WITHIN A MONTH, our country has lost a pair of leading political figures from the 1950s-60s era, the latest being the passing of Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis.

The Kennedy administration was the first one with which we felt a kinship, it being my first opportunity, in 1960, to cast my first vote in a presidential election. And while we mentioned a month ago that we had voted twice for Nixon in winning races, we're still proud of the fact that in 1960, we voted for JFK in his win over Nixon.

In fact, I had to drive 25 or 30 miles to the courthouse in Palo Alto, California in order to vote in the election, since Carol and I had moved to California during the election year.

JFK's tremendous charisma definitely had an appeal to us as younger voters, and the sight of Jackie on his arm didn't hurt one bit. As the writers have pointed out this week, Kennedy knew what made him look good--perhaps reinforced by his father, Joseph Kennedy, who was said to have considered Jackie "about perfect."

We always felt a sort of tie to the Kennedys after our firstborn, Laura, was born on the same day that John F. Kennedy, Jr. was born. We have enjoyed seeing photos and articles about John, Jr., down through the years, remembering that on that day John-John got the biggest headline, although we were proud of Laura's one-column story in the San Mateo Times, for which Bill was a sports writer. The Times didn't ordinarily run birth announcements at all.

Along with the rest of the nation, we suffered as Jackie saw her husband snuffed out during the parade in Dallas. We watched as she bore the grief following the assassination with uncommon grace, never shedding a tear in public.

The picture of young John-John saluting his dead father's coffin, shown again on TV and in the press this week, is indelibly a part of our mind's eye when we remember the pictures of JFK's funeral.

We had not realized at the time that in spite of her grief, Jackie had quickly arranged all of the details of JFK's funeral, including the riderless horse that followed the coffin in the parade, and the burial of Kennedy in Arlington National Cemetery, beneath an eternal flame. To Ye Editor, that seemed like class, with a capital "C."

She was thrust into the public eye as first lady at the tender age of 31. Compare that with the ages of your children, or those you know, and it sort of makes you gasp. She was the first president's wife in quite some time--and only one during our lifetime--to have a baby while living in the White House.

As Carol could no doubt better relate to you, Jackie also set the fashion trend for her generation of young ladies during the short time she served as first lady. The story we enjoyed this week was about the time she had to grab her pillbox-styled hat quickly when she was going to the inauguration, due to a gust of wind, and the top of the hat became indented.

After Jackie appeared at the inauguration with the indentation in her hat, everyone, including her fashion designer, Oleg Cassini, decided that this was the new trend--which it quickly became.

Did you know that when Jackie had the White House restored in 1961 she located antique furnishings from the James Monroe era, and that walls which had been painted in seasick green were covered over in 19th-century wallpaper carefully (and at great expense) stripped from old farmhouses!

She was too young a widow; too soon replaced (although no one has ever fully replaced her) as first lady. She died much too soon. The 1,000 days of "Camelot" were too short.

"Don't let it be forgot, that once there was a spot; for one brief shining moment that was known as Camelot."

Hailstorm Cuts Across Local Area

(BULLETIN) A hailstorm late Thursday afternoon and evening cut a path of destruction across Parmer County, bringing severe damage to crops, homes, etc., in its wake.

The cloud entered the county south of Lazbuddie, and reportedly produced quarter-sized hail. It moved north and northwest, staying east of Highway 214 up to the Hub area, where it crossed over to the other side, narrowly missing the city of Friona to the west.

Motorists told of hail being stacked on Highway 214 near the old SIB Gin north of Clay's Corner, where water was also over the road.

The city of Friona received another .89 inch of rain Thursday evening, bringing the week's total to 2.98 inches and 3.73 for the month.

Home Health Dept. Observes Birthday

Friona's Home Health Department, which operates through Parmer County Community Hospital, observed its first birthday this week.

From its beginning in May of 1993 through April 30 of 1994, the unit had provided 4,394 home visits to people in this area needing medical assistance.

"Home health care enables people to stay at home where they are most comfortable when they're in need of medical care or assistance," said Chris Dennison, RN, director of the program. "Initiation of home health services is most often through the referral of a physician. However, family members also provide referrals for loved ones in need," Dennison said.

