Robertson his 17 year old son-inlaw Saturday night, kept in seculsion at his home today as a wave of publie sentiment arose against him. While no violence is feared, convert threats were heard and unfavorable comments became more pronounced.

Collier refused to receive his friends and his resignation, momentarily expected by the city commission, has not been tendered.

Meantime, Colliers' daughter, Mary Frances, young Robertson's widow, refused to return to her father's home. and is with Robertson's mother. "I'll never go back", she declared.

# RURAL SCHOOLS MissMinneapolis

State Inspector Increases Official Grant from \$10,485 to \$11,600 Rural Schools.

CLEAR INDEBTEDNESS

Much New Equipment Purchased With Additions to Buildings Reason For Increase.

An increase of \$1,115 from the ofcicial grant for the aid of rural schools of Nolan County is one result of the visit of the State School Inspector, J. R. Rasco, to this county last week, according to County Superintendent of Schools Will H. Scott.

' Mr. Rascoe took occasion to compliment the schools of the county, saying that they averaged well in compartson with the rural schools of the state. The total state aid money for rural

schools amounts to \$11,600, as compared with \$10,485 officially granted The money will be available some time in March, Superintendent Scott said. Increases to various schools of the county were granted owing to indebtdness for new equipmensor for addi-

The average sum alloted to rural schools over the state this year was \$415 while the average for Notan County is \$504 per school or about \$12.60 per rural scholar.
