LARGEST CLASS Simmons College Graduation Exercises On June 5

ABILENE, Texas, May 23 .-- Commencement exercises of Simmons College will be observed June 5, and Dr. Harold Majors, pastor of the Gaston Avenue Baptist Church of Dallas, will deliver the thirty-third annual commencement address of that institution. Exactly one hundred students are enrolled in the senior class of Simmons and will receive the A. B. degree this year. The number of graduates was announced some weeks ago as 94; but since the announcement six more have qualified in the matter of credits, and one hundred men and women will be graduated from Simmons for 1924, by far the largest graduating class the college has ever had. About threefourths of the number will complete their work and receive their diplomas at the June commencement, and the other fourth will take their degrees at the end of the summer session.







Mix the arsenic with a little water, perhaps a cupful and work into a paste as you would flour. If more water is sused to start with, it is impossible to get all of the arsenic wet and secure a good mixture.

When the paste is smoth, it may be stirred into the three gallons of water until all lumps disappear, and then stir in the molases.