Services provided depend most specifically on the patient's diagnosis. A range of services provided are post-operative care, dressing changes, physical therapy, IV therapy, respiratory and diabetic care, injections and medication maintenance.

Personal care, hygiene, meal preparation and light housekeeping are provided by home health aides.

Curfew Will Take Effect On June 1

The curfew for Friona teenagers will go into full effect on June 1, and in the meantime, a number of youngsters have been stopped and issued a warning ticket.

"We have been giving on the average about three warning tickets per night, and up to ten on weekend nights," said Assistant Police Chief Randy Gerles.

The curfew is for youngsters under the age of 17. It starts at 11 p.m. on "school nights," or Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursdays, and at midnight on Friday and Saturday.

Anyone found in violation of the curfew can be punished by a fine of up to \$500.

There will be certain exceptions allowed to the new curfew, which will include special medical emergencies made necessary by illness or injury; or if the minor is returning home or going to employment at the late hour, or attending an official school, religious or other recreational activity supervised by adults or sponsored by the City of Friona, civic organization or another similar entity.

Area Gets Some Outstanding Rain

The Friona area received some great rainfall during the past week, with 2.09 inches measured in the official gauge.

Some damage was noted by light hail that accompanied the first rain last Sunday afternoon. Then, a twister-like cloud damaged buildings in the Wednesday afternoon cloud. A trailer house was reported to be unroofed.

The cloud continued into Deaf Smith County, where it was reported that at the Barrett & Crofoot Feed Yard west of Hereford power lines and poles were snapped, and several cattle were killed.

Most of the rain received in the immediate Friona area was just about right, although the Wednesday rain came in sheets for awhile. Measurements were 1.26 inches on Sunday, .32 inch Tuesday night and .51 inches Wednesday.

65 Yrs. Ago--May 31, 1929

Announcement was made this week that the Turner-Parr Trading Company has contracted for two lots on the west side of Main Street adjoining the south side of the F. L. Spring building. A 50 x 140 foot building will be constructed on the lots, all in one building, but just what the building will be used for is not known at this time.

Crop prospects in the Friona territory are said to be better than for the past several years. The wheat is looking like a better than average crop, and while only a few row crops are planted, hundreds of acres of sorghum grains, sudan and corn will be planted in the next few days.

60 Yrs. Ago--June 1, 1934

On Friday evening of last week the Frio Draw overflowed its banks at Friona and as usual swept down the State Highway No. 33 for the distance of nearly a mile. This overflow was caused not by any heavy rain falling within the immediate territory, but from rain that fell over in New Mexico. Two cars, unaware of the recent overflow, dashed into the wet road at this point, one being overturned and nearly buried, while the other barely escaped being ditched right where the other capsized.

55 Yrs. Ago--June 2, 1939

Miss Alice Guyer of Friona, and Mr. Charles B. Lovelace of Farwell were married in the home of the groom's sister, Mrs. H. L. Thurston at Aspermont May 27. Vows were read by Rev. H. L. Thurston, a former pastor of the Friona Methodist Church.

Did You Know?

Nearly 100 years ago two traveling strangers met by chance, never dreaming what they would start.

Paper salesman John "Nick" Nicholson reached the Central Hotel in Boscobel, Wisconsin at about 9:00 the night of September 14, 1898. The hotel lobby was full and the front desk confirmed his fears, every room was taken.

The hotel landlord wanted to help Nicholson, a regular customer, so he proposed to let him stay with another traveler, Sam Hill, whose room had a spare bed. Mr. Hill agreed to the arrangement.

That night as he was preparing for bed, Mr. Nicholson asked, "Excuse me if I keep this light on a little while longer, I always make it a practice to read the Word of God and speak to Him before I retire." "Read it aloud," Hill told him. "I'm a Christian too."

After reading the Word and praying together, they conversed until early in the morning. They

saw a need for traveling Christian salesmen and decided to form just such an organization.

They parted the next morning, but soon forgot about their commitments. The following May, however, they unexpectedly met again on a street in Beaver Dam, Wisconsin. This time they planned their first meeting and promised to invite other Christian salesmen to join them.

Their first meeting was on July 1, 1899, there were only three in attendance, Nicholson, Hill, and the newcomer, William Knights.

