SECTION II. The territory affected and covered by this ordinance shall be all that part of the territory within the City Limits of the City of Marfa

SECTION III. Nothing contained in this ordinance shall be construed to apply to any person or persons forbidding them to shoot fireworks on their own premises.

This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage. Passed and approved by the City Council this the 5th day of December, 1922.
