The Friona Chieftain Band won the sweepstakes award in the University Interscholastic League contests, which were completed last week. Scott Houston is the band director.

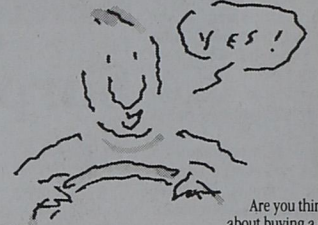
10 Yrs. Ago--Mar. 24, 1985

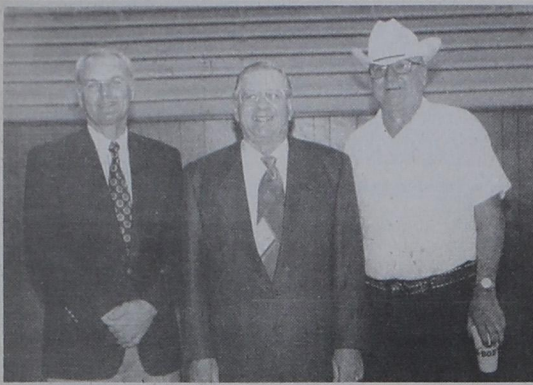