From that meeting the association has grown into what we know as the *Gideons* today. The public knows them most for their placing of Bibles into hotel and motel rooms. But they were founded with this object in mind: "winning commercial traveling men for Christ."

In present day they are known to have distributed some 32,000,000 Bibles a year. In 58 languages, in 140 countries, *Gideon* Bibles can be found in hotels and motels. Some 1,000,000 Bibles were distributed to military personnel in Operation Desert Storm.

It was a small beginning for those three men, but God has said in Zechariah 4:10 "For who has despised the day of small things?"

Of His word, God says in Isaiah 55:10-11 "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there without watering the earth, and making it bear and sprout, and furnishing seed to the sower and bread to the eater; so shall My word by which goes forth from My mouth: It shall not return to Me empty, without accomplishing what I desire, and without succeeding in the matter for which I sent it."

Roy Cecil Upton, 86 years old, died Wednesday, May 18, in Vernon, Texas.


Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Friday at Community Funeral Home Chapel with Kevin Ward, minister of Wilbarger Street Church of Christ, officiating. Burial was in Wilbarger Memorial Park.

He was born August 2, 1907, was a lifetime Vernon resident, retired from the Vernon Water Department and as a night watchman for North Texas Alfalfa Mill.

Survivors include his wife, Anna Mae; four sons, Larrie of Vernon, James Cecil of Mineral Wells, Eugene and Lonnie, both of Graham; four daughters, Francis Hancock and Mary Logsdon, both of Vernon, Anita Hall of Friona and Janie Gillespie of Texarkana, Texas; a sister, Kathleen Martin of Vernon; twenty-two grandchildren and many great-grandchildren.

Happy Homemaker

"Are you making the most of your microwave?" This question was the lead sentence in a feature article in a recent ladies magazine.

My answer would have to be in the negative. However, very often I eat a microwave dish someone else prepared and tell myself, "I must learn to prepare this one and to use my microwave more often."

The most recent incident of this type was when I ate Mother's Day lunch with a granddaughter, Heather Osborn, who lives in Abernathy.

I immediately asked for and received the recipe and filed it along with a lot of other "must dos" and haven't tried it yet.

SLICED BAKED POTATOES

For four servings you will need:

- 4 medium even potatoes
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 to 3 tablespoons melted butter
- 2 to 3 tablespoons chopped fresh herbs such as parsley, chives, thyme or sage or 2 to 3 teaspoons dried herb of your choice
- 4 tablespoons grated cheddar cheese
- 1-1/2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese

Preparation: peel the potatoes if the skin is tough, otherwise, just rinse and pat dry. Cut potatoes into thin slices but not all the way through. Use a handle of a spoon to prevent knife from cutting all the way. Place potatoes in a microsafe dish or pan. Sprinkle with melted butter and chopped parsley, chives or sage.

Microwave at high power 10 minutes, rearranging the potatoes after five minutes. Let rest five minutes. Sprinkle with grated cheddar and Parmesan cheese. Microwave for another four to six minutes at high power until cheeses are melted and potatoes are soft. Sprinkle with salt. Serve potatoes as a side dish or as a main dish with just a salad.

It will not be very long until summer vegetables are available. If your family enjoys eating slaw, the two following recipes should be filed and used for preserving a winter supply.

CANNED COLE SLAW

12 pounds cabbage-shredded and put in a crock

Add 1 cup coarse salt and 2 gallons boiling water. Stir and let set overnight.

10 large onions, shredded into another container

3 red sweet peppers and a green sweet pepper shredded into a third container

Add 1 teaspoon salt to each container. Mix well and let set overnight.

Next morning: wash contents of each container in cold water. Drain and squeeze water out with hands. Mix all three together well.

Mix 3 cups sugar, 3 cups vinegar and 1 cup water in a saucepan and bring to a boil then pour over mixture. Add 3 cups Mazola oil and thoroughly mix together. Fill pint or quart size canning jars and seal. Place in pressure cooker. Process five minutes at 5 pounds pressure. Let cooker cool before removing jars. All jars should be sealed.

Slaw is ready to eat any time and keeps real well.

