ROBY, Texas, March 21 .- A. Martin, 24, died in Price's Barber Shop here this morning following a shooting affray on the steps of the courthouse.

His father-in-law, Dan Stevens, 65, surrendered to Fisher County authorities following the shooting.

Only one shot was fired. A large calibered revolver was used. Martin got over to Price's Barber Shop, where he died. His body is being held. No funeral arrangements had been made late this afternoon. He lived at McCaulley.
