## ANDY WILKERSON

### Children's Miracle Telethon Will Feature Friona Boy

The Children's Miracle Network Telethon to be aired on KAMR Television Channel 4 this weekend will feature a Friona youngster as a "Miracle Child" in two segments on the Sunday program.

Andy Wilkerson's story will be seen Sunday morning at 2:40 a.m. and again at 3:30 p.m. when he will be interviewed live on the air.

Andy is age 15 and a freshman at Friona High School and is the son of Terry and Peggy Wilkerson. He was diagnosed with acute lymphocytic leukemia on December 27th last year. During his hospital stay at Northwest Texas Hospital the family became acquainted with the "Make-A-Wish Foundation" which provides wishes for children up to age 18 who have potentially life-threatening illnesses.

Andy's wish was for a set of golf clubs for himself and a set for his older sister Carrie. When the group learned how much Andy's entire family enjoyed the game of golf, they asked who his favorite player was, and he told them that he greatly admired Fred Couples.

Then a couple of months later, the group contacted Andy and his family and asked if they would like to meet Fred Couples when he came to Dallas on May 13 to participate in the Byron Nelson Golf Classic. The family was flown to Dallas on May 12 and were treated

royally by the Foundation people. When Andy met Fred Couples at the golf course the next day, Couples invited him to walk along with him and his partner on the first nine holes, which was a big thrill for Andy. Then a cart was sent out to bring him back to the club house so he would not get overly tired-out. After the group flew back to Amarillo, they were taken to a local golf course where the two Wilkerson young people were presented with their new sets of golf clubs.

Steve Oakley of KAMR began filming Andy's story back in January during his stay at Northwest Texas Hospital and again later when Andy visited Amarillo with the FHS TAG group. Oakley later brought a film crew to Friona and interviewed some local folks including Coach Steve Williams. They showed on film how much Andy had improved by following him out to the local golf course. These film segments will be seen on Amarillo's portion of the Telethon this weekend and Andy will participate in a short live interview.

Friona will be saddened to lose the Wilkerson family soon because father Terry, who has been manager of the local branch of EXCEL Corp. for the past five years, has accepted a managerial position at

Cargill PPD Poultry plant at Buena Vista, Georgia. He will be leaving for Georgia in the next few days, but the rest of the family will stay in Friona for a few months, as Andy is currently on a chemotherapy program. Peggy, Carrie and Andy will leave later when Andy goes into a long-term maintenance program after July.

The entire Wilkerson family has expressed appreciation for the caring concern, prayers and good wishes of the people of Friona and they all say they will greatly miss their local friends when they move to Georgia.

In the Panhandle area, the Children's Health Foundation has made a significant impact on the lives of many other children in this region. One hundred percent of the money raised by this year's telethon will stay in the Panhandle to help children of this area and will be used to purchase state of the art equipment needed to provide children of this region with the latest in health care technology. A portion of the money will be dedicated to Outreach Education for the entire Panhandle.

The Foundation feels that telling the story of Andy's illness and subsequent improvement, will assist in raising money for the Children's Miracle Network to continue with successes for other children at Northwest Texas Hospital.

## Monsoon Season-- Over 5 Inches Here

The Friona area received over five inches of rainfall during an eight-day period, making the month of May the wettest month on record in over five years.

It marked the first time in the past five years for the rainfall to top the five-inch mark in a calendar month, and eclipsed the 4.79-inch measurement recorded here in June of 1991.

After the rainy spell had been kicked off on Wednesday, May 20 with a 1.58 measurement in the official Friona gauge, the city gauge caught moisture on four consecutive days of the current week, and six out of seven. Measurements were as follows (readings taken at 8 a.m. daily for the previous 24-hour period): .23 inch May 23; .44 inch May 24; .77 inch May 25; 1.54 inch May 26; .53 inch May 28 and .01 inch May 29.

That brought the year's total moisture in the Friona gauge to 9.12 inches, over half of which has been received in the past ten days.

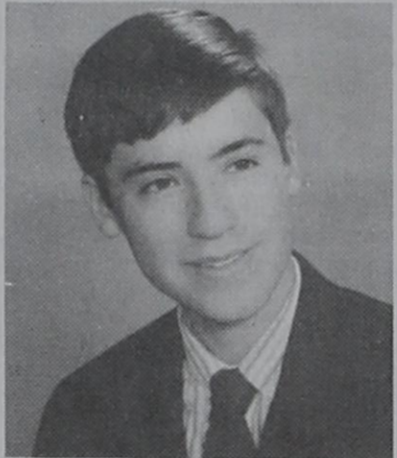
**50 Yrs. Ago-May 29, 1942**

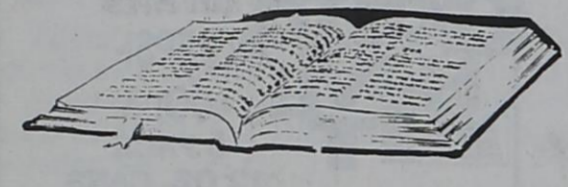

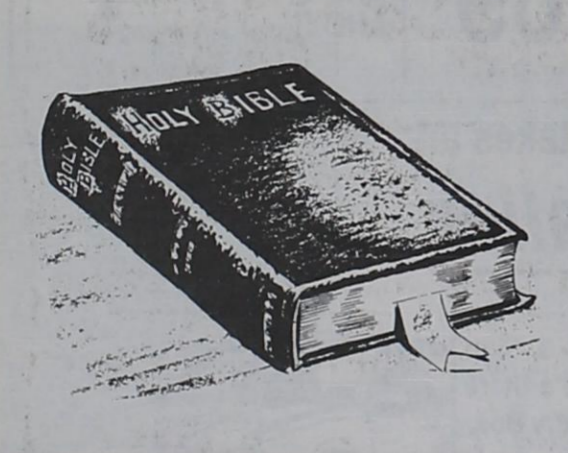

She was active in the Drama, Foreign Language, Thespian, French and Inter Act Clubs and had the leading female role in the U.I.L. one-act play contest.

