## Contacts

 "Stuck"? patefore the oplomerisis signs off a
 damage to the lenses or the eyes. In time, the wearer learns easily and naturally.
Occasionally, though, even for a wearer who has mastered these
skills, a lens can get "stuck." It can te diffiult to remer skills, a lens can get "stuck." It can be difficult to remove a contacl
lens. Sometimes the lens seems to be sticking to the comea or may have slipped onto the white of the eye, ending up in the wrong place above or below the cornea or in the corner. Stop! Don't try to dig it out. Best bet: flush the eye with rewetting solution, wait a moment or two and try again. If the lens seems to have slipped off the cornea, roll the eyes and look to the
extreme right or left; the lens should slip into place. Or look in the xxreme right or left; the lens should slip into place. Or look in the
mirror, with a light to the side of the eye. Can you see the lens's shadow? In a pinch, call the optometrist for help.
