**25 Yrs. Ago--Dec. 9, 1973**

## Rivera, Kendrick Make All-S. Plains

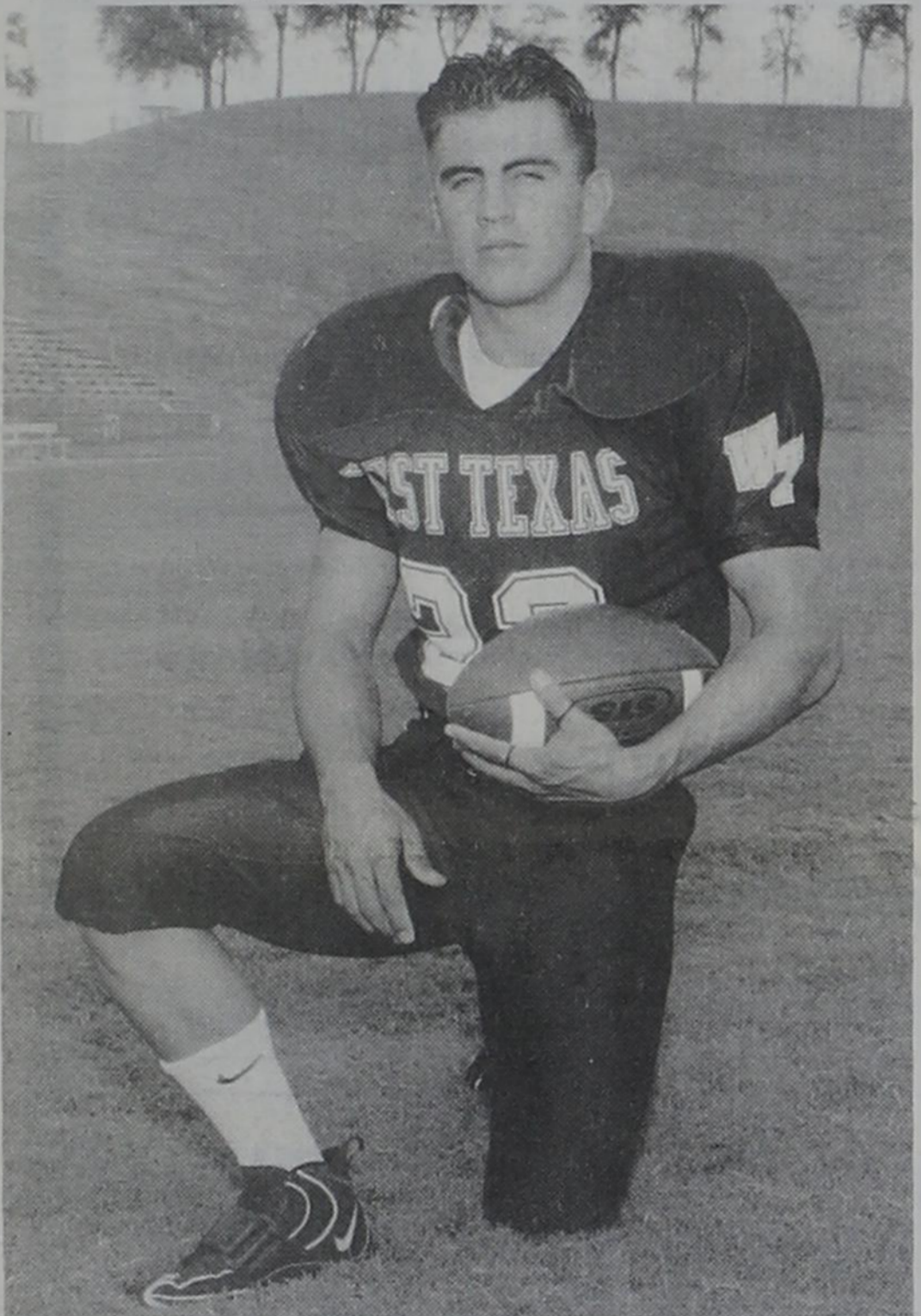
Seniors Hugo Rivera and Matthew Kendrick were honored on the All-South Plains football team for 1998, announced by the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal this week.

Rivera anchored a Chieftain defense which set an all-time school record for fewest yardage allowed. Friona ranked first in team defense all season in the class 3A statistics gathered by the Avalanche-Journal.

Rivera led Friona in tackles with 127, and in quarterback sacks with 11.

Kendrick was the team's leading rusher with 1,177 yards. He became the first Chieftain to rush for over 1,000 yards two seasons, and set the all-time school record by rushing for 2,899 yards, to break a 30-year-old record.

Kendrick yielded to Noel Grajeda in the team scoring race while nursing a sore knee, but is the school's second-leading scorer overall with 216 points. Angel Vega is the all-time leader with 247 points.



JIMMY ARIAS, son of the late Reydesel Arias and Trini Arias, was awarded the WTAMU Scholar-Athlete Award for excellence in the classroom. A 1995 graduate of Friona High School, he maintained a 4.0 GPA during the spring semester at WT.

