Among communities that count on the NWTH communications center for ambulance dispatching are Amarillo, Canyon, Borger, Texline,
Pampa, White Deer, Panhandle, Pampa, White Deer, Panhandle,
Claude, Lake Tanglewood, Wayside and Fritch. Dispatching in Parmer County is handled through local emergency agencies. Radio equipment is currently
being replaced being replaced or upgraded in some
Panhandle locations to improve PEMSS.
Jay Green, WT Services sales representative in Amarillo, says that WT Services has replaced emergency network.
emergency network.
"We have relocated towers from
" Hereford to Summerfield, and from Tulia to Silverton to make the radio signals more powerful. The Summerfield site gives more coverage in area, and the Silverton site will cover the Tulia area and reach into isolated locations in the Rolling Plains such as Quitaque," Green
explains.
Other PEMSS tower sites are located at Dalhart, Stratford, Spearlocated at Dalhart, Sratford, Spear-
man, Glazier, Dumas, Borger,
Miami, White Deer, Vega, Canyon, Claude, Clarendon, near Palo Duro Canyon, and at Amarillo.
The PEMSS originated in the
1970s when the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission saw the need for a uniform EMS system in the Panhandle. PRPC received a federal grant to help put EMS in place. Participating communitues received ambulances fitted wit
Some ambulance services are still using essentially the sam
equipment nearly 20 years later. equipment nearly 20 years later. Green says that if federal grants
are provided, PEMSS might replace are provided, PEMSS might replace
its present radios with a new, highand system - potentia project.
"This would give PEMSS clear channels. They could trasmit data,
and use microwave links that would and use microwave links that would
allow running video. Such capability could put a doctor in
Amarillo right in the emergency Amarillo right in the emergency video hook-up," says Green. WT Services also maintains

## Moisture

Can Cause Irritation
Swimmers aren't the only can-
didates for swimmer's ear, a potendidates for swimmer's ear, a poten-
tially dangerous condition caused by moisture in the ear canal. "Swimmer's ear is not really a
sports-related condition," says Dr. sports-related condition," says Dr.
Dan Franklin, an otolaryngologist at The Methodist Hospital
"Anyone who takes a shower, perAnyone who takes a shower, per-
spires when exercising, or, for that
matter, lives in the humidity of Houston can get it." Swimmer's ear is a layman's
term for inflammation and infection in the external ear canal It happens when water breaks down natural skin barriers, allowing bacteria to infect the ear's soft tissues.
Pain in the ear is Pain in the ear is the most
common symptom of the condition. Other, less common symption. Other, less common symp-
toms can include fever and hearing
loss. Franklin says swimmer's ear is
usually preventable by keeping the usually preventable by keeping the
ear dry. "Over-the-counter ear drops containing acid and alcohol can help keep the ear dry," he says. "But once an infection sets in, you should see a physician."
Treatment is two-pronged:
keeping the ear canal clean, and applying antibiotic ear drops.
Franklin issues a special warn-
ing for people with immune system deficiencies, such as diabetics leukemia patients, and organ trans-
plant recipients. "If these people have symptoms of swimmer's ear, they should see a physician immediately and receive aggressive treat-
ment," he advises. "Otherwise, the infection can spread to the bones of
the ear and become very difficult to the ear and b
get rid of."

## NOTICE OF COMPARABLE TAX RATES AND REVENUES

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provides $\$ 3970$ per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides $\$ 4382$ per student in state and local revenues.

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of $\$ .82$ for county education districts. State law does not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require a school district to adopt a tax rate that maximizes the receipt of state funds.

The board of trustees of the Friona Independent School District hereby gives notice that it is considering the adoption of a tax rate of $\$ .16$ that will provide $\$ 4382$ per student in state and local revenues.
