## Kendrick Chasing <br> FHS Rushing Marks

Chieftain senior running back Matthew Kendrick, besides
playing a vital role in leading his team to what he hopes will
be Friona's unprecedented third straight district title, is also be Friona's unprecedented third straight district title, is also
chasing some 30 -year-old individual Friona High School rushing records.
Kendrick's 248-yard rushing total at River Road last Friday
was his individual high game as a starter. He had gained 216 yards against the Wildcats in the 1997 game at Friona, a total of 464 yarrs in two games vs the same school. That 216 The 248-yard achievement was second only to Tony Perea's
258-yard performance against Crosbyton in 1968 . He replaced Charlie Morgan as the second-highest one-game rusher. Morgan ran for 245 yards against Farwell in 1983 .
Perea, who holds most of the individual rushing marks for FHS, set the single-season record with 1,761 yards in his
senior year of 1968 . Kendrick threatened with 1,627 yards in senior year of 1968. Kendrick threatened with 1,627 yards in
his junior season a year ago, coming to within 134 yards of the record.
Matthew
Matthew achieved his total 1997 yardage on 203 carries.
Perea carried the ball 274 times, twenty-five per cent more carries. Perea carried the ball 43 times in one of his games. In fact, Kendrick has carried the ball 25 fewer times than at the same point in the 1997 season, and through five games
had gained 127 more yards (824) than he had through five games (697) in 1997 . for the 1998 season. He is the individual rushing leader in
both the Panhandle area, covered by the Amarillo paper, and the South Plains, serviced by the Lubbock paper.
If he can stay healthy, Kendrick has a If he can stay healthy, Kendrick has a good shot at
breaking the single-game, season, and/or the career rushing records, held by Perea for the past 30 years. We have located

## Why I Voted For

## Flu Season Expected

To Hit Early This Year

An outbreak of influenza than 90 percent of the deaths

While Texas was not directly affected, the early appearance of the flu is a wake-up call to be vaccinated according to
Robert D. Crider, director of the Immunization Division of the Texas Department
Health (TDH). Healthe flu lasts from October through April. Crider says, "Since it takes about two weeks for the
vaccine to reach full effect, it vaccine to reach full effect, it
is best to get a flu shot even
before flu before flu season begins."
This is particularly true for This is particularly true f
people in high-risk groups. People with diabetes are about three times more likely to die from complications of
influenza and pneumonia, yet influenza and pneumonia, yet
fewer than half get an annual flu shot. Each year
10,000 to 30,000 people with complications of the flu and pepeumonia. During a flu
epidemic, epidemic, deaths among
people with diabetes rise five to 15 percent according to the Centers for Disease Control
and Prevention. and Prevention. An

have diabetes in the United

recipients and people with AID, should be vaccinated. Others in high risk groups

heart or lung disease including children with asthma; pregnant women,

children on long-term aspirin

risk groups need to be
