#### AN AVOIDABLE LOSS


The death of a woman at a grade crossing here Sunday night, one of many similar accidents throughout the United States every day, might have been avoided if the persons crossing the tracks had been provided with an overhead or subway passage across the railroad property.

The particular crossing at which the fatal accident occurred must be crossed every day by hundreds of Sweetwater citizens who reside on the South Side. In addition to the risk of the lives of those who cross the tracks, the crossing is often necessarily blocked by freight and passenger trains, causing delay to citizens who have occasion to go across.

As the business in the T-P yards in Sweetwater continues to increase, the delay and the danger at the crossing will become greater. The railroad now has more engines in the local yards than in any city west of Fort Worth. It is reasonable to believe that the Sweetwater yard business



Cementing Leather to Iron

To cement leather to an iron surface, paint the iron with a mixture of white lead and lampblack in oil. Then cover with a cement made of the best glue soaked in water until soft, and dissolved in vinegar. This is thoroughly mixed with one-third of its bulk of white-pine turpentine, and thinned with vinegar until it can be spread with a brush. The cement should be applied to the iron hos and the leather put on and quickly pressed into place; the parts should be held tightly in a clamp while drying.

Making Stranded-Wire Cables

Having had considerable difficulty in obtaining good seven-stranded cable for guy wires, a mechanic hit upon the following method of making it himself: He jacked up one of the rear wheels of his car and fastened one end of a coil of galvanized-iron wire to one of the spokes, brought the wire around a fencepost, directly in line with the wheel, and attached it to the opposite spoke of the wheel, cutting it from the coil at this point. Two other lengths of wire were run in the same way and also a single length from the wheel to the post. He then started the engine and put it in gear, which caused the rear wheel to revolve and twist the wires as desired, making a