## Squaw JV Off To 4-0 Season Start

The FHS Squaw JV basketball team has gotten off to a good start for the season, winning all four of their games played through Tuesday, December 1.

In the team's first game November 17, they scored a 45-40 win over the Nazareth JV, after posting leads of 16-7, 24-17 and 32-27.

Kayla Smiley scored 13 of the team's 16 first-quarter points, and finished with 29 for scoring honors.

On November 20, the Squaw JV downed Floydada, 31-27, having to come from behind for the win. Floydada led, 20-12 at halftime, but Friona outscored the visitors, 13-4 in the third quarter to go ahead, 25-24. Kristie Jack was the scoring spark, hitting three field goals and being three for three at the line.

The Squaws maintained their lead with good defense in the final quarter. Miss Jack was the leading scorer with 15.

On Tuesday, November 24, Friona downed visiting Elida, New Mexico, 58-23. Kristie Jack's five points helped the Squaws to a 9-6 first quarter lead. Kayla Smiley warmed up with nine points, three baskets and three free throws as Friona took a commanding lead at the half, 28-10.

Friona continued its good scoring in the second half, outscoring Elida 17-5 and 13-8 for the final margin. Miss Smiley led with 16 points,

Miss Jack added 15 and Tania Hand had ten.

On Tuesday, December 1 at Tulia, the JV Squaws made it four in a row with a business-like 59-32 win over the Lady Hornets.

Friona led, 12-8 and 29-18 at the half. Miss Smiley had a hot hand in the third quarter with ten points, getting four shots from the floor and two from the line. That hiked Friona's lead to 47-26 and put the game out of reach.

Miss Smiley led with 26 points, and Miss Jack added 12.

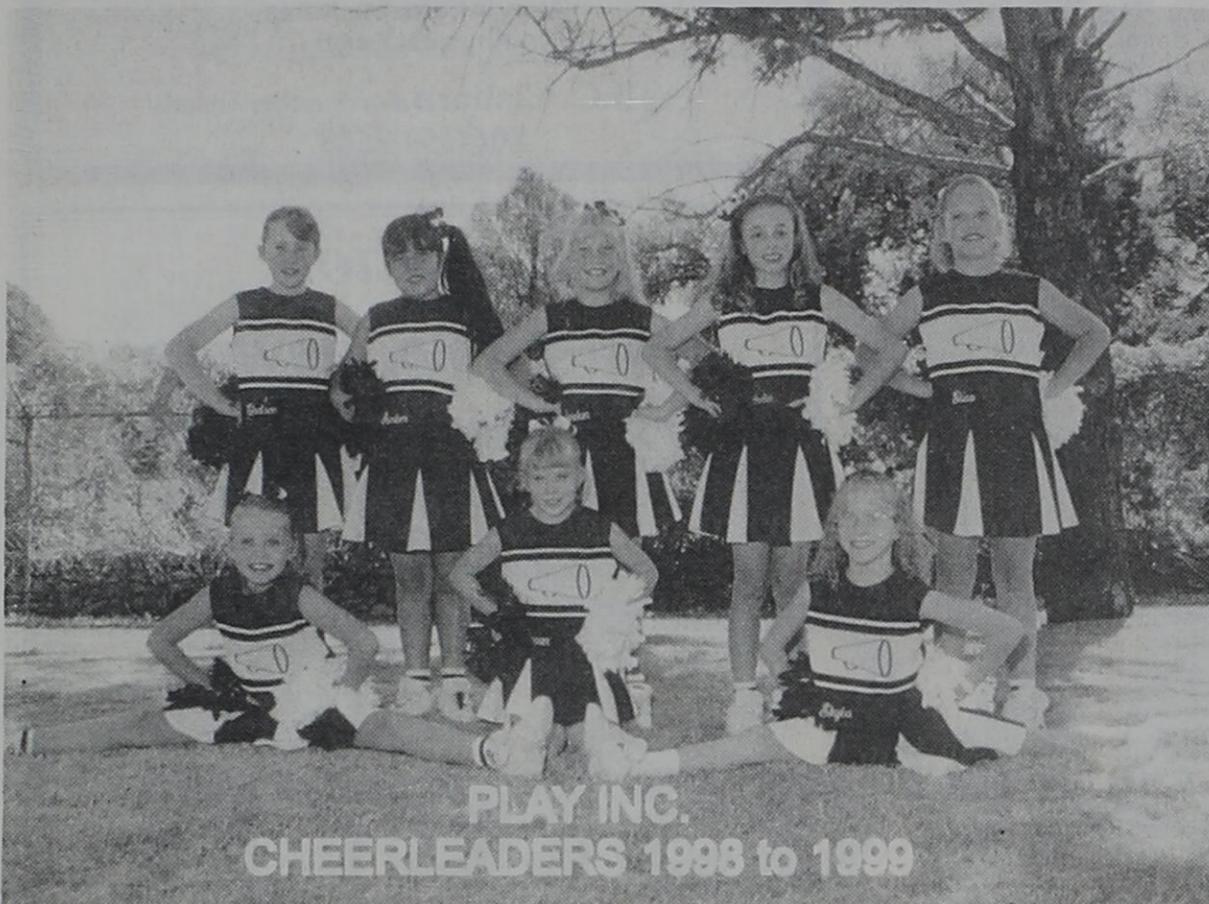
The second place Eagles defeated the first place Dolphins 18-12 in double overtime to capture the city championship.

