

RHEA GETS HAIL

County Receives Plenty Of Moisture For Area Crops

The Friona area was blessed this week with 1.05 inches of rain, coming on three straight evenings: Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. There was not any hail received in the immediate area, but the Rhea community was not so lucky.

"It was spotted-not too widespread, but there were individual cases where individual farmers may have lost 60 to 75 per cent of their wheat crop," said Joe Allen of Rhea's Sherley elevator. Allen said he received over two inches of rain there at Rhea.

"We could have one of our better years for wheat, if nothing else happens," he said.

Friona's official measurement was 1.05 for the past week. The week's rainfall brought Friona's total to 8.55 inches for the year. This is a whopping 4.65 inches above 1998 at this time.

There have been some high winds reported locally

during the past week. Late Monday evening, the Friona "school net" operated by Amarillo's Channel 7, reported a wind gust of 75 mph.

That same night, a mill leg was blown down at Cattle Town Feed Yard, ten miles northeast of Friona.

Randy Thomas, manager of Attebury Grain at Black, said the farmers in that area had reported .8 inch and .9 inch of rain for the three-evening period ending Wednesday.

"Everyone's crops in this area are in pretty good shape. We haven't had any hail in our area," Thomas said.

Thomas said, however, that where he lives, 1.25 miles north of Umbarger, five to six inches of hail stacked up in the Tuesday evening storm. The wind and hail broke some windows in one of his vehicles, and a barn was blown down at a neighbor's place.

The spokesman said that the wheat crop in north

Parmer and southern Deaf Smith County is the best it has been in the past eight to ten years. Most of the wheat is being grazed out, due to the low, low market prices.

An "18 wheeler" (truck) blew over Monday night about 11 p.m., about a mile east of Friona on U.S. Highway 60. The driver was not injured, according to reports.

Scott Brown, manager of Sherley-Anderson's Lazbuddie elevator, said that area had received about 1.1 inches of rain during the period ending Wednesday, and that it had been fairly general.

Brown said that most of the cotton in the Lazbuddie area is planted. Some of the cotton is emerging, and some is still in the ground. Most of the wheat has been grazed, Brown said. "There will be some corners to cut, but all in all, not a big harvest," he said.

It was reported that Bovina received an inch of rain, and the Dimmitt area was hit by a bad hailstorm that caused considerable damage. A house in Dimmitt also caught fire the night of the bad storm, it was reported.

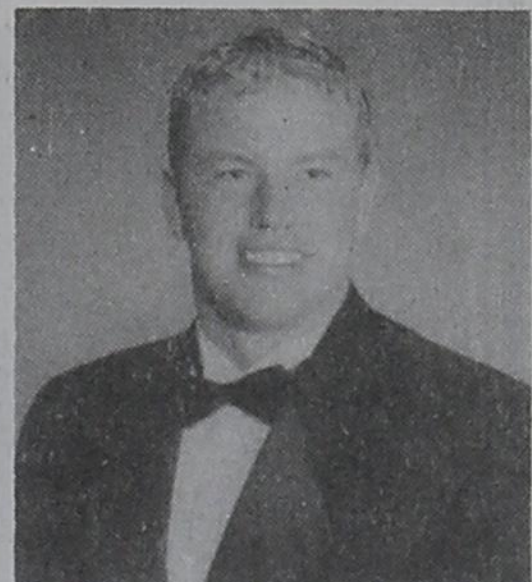
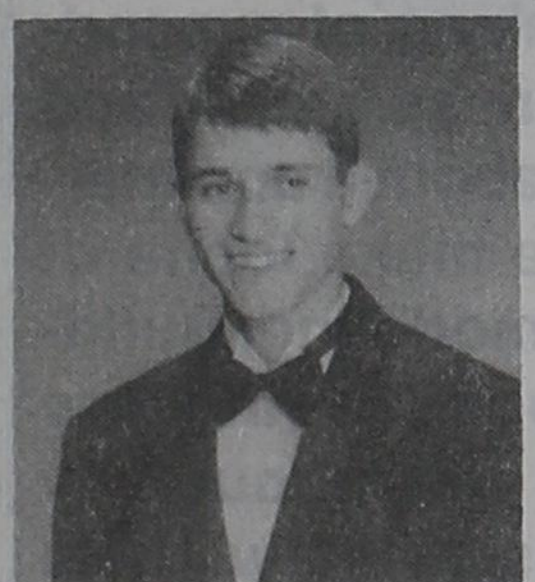

IF YOU HAVE NOT made plans for the Memorial Day weekend, Carol and I would like to offer a suggestion. Take one of the days and drive up to Palo Duro Canyon.