FROZEN CABBAGE SALAD

- 1 head cabbage
- 1 green pepper
- 1/4 cup water
- 3 cups sugar
- 1 cup vinegar
- 1 teaspoon mustard seed
- 1 teaspoon celery seed

Shred cabbage and pepper in saucepan. Add 1 teaspoon salt and let set awhile. Bring to a boil and let cool. Mix remaining ingredients and pour over cabbage-pepper mixture. Freeze. Keeps well.

When the first new potatoes are ready, try this **CHEESY NEW POTATO CASSEROLE**:

- 1-1/2 pounds new potatoes (18 small)
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1 pound Muenster or Mozzarella cheese, sliced thinly
- 4 large eggs
- 1/2 cup milk

- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/3 cup bread crumbs

Scrub potatoes well. Steam in 1 inch boiling water, which has been salted, 10 to 25 minutes or until tender. Rinse with cold water; slice thinly. Butter a 7-1/2 x 11-1/2 inch baking dish. Arrange 1/3 of the potatoes in the dish; top with 1/2 the onions and 1/2 the cheese. Repeat layers ending with potatoes.

In a small bowl, beat eggs, milk and pepper; pour over potatoes. Sprinkle top evenly with bread crumbs. Cover. Bake 25 minutes at 375 degrees. Remove cover, bake 10 to 15 minutes longer or until potatoes are tender. Makes 6 to 8 average servings.

Do you want to make a different kind of pie? If so, try

SUNSHINE PIE

- 1-1/2 pounds zucchini
- 1 large onion
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/2 cup Ricotta cheese
- 1/2 cup unsifted flour
- 1-1/2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning, crushed
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 cup broccoli florets
- 1/2 cup green pepper cut in strips
- 1/4 cup sliced celery
- 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded Mozzarella cheese
- 1 tomato, cut in wedges

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Shred zucchini and onion by hand or in an electric processor (combined total makes about 4-1/2

cups). Squeeze out excess liquid. In large bowl, combine zucchini, onion, eggs, Parmesan cheese, Ricotta cheese, flour, garlic, Italian seasoning, salt and black pepper; mix well.

Pour into an oiled 9 to 10 inch quiche pan or pie pan. Bake until partially set--about 15 minutes. In a medium saucepan, cook broccoli, green pepper and celery in 1 inch boiling water until crisp and tender--about 2 minutes; drain. Sprinkle half of the Mozzarella cheese on the pie.

Arrange broccoli, green pepper, celery and tomato over the cheese. Sprinkle remaining Mozzarella cheese over vegetables. Bake until cheese melts and knife inserted in center of pie comes out clean--about 10 minutes. Yields six portions.

