1994, the unit had provided 4,394 home visits to people in this rea needing medical assistance.
"Home health care enables people to stay at home where they are most comfortable when they're in need of medical care o "Initiation of home health services is most often through the referral of a physician. However, family members also provide referrals for loved ones in need," Dennison said. Services provided depend most specifically on the patient's diagnosis. A range of services provided are post-operative care dressing changes, physical therapy, IV therapy, respiratory and
diabetic care, injections and medication maintenance. Personal care, hygiene, meal preparation and light housekeeping are provided by home health aides.