We showed off the canyon to our visiting cousins from Jackson, Tennessee, Lenny and Patty Ellis. Carol and I had been to Palo Duro at least half-a-hundred times, maybe more.

But this past Monday, the canyon displayed itself for us and our visitors in its most beautiful state we could ever remember seeing. Maybe it was the fact that it's spring.

Wildflowers in Central Texas, which draw thousands of visitors every spring, can't possibly be any prettier than those on the floor of the canyon at the present time.

Carol identified broomweed, golden aster, yellow daisies, and naturally the yellow blooms on the prickly-pear cactus.

Even the miniature white blooms of the bindweed growing alongside the highway looked pretty, although some of our farmer friends might disagree.

The plains black-foot is a small, low-growing daisy-like flower that was in great abundance along the canyon rim.

The poppy-mallow, also known as wine-cup, looks like a primrose, only the color is a deep fuschia.

Indian blanket (which I erroneously called Indian Paintbrush for our cousins) is a red daisy-type flower with yellow tips and rust-brown center. True to its name, it blanketed every open area in the bottom of the canyon.

There were a number of miniature blossoms of various colors that Carol identified as fleabane. There were asters of different colors, as well as purple thistles and Blue Gilia.

There were also some tall, purple, hairy-looking plants that

we couldn't even locate in our Texas wildflower guide. They might have been Indian Breadfoot.

I told our guests as we reached the canyon floor that we might get to see some wildlife, especially since that area has received nice early-spring rains.

I had barely got this hoped-for statement out of my usually not-prophetic mouth when Lenny shouted "There's a wild turkey!" Then, as I scrambled for my camera, Patty came out with "There's another one!"

The turkeys got the telephoto treatment that we usually reserve for one of the Kendrick boys diving over the goal-line for the winning TD. A couple of the photos actually came out pretty good.

Before we left, we had also seen a road-runner, a big flicker (woodpecker), and numerous other small birds. The weather was perfect--an overcast, cool day.

Palo Duro Canyon is probably our area's best-kept secret, and we need to make a New Millennium Resolution to promote this attraction a little more. That and the Panhandle-Plains Museum on the WT campus, which we also visited.

Readers of this column will surely recall the numerous times that we finished it off with a little one-liner that we called "Uncle Austin Says." Our Uncle Austin Ellis passed away last December at the age of 91. He and his family (Lenny is his son) are truly our greatest genealogical "find."

This was the first trip for the cousins to visit us in Parmer County, and we hope not their last. I think they enjoyed seeing the sights of the Panhandle area, and Carol and I definitely enjoyed taking them around.

Many folks probably think this area is pretty "plain vanilla." But I think we have a lot to be proud of. Sometimes we just need to stop and look around us--maybe as though we were seeing things for the first time. Not so bad after all!

Parmer County Farm Receives Lone Star Land Steward Award

The battle to save Texas' environment is not being fought in the Legislature or in the courtroom. It's being fought and won at the local level--on Texas' farms and ranches. In fact, while 80 per cent of Texas live in urban areas, more than 97 per cent of Texas land is privately owned. That's why Texas Parks and Wildlife (TPW) believes it is important to recognize and honor private landowners who have done extraordinary things to protect water resources, plant and wildlife habitat.

A local High Plains farm--the Four Osborn Brothers Farm of Parmer County--was named one of ten regional winners of the 1999 Lone Star Land Steward Awards presented annually by Texas Parks and Wildlife. The award recognizes private landowners and managers who have demonstrated exemplary attention to maintaining and enhancing the Texas landscape.

The Four Osborn Brothers Farm will be honored at a June 1 reception in Austin along with nine other regional winners, a corporate

winner, and a wildlife management association or cooperative. One of those will be named the most outstanding Lone Star Land Steward in the state for 1999.

The Four Osborn Brothers Farm is owned and operated by Robert, Mark, Matt and Ben Osborn. The Osborn family has owned the land known as Four Osborn Brothers Farm fifty years. Located in the heart of the Panhandle's premier ring-necked pheasant country, this farm is home to numbers of songbirds, waterfowl and pheasants in an intensively agricultural setting.