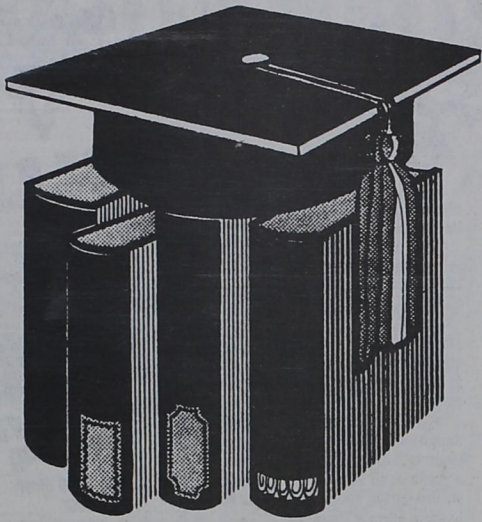

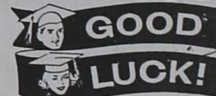

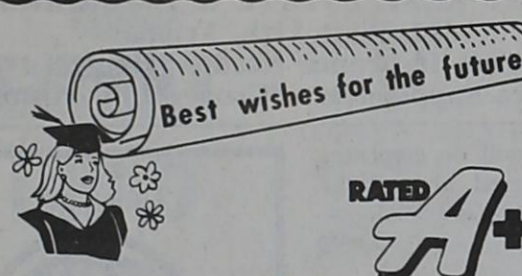

In the sixth inning, the team got

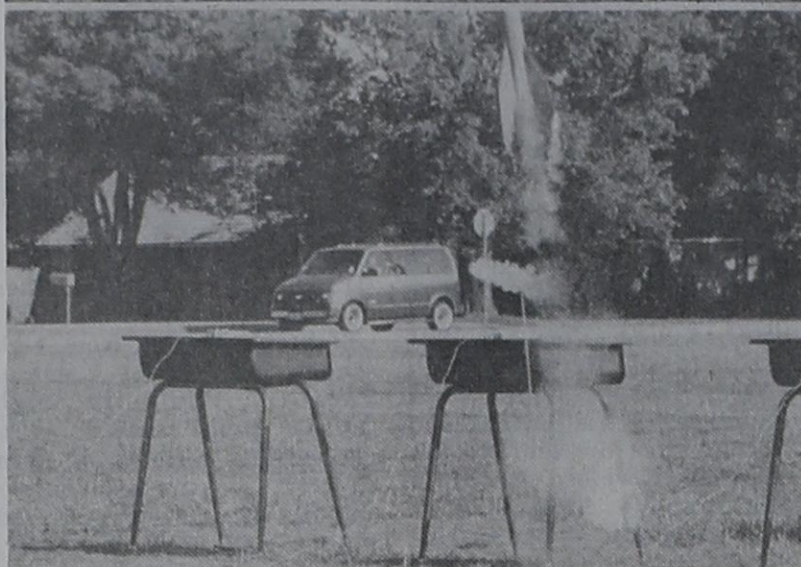
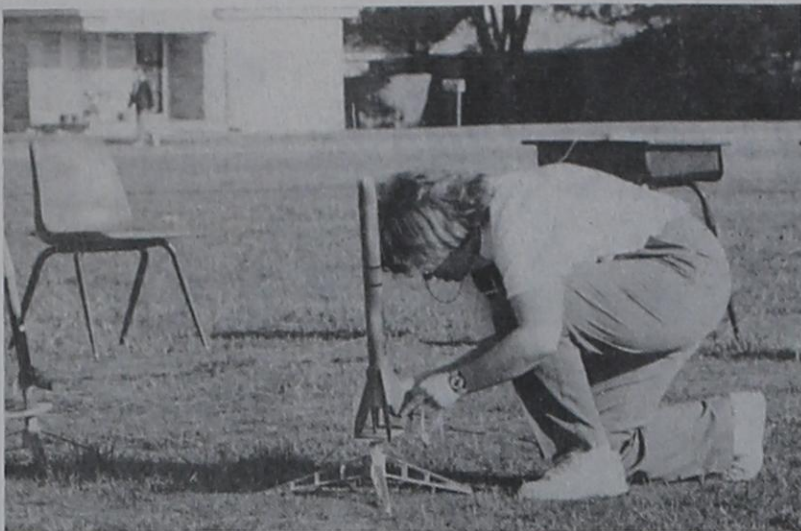

His parents are John and Deanna Duke of Friona and he is a 1990 graduate of Friona High School.

