Parmer County's three municipalities recently received their sales tax rebates for the month of December from the State Comptroller's office, and an increase was noted

previous year's check.
$\$ 1,531.00$, compared to $\$ 1,506.69$ for the comparable period in 1991. Farwell received $\$ 3,161$, compared to $\$ 1,985$; and Friona received
$\$ 8,045.88$, compared to $\$ 7,118.23$ For the calendar year Bovina has now received $\$ 24,469.36$, up 4.88 per cent from $\$ 23,330.95$ in 1991 .
Farwell has received $\$ 42,181.57$, Farwell has received $\$ 42,181.57$, up 5.18 per cent from $\$ 40,105.80$ $\$ 111,583.84$, down 0.3 per cent from $\$ 111,922.12$ in 1991.
The three Parmer municipalities have received $\$ 178,234.77$, up 1.64 per cent over

One of the goals of the Friona EMS Association is to strive to
maintain and improve skills and maintain and improve skills and
provide professional emergency medical care to the community．
This includes everything from minor injuries and sickness through basic and advanced life support
the scene and to the hospital． the scene and to the hospital． In keeping with this goal，new
technology is now available which technology is now available which
will allow the Friona EMS to provide a higher level of care to the
citizens and possibly make the difference between life and death in some cases．And in obtaining this
technology，we need your help． technology，we need your help．
This level of care has to do
with cardiac arrests（heart attacks） and goes further than just car－ diopulmonary resuscitation or CPR
with regard with regards to emergency cardiac
care．The Friona EMS is staffed care．The Friona EMS is staffed
almost totally by volunteers with basic and intermediate levels of
emergency medical training， although they are highly trained to provide emergency cardiac care，in
the way of defibrillation which was only available from a paramedic， According to the latest Text－ book of Advanced Cardiac Life Support，it has been estimated that
up to 1,000 cardiac arrests occur every day in the United States alone．The approach to preventing
cardiac cardiac arrest and resuscitating a team effort that besinst invive a hospital with the patient，by－ standers trained in CPR，and the
prompt and prompt and appropriate response of
trained rescue personnel．To maximize chances of survival，the
delay from the onset delay from the onset of cardiac
arrest until CPR and definitive care should be kept as short as possible， ideally to less than four and eight minutes，respectively．

The most frequent initial lethal problem in sudden cardiac arrest is
ventricular fibrillation，which is abnormal rhythm incapable of delivery of blood to the heart． The most effective treatment
for ventricular fibrillation is elec－ trical defibrillation，which is an externally applied electrical shock to the heart in an attempt to make it beat normally again． defibrillation diminishes rapidly over time．Ventricular fibrillation tends to convert to death within a few minutes．

instrument computer which is simple to to
operate but automatically monitors heart activity and determines the
need for defibrillation need for defibrillation．If
defibrillation is needed，the AED defibrillation is needed，the AED
interacts with the rescuer and an interacts with the rescuer and an
electrical shock is given in an attempt to convert the heart rhythm problem．
The use of this instrument by ambulance personnel on the scene after responding to a cardiac arrest
helps lessen the time from initial cardiac arrest to defibrillation and increases the probability of sur－ vival．The speed with which
defibrillation is performed is defibrillation is performed is a
major determinant of the success of major determinantor
Also，according to the Ad－
vanced Cardiac Life Support vanced Cardiac Life Support
Textbook，automatic devices should permit most small communities
with volunteer emergency care providers to have enhanced life－ saving potential．Second，it may be a more fiscally responsible way to improve outcome after cardiac
arrest in areas where the costs of paramedic services are prohibitive．

community．An Automatic Exter－ nal Defibrillator is an expensive piece of equipment and takes extra training and skills which we are
dedicated to provide dedicated to provide．The Friona
EMS Association is a non－profit organization whose goals include raising funds for this type of
equipment．We have recently raised equipment．We have recently raised a small amount of funds through
our annual EMS breakfasts held our annual EMS breakfasts held

in a large bowl; stir in $1 / 4$ cup flour mixture to coat fruit and nuts. Blend margarine and brown sugar in a mixing bowl. Add egg yolks, 1 a time, beating after each
addition. Stir in com syrup, then driition. Stir in corn syrup, then
fruit mixture, then grape juice. Add flour mixture alternately with buttermilk. Beat egg whites until soft peaks form when beater is
raised. Fold into batter. Turn raised. Fold into batter. Turn
batter into greased and floured pans. bater into greased and floured pans.
Bake at 300 degrees until cake tests done. To test doneness, insert a wooden pick into the cake; if it comes out clean, it is done. Cool

in brandy-, rum-, or cola-soaked in brandy-, rum-, or cola-soaked
