

The third annual meeting of the Carnegie Library Association of Pecos, was held June 8, 1916, at the Library Building. The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. T. Y. Casey. The following members of the Association were present: Mesdames T. Y. Casey, J. W. Parker, S. J. Douglas, Steve Ward, W. A. Hudson, L. W. Anderson, Sid Floyd, W. R. Hankins, John Hibdon, Mrs. Looby, and Homer L. Magee. One visitor, Mrs. H. T. Mitchell of Toyah, was present.

The secretary's report showed an encouraging growth in the increase of books in the library and in the number of registrations. It also called attention to the installing and use of the bulletin board.

The treasurer reported a balance in the bank at the beginning of the year, June 1st, 1915 of \$105.01.

Amount given by the city for the support of the library was \$220.00.

Amount given by private subscription, \$393.77.

Total amount of \$718.78.

The expenses of the library for the year included the following items:

Salary paid librarian, \$258.

Amount paid collector of private subscriptions, \$27.50.

Amount paid A. C. McClurg & Co for books, \$168.31.

Amount paid Dodd Mead & Co. for books, \$39.

Amount paid Wells Fargo Express Co, \$11.26.

Miscellaneous expenses for the year amounted to \$128.21.

A total expense of \$632.28.

Cash on hand \$86.50.

The committee on Ways and Means reported amount obtained from Schubert Symphony concert \$25.75, and from the sale of pictures \$5.00.

The Book Committee reported the addition of 493 books this year. 235 of these books were bought with the library funds, 258 being contributed.

The librarian reported the total number of books 1500.

Circulation 5460.

Total number registered 561.

New readers this year, 243.

Value of books received this year, \$33.13.

Value of books last year was \$841.91.

Fines collected, \$38.86.

Book rent, \$14.00.

The following officers were elected: Mrs. T. Y. Casey, president; Homer L. Magee, 1st vice-president; Mrs. W. R. Hankins, 2nd vice-president; Mrs. W. A. Hudson, recording secretary; Mrs. S. G. Douglas, corresponding secretary; Mrs. J. W. Parker, treasurer.

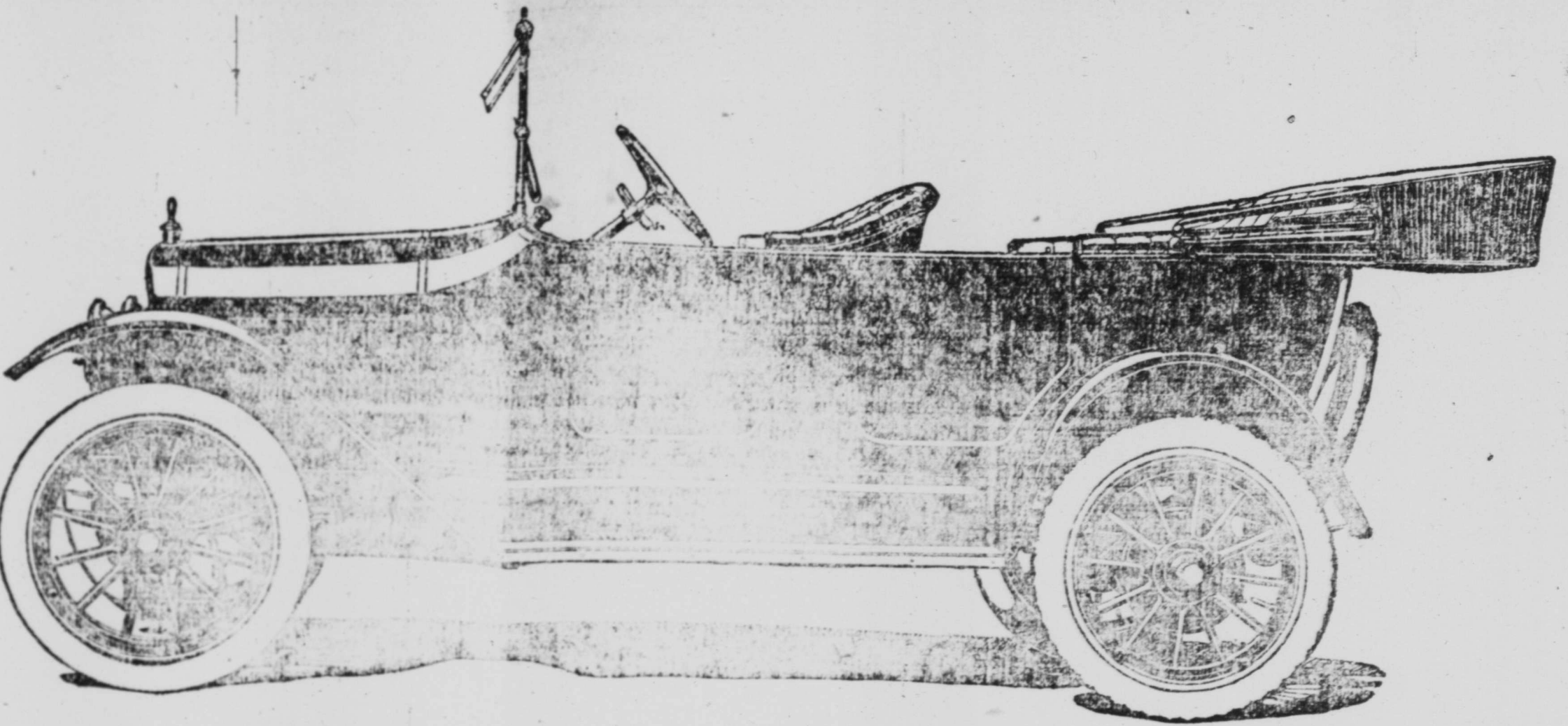