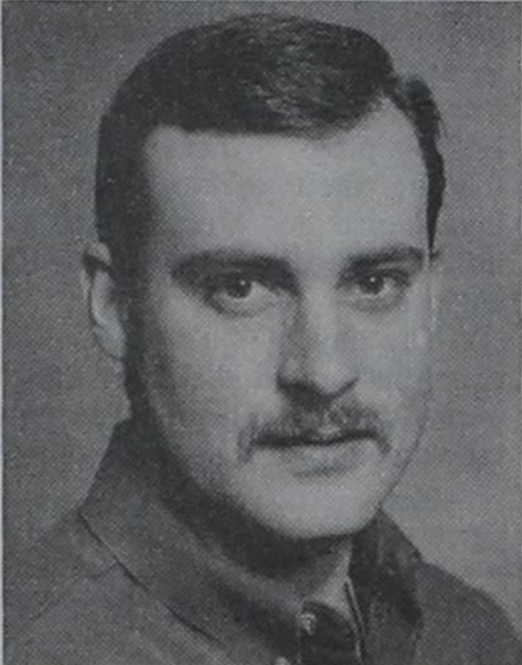

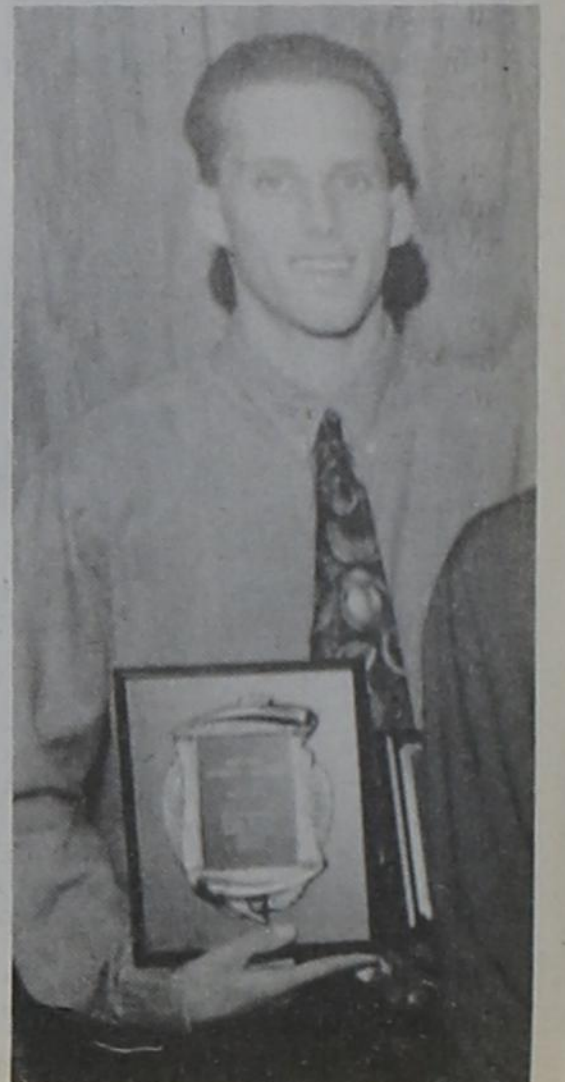
Beck also received a four year scholarship from the Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago where he will participate in R.O.T.C. training while majoring in mathematics and engineering.

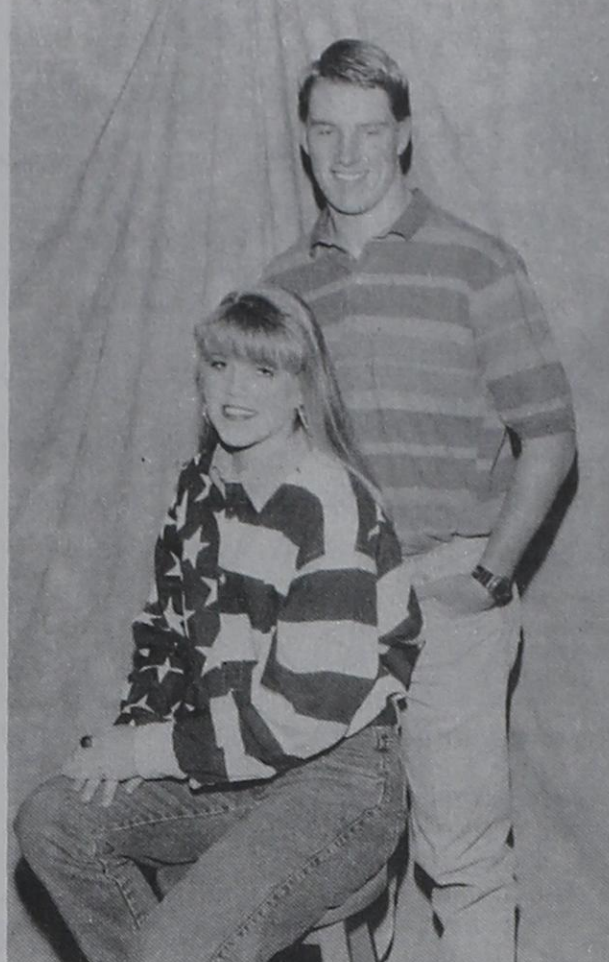

Don't Sacrifice Growth for Stability of Principal

What percentage of your money should be invested in common stocks or stock mutual funds? One financial expert suggests a simple formula of subtracting your age from 100 to determine the appropriate allocation of investment dollars to equities. For example, if you are 50, half your investments should be in common stock or stock mutual funds.

