will notice that $99 \%$ of the time the will notice that $99 \%$ of the time the county seat is located either (1)
close to the geographical center o with the largest popula ion in the county. However Parmer County is the exception to oth of these, with our county seat and courthouse being located diounty (which is also the wester border of Texas) in the town of
Farwell. Friona and Bovina are oth larger in population and both are closer to the geographical center are closer to the
Many newcomers to these parts seat is located in such an out-of-theway place. So for those of you who haven't heard our oldtimers tell
this story, here it is, more or less his story, here it is,
from the horse's mouth.

James D. Hamlin (1871-1950) was one of those "larger than life"
characters of the Old West. Historian and biographer William Curry Holden who was personally acquainted with Judge Hamlin said outlaws, gunmen and gamblers were among his cherished inti-
mates. Madams of the bordellos esmates. Madams of the bordellos es-
teemed his friendship and sought teemed his friendship and sought
his counsel, while lovely women of impeccable proprieties all but swooned in his presence and sighed audibly with his passing."
Hamlin served as county judge
of Parmer County, Texas during 12 of Parmer County, Texas during 12 of the county's most formative
years from 1912 to 1924. He was a trusted cohort of the Farwell family from Chicago and was the residen representative of the Capitol Syndicate which was in the process of selling off the old XIT ranchlands
into farms and townsites starting into farms and townsites starting
about 1905. The proceeds from the sale of these lands, which included all of Parmer County, went to build the present day state capitol building in Austin. Remember that fact when the Panhandle area is being treated like a forgotten orphan child
in the political doings of our state legislature.
In 1906, Hamlin was instrumen-
tal in laying out the townsite and tal in laying out the townsite and
selling lots in Farwell for the syndicate. A year or so prior to that he out the town of Texico, New Mexico which he referred to often as my townsite of Texico." His uncle J. M. Hamlin was involved in rairroad interests in the county, so
naturally he was crushed when he discovered that the Santa Fe Rairoad had decided not to establish a division point at Texico-Farwell, but instead elected to build the roundhouse, shops and Harvey House ten miles west at Clovis,
New Mexico. Parmerton was the railroad site
closest to the geographical center of this county. The townsite of Parmerton was laid out in 1907 and a petition signed by 150 of the county's residents appealed to Deal Smith County to release Parmer
County from its jurisdiction. The Parmerton site was then used as the county seat for a time and county business was conducted there. I don't know if this was before the first or second of the three county
seat election fights, but there is nothing at Parmerton now except a historical marker, which we owe to the efforts of former tax-assessor/collector Hugh Moseley. County Judge in 1912 was elected that his two-story office building courthouse until the hotly contested county seat fight in 1914, in which Farwell won by a narrow margin of two or three votes. Friona and Bovina, the ballots were confiscated and destroyed by the Farwell faction before a re-count could be made. The $\$ 50,000$ bond issue for the building of a
courthouse passed but no progress was made because three of the four sides with Friona and would not (Continued On Page 9)
