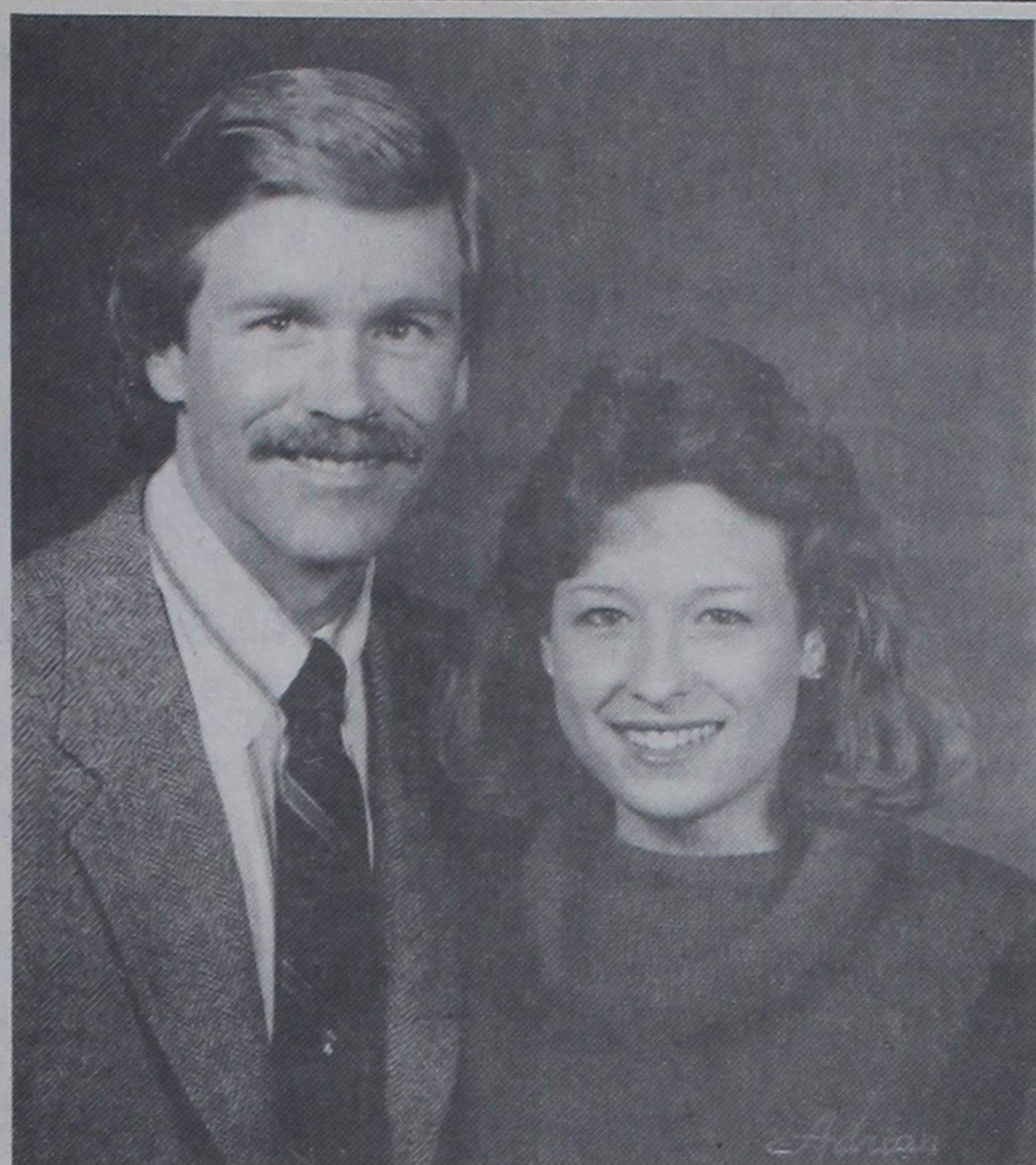

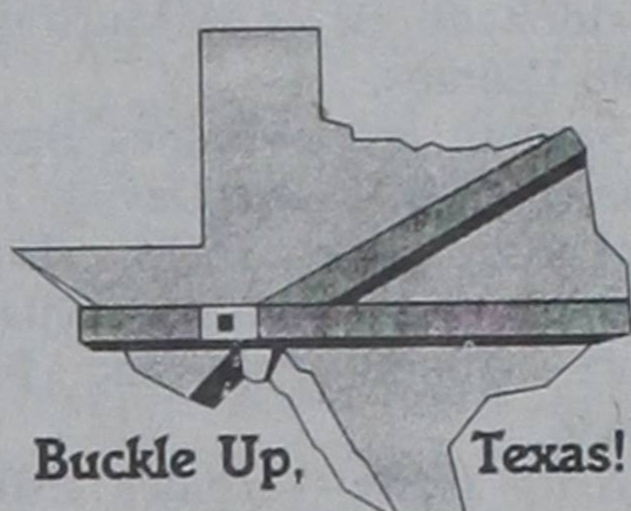
Basketball Tryouts Are February 14

