| CONTROL OF CODDLING MOTH AND FRUIT TREE BORERS, <br> By E. A. MILLER, <br> Assistant Entomologist and Plant <br> Pathologist of the Tëxas Depart- <br> ment of Agriculture, at Austin. <br> The coddling moth, causing wormy apples, which last year destroyed nearly all of the fine fruit, is present again this spring, to repeat its work of destruction unless the growers get busy at once and spray their trees. I visited the Plains country last April and urged growers to spray, and those that followed instructions matured a good crop of delicious apples, while those who failed to spray lost nearly all of the fruit because it was wormy and dropped prematurely. <br> It is a pity to let this fine frult go to waste, especially since the apple worm is one of the most easily controlled insects we have, if the people would only spray as directed. Spraying and not to spray means all the difference between a good crop and a complete loss. <br> I am thoroughly convinced that this Plains country is well adapted to the growing of fruit, but the people must realize that they have to combat the insect pests, the same as they do in every other section, and there is absolutely no use in taking a charfee on these pests, especially the apple worm and the borers. <br> Now is the time to begin the battle in earnest. The coddling moth lays its eggs at this time of the year, mostly on the leaves and blossoms, These will soon hatch into the worms, which in turn bore down to the core of the fruit, usually from the blossom, or calyx, end. They remain in the fruit from three to four weeks; then they come out, crawl down the branches and trunk, seek protected places, spin a cocoon, then transform into pupae, and from the pupae into the adult form, which wil repeat the operation for the second brood. <br> The spray to use is arsebate of lead at the rate of 3 pounds to 00 gallons of water. For the larger orchards a power or barrel sprayer should be used, but for home use, where you have only a few trees, a bucket or knapsack sprayer is quite effective, or even a small atomizer sprayer holding about a quart is useful. You can obtain the latter from nearly any drug store. <br> The first application should be made thoroughly, after the blossoms have fallen and before the calyx or top part of the apple has closed. It is important that all of the fruit is thoroughly covered with the spray <br> If these directions are followed you will have a good crop of choice fruit, but If you neglect to do so the worms will surely get it, and I sincerely urge evefy ewher of apple and pear trees to get busy with the spray pumps. It reuires only very little extra expense, time and effort to do so. <br> Eruit Tree Dorers. There are several different kinds of borers, but the flat-headed apple tree borer is the one that does the most damage, and it is destroying thousands of trees in this State every year. It works under the bark and often girdles the trunk and larger branches, $\mid$ which crude carbolic acid is added at | the rate of one pint to 10 gallons. About a pound of sulphur added to this makes it still more effective. <br> (2) 40 pounds of stone lime; enough boiling water to cover: 1 pound of of salf or cement, as a sticker; 1 gallon of sweet or buttermilk. Water to give it the consistency of paint. The crude carbolic acid and sulphur can also be added to this. This whitewash sticks well, and is also excellent for poultry houses. <br> These washes are preventives, and must, therefore, be applied in the spring before the adults lay the egrs. After they are once in a tree, the best way is to dig them out with a pointed knife or wire. <br> CONSERVING THE SOIL <br> FERTILITY WITH COWS. <br> Farm and Ranel Says Remedy for Depoverished Farms Is to Feed and Sell Flalshed Produet. <br> There is no use in concealing a fact that is so evident as the defect in our system of farm management. This defect in our system is the lack of dairy cows, Extensive planting and dultivation must give away to intensive methods in which plant food is conserved by raising dairy cows. We are not getting enough for the phosphorus, nitrogen, potassium and lime used in producing crops. <br> The reason is not hard to ascertain. We raise cotton, corn, small grains, hay, etc., and sell these with the plant food in them, thus robbing our soil of these plant food constituents and failing to get the proper remnueration for our labor. <br> The remedy is to convert the grain. hay, silage, grass, ete, into fiatohed products and sell at a margin that will pay a profit both on pioditction and manufacturing. The datry cow will furnish most of the machinery ( 7 ). She will convert the raw matertals into finished food products and conserve the elements of soil fertility. She will make it possible for the farm to proudce more food to feed more people and give the manager a wider margin for profit.
