council meeting Monday afternoon, and that it was the opinion of himself that the poll tax did not have to be paid as no poll tax for 1913 is needed before Feb. 1, 1913, all voters in elections prior to Feb. 1, 1913, having only to have poll taxes for 1912. The mayor stated, however, that one city councilman still was of the opinion that the poll tax for 1913 would have to be paid.