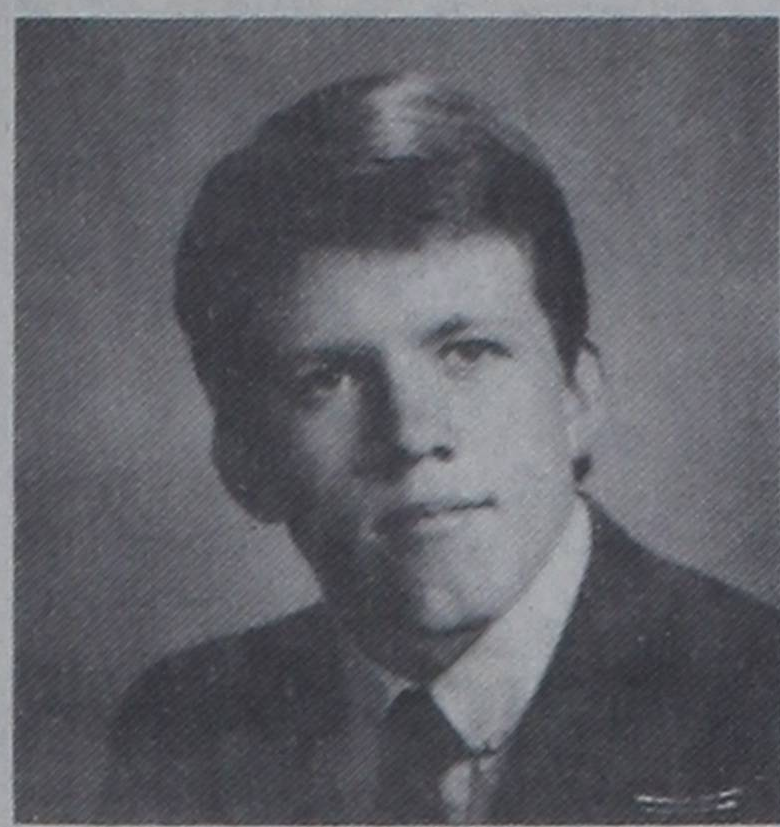

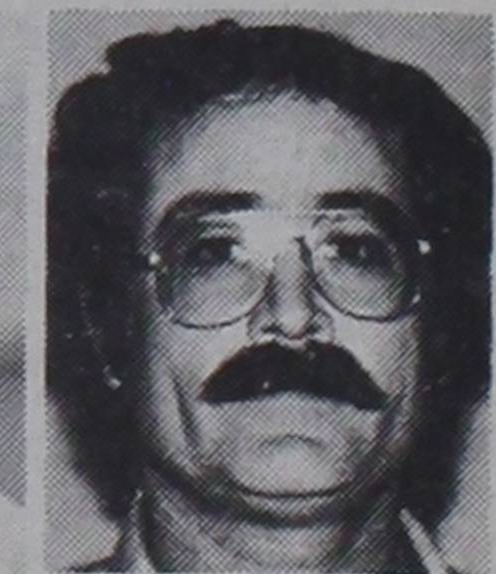
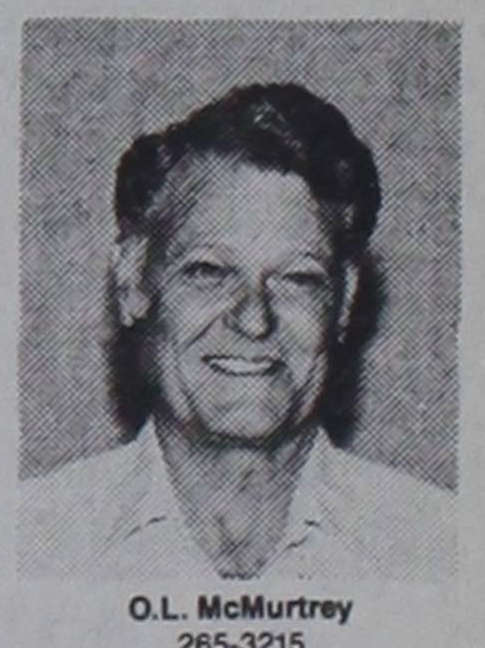