The Osborns made a number of improvements to the land including providing additional cover and water for the quail and pheasants, rejuvenated fields by prescription burns and extensive reseeding, and returned some farmland to permanent cover thereby conserving Ogallala Aquifer water as well as providing a reduction in water erosion rates. Texas Parks and Wildlife recognized their

skillful implementation of conservation practices, guided by local professionals in resource management agencies, in serving as a model for other landowners in Parmer County.

"The stewardship role of the private landowner is little known and seldom appreciated," said Andrew Sansom, executive director for Texas Parks and Wildlife. "They are literally on the front lines of maintaining our state's ecological resources. We owe them a heartfelt thank you."

The Lone Star Land Steward Awards were created to recognize and honor private landowners for their accomplishments in habitat management and wildlife conservation. The program, now in its third year, recognizes landowners in all habitat types within the ten ecological areas of Texas, from timberlands to native prairies and from marshes to mountain ranges. The awards reception on June 1 is sponsored by The Federal Land Bank Associations of Texas.

70 Yrs. Ago--May 31, 1929

Announcement was made this week that the Turner-Parr Trading Company has contracted for two lots on the west side of Main Street adjoining the south side of the F. L. Spring building. A 50 x 140 foot building will be constructed on the lots, all in one building, but just what the building will be used for is not known at this time.

Crop prospects in the Friona territory are said to be better than for the past several years. The wheat is looking like a better than average crop, and while only a few row crops are planted, hundreds of acres of sorghum grains, sudan and corn will be planted in the next few days.

65 Yrs. Ago--June 1, 1934

On Friday evening of last week the Frio Draw overflowed its banks at Friona and as usual swept down the State Highway No. 33 for the distance of nearly a mile. This overflow was caused not by any heavy rain falling within the immediate territory, but from rain that fell over in New Mexico. Two cars, unaware of the recent overflow, dashed into the wet road at this point, one being overturned and nearly buried, while the other barely escaped being ditched right where the other capsized.

Out Of School Examination Set For July 13-15, 1999

Individuals who have met all requirements for high school graduation but have not passed one or more sections of the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) or the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) may take the test this July. Testing will be on the following dates:

 July 15--Reading
TEAMS
 July 14--Mathematics
 July 15--English Language Arts

All individuals who wish to take the TEAMS test(s) must register in advance. This includes students currently enrolled in Texas public high schools as well as individuals who have

completed all other high school graduation requirements. The only individuals who must register for the TAAS test(s) are those who are no longer enrolled in school who have not met minimum expectations on all sections of the TAAS test or a student who will be testing in a district other than the district that they are enrolled in. A registration packet may be picked up at any high school campus, district central office, or education service center.

Your completed Registration Form must be received in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than 5 p.m., June 11, 1999.

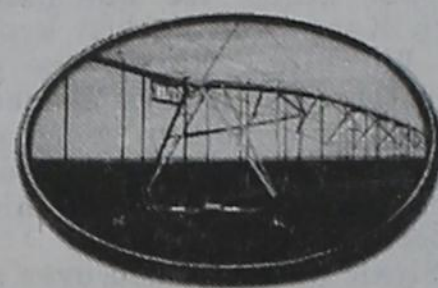

Authorities Seek Known Criminal In Sirnic Murder

(Reprinted from the Wednesday, May 26 edition of the Lubbock *Avalanche-Journal*)

Anna Belle Mohr and her husband Paul of Lubbock, formerly of Friona, had always kept in close contact with her two sons. One lives in Colorado. The other lived in South Texas. Sometimes they spoke four times a day.

When Mrs. Mohr called her son, Rev. Norman "Skip" Sirnic two days before his birthday last month, she didn't know it would be their last conversation.

Sirnic and his wife Karen were found on Sirnic's birthday, May 2. They had been beaten to death with a sledgehammer. They were at their Weimar home at the time of the killings, Weimar police chief Bill Livingston said Tuesday. Weimar is located on Interstate 10 between Houston and San Antonio.

No arrests have been made in the case, but authorities are looking for a suspect described as a 5-foot, 6-inch Hispanic male believed to be about 39 years old, Livingston said. The suspect has a faded snake tattoo on his left forearm, and is thought to have stolen the Sirnic's red 1998 Mazda and abandoned it in San Antonio.

An arrest warrant for Rafael Resendez-Ramirez was issued in Harris County for the robbery of a Houston physician, a detective with the West University Place Police Department said. The doctor, Claudia Benton, was

found murdered at her Houston home.

A \$10,000 reward has been offered for information leading to the conviction of Ramirez, the police chief said.

The Sirnic's bodies were discovered by members of the Weimar United Church of Christ, who became worried after their pastor didn't show up for church, Livingston said.