However, most people have much less invested in equities than they should. Of all mutual fund investments, 70.5 per cent are in bond funds and money market funds; only 29.5 per cent are in equities. Retirees often have their money too conservatively invested, thinking only about stability of principal. Even young people often have too large a portion of their portfolios invested only in fixed-income investments, which traditionally have yielded much less than common stocks.

No one should have all of his or her investments in growth securities. However, it is equally dangerous to be totally invested in short-term income securities. For example, in 1981, \$250,000 invested in certificates of deposit would have provided more than \$3,000 of income each month. Today, just 13 years later, that same nest egg would yield less than \$700 in monthly income. Although the principal has remained safe, monthly income has decreased more than 75 per cent, while inflation has continued to increase the cost of living.

Although common stocks and stock mutual funds offer some short-term market risk, serious,

long-term investors know that equities also offer the opportunity to stay ahead of inflation and keep income growing.

Staying ahead of inflation is particularly important to retirees.

Today, a 70-year-old has a 63 per cent chance of living another 15 years. Inflation as low as 3 per cent annually will reduce purchasing power by more than half in those 15 years. Selecting only fixed-income investments may not allow investors to stay ahead of inflation. Common stocks of large corporations, on the other hand, have yielded an average of 6 per cent more than inflation since 1926.

If you are heavily invested in fixed-income securities such as U.S. Treasuries or CDs, and you want to add some growth to your portfolio, how should you begin? First, don't try to do it all at once. Early redemptions could cost you penalties. Plan ahead, and find out when your securities mature.

Next, decide how much of your portfolio should be invested in common stocks or equity mutual funds. As your securities mature, or as new money becomes available, gradually move it into the new investments. Typically, taking one to two years to adjust your portfolio is best. This allows for market fluctuations and reduces your exposure to unexpected drops in the market.

Selecting only fixed-income investments may avoid the risk of losing principal, but it also may expose you to the biggest risk of all--outliving your nest egg. Don't forget about the importance of growth and staying ahead of inflation when choosing your investments.

Safety Belt Laws Were Passed To Save Lives

If you could save thousands of lives with a simple click, would you try?

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is trying. TxDOT announced today that May is the month for Texans who don't to buckle up!

Buckle Up Texas! month will spotlight the importance of safety belts, air bags and child safety seats. The month will also be celebrated with increased education and enforcement efforts. Translated, that means you are more likely to get a ticket for not wearing your safety belt, so you'd better learn to like it.

"Many people just don't realize how much your chance of serious injury or death is reduced if you wear safety belts," said Bill Burnett, TxDOT executive director.

Every state has a child safety seat law, and 46 states require drivers to wear seat belts. TxDOT is providing police departments

with grants to conduct a special enforcement effort during May.

"Safety belts saved an estimated 34,794 lives from 1983 to 1992," said Burnett. "We plan to culminate this awareness month on Memorial Day weekend, the opening of the tourist season, so more lives can be saved."

"It's too bad that the risk of getting a ticket is the only thing that will make some people buckle up," he added, "but TxDOT supports safety-belt use and the laws requiring it."

State law requires all drivers and front seat passengers buckle up. State law also requires all children under the age of two to be restrained in a child safety seat and children 2-4 years old to be restrained in a child safety seat or a safety belt. Fines for not buckling up range from \$25-\$50.

More than 60 per cent of the 3,037 people killed in accidents last year in Texas were not wearing a safety belt.

YOUR EYES



The Contacts/Bifocal Dilemma

People wear contact lenses, basically, because they don't want to wear glasses. What happens, then, when their eyes no longer adapt easily from far to near vision, when they need, ugh, reading glasses? The easiest correction, of

course, is probably reading glasses worn over the contacts, but other options are increasingly available.

One choice is the "aspheric" soft contact lens, a simultaneous bifocal that has a gradual change in power from the center of the lens to its edges. The areas close to the edges provide correction for near vision. Other types are made with the near-vision section in the center with the distance-vision area around it. Other lenses are made like bifocal glasses; the top portion corrects for distance vision and the bottom for near vision.

Monovision fitting--wearing a contact lens for distance on one eye and a lens for near vision on the other--is still popular. Like other bifocal options, even glasses, it requires getting used to.
