THE ASSOCIATED PRESS SUMS UP THE WAR SITUATION THIS MORNING AS FOLLOWS:

THE BULGARIANS HAVE EVA-CUATED ALL THE FORTS AT THE GREEK PORT OF KAVALA, WHICH THEY OCCUPIED AMONTH AGO, A PETIT PARISIEN LEARNS FROM A SEMI-OFFICIAL SOURCE.

THE FORTS HAVE BEEN HAND. ED OVER TO THE GREEKS. THEY WILL BE OF NO MILITARY VALUE TO THE BULGARIANS AFTER THE ARRIVAL OF THE ENTENTE WAR-