He graduated from Wayland with his bachelor of science degree with distinction in mathematics in 1966 and pursued graduate studies at the University of Oklahoma, earning his master of arts degree in 1968 and Ph.D. in mathematics in 1972. He met and married his former Wayland classmate, Joan Willard. She was also a 1966 Wayland graduate.

He taught one year as a visiting assistant professor of mathematics at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, prior to being named, in 1973, as an assistant

mathematics professor at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. In 1979, he was named associate professor and in 1985, he was promoted to his present rank of mathematics professor where he has completed 25 years of service at the Academy.

During the summers since 1988, he has been employed as an analyst and computer software specialist at The John Hopkins University Applied Physics Laboratory. He holds membership in the Mathematical Association of America, Institute for Operations Research and the Management Services and Military Operations Research Society.

A prolific writer, Dr. Sanders has written extensively for Pacific Journal of Mathematics, Glasnik Matematiki, Duke Mathematics Journal, Fundamenta Mathematica, Proceedings of the Conference on Geometric Topology and with S.M. Briemer, co-authored An Airborne Defense Penetration Study for the Long Range Conventional Standoff Weapon.

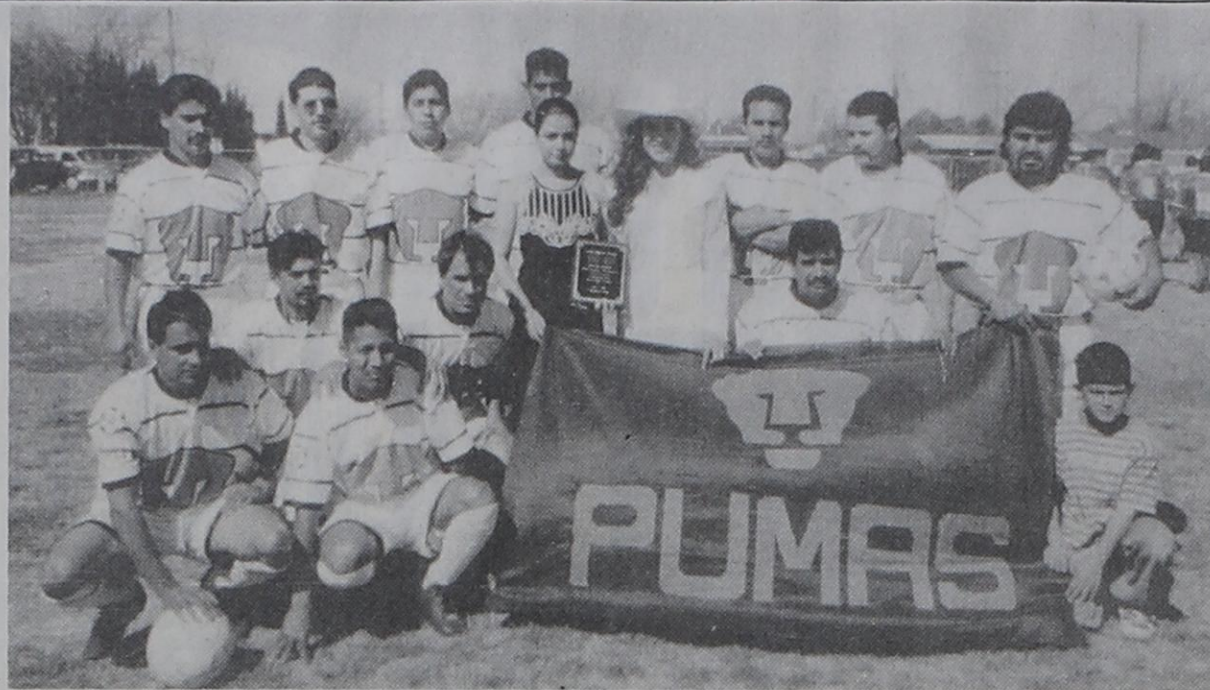

## YOUR EYES

### Macular Degeneration

The macula, a tiny area of the retina at the back of the eye, is composed of millions of light receptor cells. This is the part of the eye that is responsible for fine visual detail.

As we grow older, the cells may grow weak. Past 60, nearly one-third of all adults have some sign of macular degeneration. There may be blank spots or distortion in one's central vision and, in time, the spots may widen, but blindness is not total. Some peripheral vision remains, and there is no pain.

Symptoms to watch out for include: the appearance of a gray "film" in front of the eyes; a distortion of what should be a straight line in one's vision; the apparent magnification or diminution of an object, or part of it; and the loss of letters replaced by blank spots in a line of type.

It's important to see an eye doctor promptly for diagnosis. One type of degeneration can be arrested if spotted in time.
