Highly decorated, M. Sgt. Ellis received among his 19 medals the Purple Heart, Distinguished Service Medal and the French Croix de Guerre medals.

designate their ACR and CU for designate their ACR and CU for
Payment acreage before any haying or grazing occurs and sign a register indicating their intentions at the ASCS office. e grazed, harvested as may haylage, silage, or green chop, and
used by either the producer's own used by either the producer's own
livestock or livestock of another producer.
Producers may establish an approved cover later, for future laying and grazing, after haying or
grazing the originally approved cover.
To remain eligible for program enefits, participants who request emergency haying and grazing of CU for Payment acreage shall not: (1) remove cover to the extent that the land is not adequately protected from wind and water erosion; ( 2 )
harvest the approved cover for grain or seed; (3) permit haying or grazing of: wildlife food plots, wildlife habitat, alfalfa that irrigated or could be irrigated, ocally approved program crops or cover established with ACP funds until the growth is well established, mall grain crops allow standing.
Standing or harvested hay may grazing privileges may be rented or eased to anyone for any price.
