



LONDON, June 22,-Sir Henry Wil-on, Field Marshal of the Brifish army, son. Field Marshal of the British army, was shot and killed here today cutside his home by two assassians, who were captured a short time after the shooting. The Irish extremists are believed to have been responsible for the deed, according to the belief of the British War office.
