Three Pints Water Daily Essential to Body's Well Being

BY DR. HUGH S. CUMMING, Surgeon General, United States Public Health Service.

Good water is essential to life. Water comprises about 70 per cent of the body weight and is necessary to provide elasticity and suppleness to muscles, bones, cartilage and tendons, to moisten various parts of the body so that they may perform their functions, and to act as a solvent for food so that it may be absorbed.

Water also provides a fluid medium for the blood and lymph by which nutritive substances are taken to all parts of the body and waste products are removed.

Rain water that has not run down a roof is pure water, but it is rapid and distasteful because it does not contain certain mineral salts and other properties that makes for good drinking water. On the other hand, water that contains too much mineral salts may be otherwise pure and still be quite unfit for drinking.

Water dissolves substances, both gases and solids, and absorbs odors. Because of these properties and because water is usually taken into the body raw, it is one of the most potent carriers of harmful bacteria.

pleasant odor until that water has been examined by experts. Some of the most dangerous water is crystal clear.

The best way to protect yourself from infectious diseases carried by drinking water is to drink no water unless you know from where it comes and that the source is safe.

Do You Drink Enough Water?

Most people do not drink enough water. The average person should drink at least three pints of water a day.

Because you are not thirsty does not necessarily mean that you do not need more water. Six to eight glasses of water a day is about the right quantity for the normal adult.

To drink a glass of water before or soon after meals is a healthful habit.

Do not drink anything when you have food in your mouth.

If you take water or any other beverage into your mouth with food the tendency is to under-chew or over-eat because the food is washed down.

If you are in good health there is not much danger that you will drink too much water. A shallow well or dug well should be at least 200 yards away from a stable, out-house or barn. These structures are on a slope the well should be above them.

A trough for watering stock should be at least 40 feet away from the pump and an iron pipe should be used to convey the water from the pump to the trough.

It is important to have the casing water-tight so that no water enters the well except from the bottom.

Deep wells or artesian wells are less liable to pollution. The mineral "kick" through which the bottom of the well passes prevents the surface water near the well upon the well is pumped. **DR. T. H. MERRILL**

Water carries poisons and parasitic forms of animal and vegetable life (remembering that disease germs are mostly vegetable).

A change from kind of water used for drinking purposes to another often causes intestinal disorders.

Why Water Is "Hard" and "Soft."

You know that, generally speaking, water is considered to be either hard water or soft water.

So-called hard water derives its name from the fact that it contains too much calcium carbonate which is a mineral constituent. When hard water is boiled the hard crust or

ring formed about vessel is calcium carbonate.

Hard water is freed from most of its hardness by boiling and this process of boiling makes it suitable for drinking purposes.

Some hardness in water is also due to another constituent—magnesium sulphate. You can not remove magnesium sulphate by boiling. Water which contains quantities of magnesium sulphate can be made potable by adding carbonate of soda.

You should take great care to prevent drinking water from being contaminated with the germs of disease. Typhoid fever, diarrhea, dysentery,

cholera and certain other diseases may be acquired from contaminated water. Eggs of intestinal worms are often present in water and may develop within the body into full-sized worms.

Water may be of good color. It may have a pleasant taste and no odor and still be unfit to drink.

Not all water which gives off an unpleasant odor is impure. Sulphur present in water gives off an odor not usually pleasant.

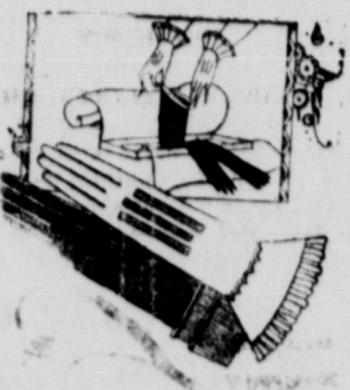