Sirnic had been a pastor in Weimar for about 10 years, his mother said. He grew up in Friona and served as minister at the Union Congregational Church from 1977 to 1983.

"This is just so unreal," his mother said. "I had open heart surgery a week before he was killed. He was here with Karen and he just kept us laughing. Skip was a joker. He always teased and had a wonderful sense of humor. He cared an awful lot about his churches and his church work," she added.

Sirnic also presided over a small country church near Weimar, Anna Belle Mohr said. She and Paul have received hundreds of cards and letters from friends and members of Sirnic's congregations, she said.

"They say, 'We know we can't know how you're feeling, but we want you to know what a wonderful pastor he's been,'" she told the *Avalanche-Journal*.

Rev. Paul Mohr, who also served as pastor of Friona's Union Congregational Church (1964-1971), retired recently after almost 50 years in the ministry. The Mohrs' other

son, Mark, is pastor of a church in Colorado. The family's strong faith has helped them try to cope with their tragedy.

"Twelve hundred people came to their funeral service and over 50 ministers were there," Mrs. Mohr said. Weimar is a town of 2,000 residents. "It helps, but I'll never see my son again. I look at something and it reminds me of Skip, and I just start crying, and even Paul cries. It sounds corny, but we had a storybook family. When Karen came into the family, we just fell in love with her right away, and we all knew we were lucky to have such a good family."

Karen and Skip were married in 1990 and "were like two peas in a pod," Mrs. Mohr said.

"When Karen and Skip were leaving from here after my surgery, I said to Karen, 'I hate for you guys to be leaving so late.' Karen said, 'Oh, whenever I'm with Skip I'm happy. I don't think they could have been without each other,'" Mrs. Mohr said.

Karen Sirnic had recently taken on the job of church secretary in Weimar. She and Skip sang in the choir and were active gardeners, planting flowers all around the church.

"How anybody could do this to them, I don't know," Mrs. Mohr said.

Skip Sirnic has one son, Nathan, 20, who is a sophomore at Angelo State University in San Angelo.

And now, nearly a month after her heart surgery, Mrs. Mohr said she is recovering fine. It is recovering from the loss of her son and daughter-in-law that will take time, she said. But she has her memories and thoughts from her last conversation with her son.

"I talked to him at 10 o'clock and...the last thing I said to him was, 'We love you, and take care of each other.'"

The Euro: New Opportunity In The Old World?

To the tourist, Europe has always seemed rather quaint: lots of little countries with distinct cultures upholding ancient customs. To international businesses, Europe has always been exasperating: lots of little countries with big tariffs, protected markets and competing currencies.

Over a weekend in January, the impossible happened: Europe changed forever. The crazy quilt of countries became a colossus — one market of nearly 300 million people with one currency, the euro. The 11 countries that use the euro even have a new nickname: Euroland. Somehow, they overcame nationalistic backbiting, lowered their debt, wrestled inflation to the mat and formed the world's most powerful new currency. In the next few years, they will phase out their national currencies completely.

What does this mean to you, the individual investor? That depends on your point of view. Pessimists see the euro as a threat. Commodities like oil could suddenly be traded in euros, thus putting pressure on the U.S. dollar. Even more dire, the doomsayers think, is the possibility that foreign investors will abandon their traditional safe haven of U.S. bonds — with which they have financed U.S. debt — in favor of new euro-based investments.

Two forces should keep these possibilities in check. One, if the euro becomes too strong, European exports

will become too expensive. Two, the U.S. dollar reflects a strong economy, low inflation and a stable government — all attractive qualities in the eyes of foreign investors seeking security.

Before worrying too much about the downside to the introduction of the euro, savvy investors will look for the opportunities the euro provides. For example, the euro brings more global financial stability to the market since there are now fewer currencies open to attack by speculators and hedge funds. Also, the business of moving money from country to country has suddenly become much more streamlined. Gone are the currency fluctuations that made doing business in Europe so difficult. Gone are the tariffs designed to protect domestic markets but that raised costs when, for instance, auto parts made in Italy were trucked to a factory in Germany.

Who benefits first from the new streamlined Europe? International companies that already have a presence on the continent will feel an almost immediate impact. For them, the cost of doing business across so many borders has suddenly dropped. That means more profits and a better return to shareholders.

The improved financial flow brought about by the introduction of the euro will continue to have positive reverberations for years to come. That means Europe is becoming an exciting new world of opportunity for investors.
