Orient Asks An Extension.

First Vice President R. L. Mc-Caulley of the Panhandle & Gulf Railway Co., the Texas corporation of the Orient, arrived in San Angelo Monday afternoon from Sweetwater, accompanied by J. R. Daugnerty, a prominent stockman of Nolan county, and one of the directors of the P. & 41. They came to interview the San Angele railroad committee with regard to securing an extension of eighteen months of the contract between this tows and the railroad company.

Tuesday afternoon a meeting was held in the directors' room of the San Angelo Natisnal Bank. there being present in addition to

ty, the fellowing members of the local committee: Messrs. Geo. J. Bird, F. E. Allen, Dr. C E. Mays C. W. Hobbs, J. C. Landon, M. L. Mercz U. G. Teylor and A. J Baker; the committee members absent being Messrs. J. A. March. J. W. Hill, C. H. Powell and W A. Gu hrie.

Mr. McCaulley stated the wishes of the company, asking of Sun Angelo an extension of eighteen months from date of expiration of the contract between the citizens' railway committee and the Orien company. This contract expires in November next, and Mr. Mc-Caulley stated that the railroad people found themselves unable complete the line to this point by that time.
