The Securities Act of 1933 . filing requirements for all mutual unds, including the filing of etailed registration slatements with he Securities and Exchange requires funds to regularly disclose detailed information about their pecarions to the SEC, state Further, this disclosure must be niform, providing the same information to all audiences. Under his act, funds also must provide prospectuses (upded current escribing each fund's management policies and other essential data. The act also approved but limited all mutual fund advertising. The Securities Exchange Act of 1934. This legislation regulates the purchase and sale of mutual
