Monsoon Season--Over 5 Inches Here

The Friona area received over five inches of rainfall during an eight-day period, making the month of May the wettest month on record in over five years.

past five years for the rainfall to top the five-inch mark in a calendar month, and eclipsed the 4.79-inch measurement recorded here in June of 1991.

After the rainy spell had been kicked off on Wednesday, May 20 with a 1.58 measurement in the official Friona guage, the city guage caught moisture on four consecutive days of the current week, and six out of seven. Measurements were as follows (readings taken at 8 a.m. daily for the previous 24-hour period):

.23 inch May 23; .44 inch May 24; .77 inch May 25; 1.54 inch May 26; .53 inch May 28 and .01 inch May 29.

That brought the year's total moisture in the Friona guage to 9.12 inches, over half of which has been received in the past ten days.

The Rhea Community missed It marked the first time in the out on most of the moisture that hit the Friona area the first day, but rains this week had amounted to around two inches in that area, which is mostly dryland, and depends heavily upon rainfall for its agricultural sustenance.

"This should still help the wheat to some extent. We should have a pretty good wheat crop," said Joe Allen, manager of the Sherley-Anderson Rhea elevator.

"This rain should help the quality considerably. At least we got away from the hot, dry weather we had been having," the longtime Rhea elevator official said.

Allen added that the rainfall received in that area would also allow the farmers who planned to plant milo to get that crop into the ground.


Friona's seventh grade girls' track team placed fourth in their district meet recently at Floydada, scoring 63 points.

Common stock represents ownership in a corporation. For issues requiring a vote before the corporation's board of directors, owners of common stock--shareholders--are entitled to one vote, either in person or by proxy, for every share owned. This ensures that each owner has a proportional voice in the decisions of the company.

publication of the National of CalPERS' proposal would put Association of Investors more control of corporations into Corporation (NAIC), recently reported on a proposal that would reduce the voting clout of individual the hands of large, institutional investors.

Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) got the ball rolling in November 1989 by requesting special voting privileges because of its size (\$64 billion). Better Investing argues that managers or individuals who direct a large fund may administer that fund but do not own it.
