#### SAC Announces A **New Test Corridor**

OFFUTT AFB, Neb. - Strategic Air Command has announced the opening of two supersonic test corridors effective Jan. 2, 1964.

The routes to be flown are from Altus. Okla., to Kerrville, Texas, and over the length of Lake Michigan.

Flights along these routes may occur daily and normally will not be scheduled between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.

SAC B-58 Hustlers, the free world's fastest bomber, will fly at supersonic speeds up to Mach 2 (1,300 m.p.h.) at altitudes small heater to take care of the above 35,000 feet. They will fly may travel in either direction.

> Because of the high altitudes. the sonic booms created are compartively weak in strength. Although sometimes startling or distracting in their suddenness, the booms will in no circumstances cause personal injury.




