seven years. She was bom in rura seven years. he was boilin rural
Bell County between Killeen and Belton and grew up in the same community.
She was the eighth of nine
children born to E.J. and Martha children born to E.J. and Martha to James Milton Watson, April 13 . ${ }^{1913}$ The Watsons moved to Parmer County with five daughiers, Martha Jamie Lu, fourteen years later Another daughter, Macie Kathryn, was bom later.
As the oldest of the family,
Martha Evelyn, was asked Martha Evelyn, was asked to
compose the opening paragraph of the family story. Each of the other five was asked to provide information conceming her family.
Their responses follow:
Martha: "Lessie Carter and Martha: "Lessie Carter and
James milton Watson were married
in Bell County, Texas, in 1913. Jom Bell County, Texas, in 19113,
They farmed for a few years in a small community near Belton and Killeen, Texas. He then worked
several years for the Southern Pacific Rairroad in New Mexico and Califomia. In 1925 , they purchased 160 arres from The Syndicate.' Mo Mother and five children rode he train from Sanger, Califormia to our grandparents home in Central
Texas, where we stayed until our house on the farm was almost completed.