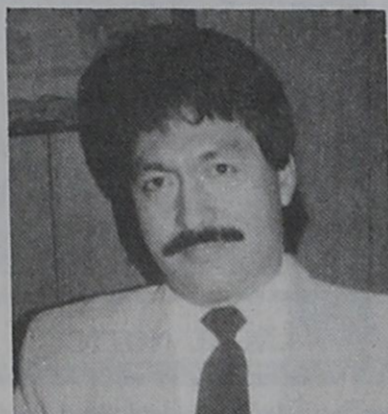

**Canyon blanks Friona, advances to area round**

**PLAINVIEW** - How tough is it for Friona to score runs against Canyon in a playoff baseball game? Imagine taking a swing against pitcher Nolan Ryan and his legendary fastball. That tough. Canyon exploded for eight runs in the second inning and used the shut-out pitching of Isaac Padilla to dump Friona 10-0 in Friday's five inning Class 3A bi-district game at Jaycee Park.

This is the second consecutive year Canyon has defeated Friona by the 10-run rule after five innings in bi-district. Both scores were 10-0.

"A win is a win in the playoffs," said Canyon coach Gary Hix, whose team advances to area round play next Saturday against Denver City. "I thought we showed the patience when we needed it."

Friona finished its second baseball season 13-8 and as co-champions in District 2-3A.

District 1-3A champion Canyon (20-7) put this one away by scoring eight runs in the second inning. But it wasn't because the Eagles pounded the ball all over the park.

Canyon sent 13 batters to the plate in the second inning - five of them walked and one reached base after being hit - as Friona starter Tony Cuevas struggled to throw strikes.

All five Canyon batters who walked scored, and although the Eagles first nine batters in the inning did not hit a ball out of the infield, the score was 6-0.

Canyon's hitters shared the run-batted-in wealth as six different play-

ers chalked up an RBI. Second baseman Kevin Richardson scored two of Canyon's eight runs as he walked and produced a run-scoring single.

Cuevas, 7-4, left in the second after facing six hitters and walking in two runs. Cuevas, who pitched out of bases loaded jam in the first inning, had thrown six innings against Muleshoe on Tuesday in a 13-8 loss to determine the 2-3A top seed.

"After throwing 150 pitches on Tuesday my hats off to him (Cuevas) because he came out and tried it," Hix said. "We wanted to wait him out and make things happen. I wasn't giving the take sign. I just told them to be selective."

Friona looked headed for a different fate two batters into the game. Friona leadoff hitter Blue Field was hit by Canyon pitcher Padilla and then third baseman Pat Upton singled to right to put runners at first and second with nobody out.

But Padilla erased any thought of a Friona rally by recording three consecutive strike outs.

"It was mainly jitters," said Padilla of the shaky start. "I was surprised I was that nervous. It took a little while for me to get my control."

Padilla settled down to dominate Friona hitters, allowing three hits, walking none and striking out 10 of the 19 batters he faced. Padilla improved to 8-4 and has won eight of his last nine starts.


"After that (eight runs in the second) happens you can let them hit because you're ahead," Padilla said.

### Proxies Assure A Voice To Individual Shareholders

Common stock represents ownership in a corporation. For issues requiring a vote before the corporation's board of directors, owners of common stock--shareholders--are entitled to one vote, either in person or by proxy, for every share owned. This ensures that each owner has a proportional voice in the decisions of the company.

Better Investing, the official publication of the National Association of Investors Corporation (NAIC), recently reported on a proposal that would reduce the voting clout of individual investors by placing more power in the hands of large, institutional investors.

The California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) got the ball rolling in November 1989 by requesting special voting privileges because of its size (\$64 billion). Its request was based on the hypothesis that as a sophisticated, institutional investor, CalPERS is "not only able to play a positive role in the government of public corporations but, as the owner of these corporations, has a right to assert that role."

Better Investing argues that managers or individuals who direct a large fund may administer that fund but do not own it. Decision-making belongs to each investor in direct proportion to his or her ownership. CalPERS' proposal, though, would give its \$64 billion worth of proxies greater voting authority than the proxies of individual investors.

The NAIC's primary concern, of course, is individual investors, and the organization fears that approval of CalPERS' proposal would put more control of corporations into the hands of fewer people.

As it stands now, adoption of CalPERS' proposal by the SEC could create a privileged class of shareholder. Back-room agreements among large, institutional investors could potentially influence corporate decisions without the usual SEC filings and clearances.

The problem is compounded by the fact that the proxy procedure is complicated for many individuals who are not directly involved in the process.

At this writing, there is no indication as to what will be the outcome. However, the consequences could be far-reaching.
