BABY IS KILLED TOO

Fourteen Months Old Infant Crushed Under Its Mother When She Was Shot-Died Today

NACOGDOCHES, April 25,-A 4 year old girl today told officers of the tragedy wherein her parents and baby sister met death Friday night.

M. Baugh, 26, farmer, shot his wife down and then turned the gun on himself, with fatal affects after phoning officers to come to his house. Baugh and his wife were found dead.

The 14 months old infant was crushd under its mother and died today. "Papa shot mama and then shot nimself", the girl calmly told Deputy Sheriff Tom Lambert.
