When Eyes Water
We depend on tears to lubricate and cleanse our eyes, but older people sometimes experience excessive tearing. For most of them, the condition may be mildly annoying, for others more serio depending on the amount of fluid produced and the reason for $i$. Optometric examination can determine whether the problem is excess tear production or poor tear drainage from the comer of the eye. At the same time, the optometrist will look for the basic cause for the
excess tearing. It might be anything from an eye infection, a foreign excess tearing. It might be anything from an eye infection, a cland, an
body in the eye, nasal or dental problems, a blocked tear gren uncorrected vision problem that causes continual eye strain, or even general health problem. Most often, the eye doctor can offer relief. If it is determined that excessive tearing in an older person is eye or health-related, both examination and treatment should be covered by Medicare.
