as active as we are. They wanted to know what our secret was," Patterson told us this past week. "I told this person that I guessed that we're still so active because Ona works hard, and I fish hard, "he
explained. To say that Patterson enjoys
hunting or fishing would be putting mildly. Very mildly. Jack came by to share a
photograph of himself photograph of himself and his 16 -month-old great grandson, Clay
Shamblin, who lives in Amarillo with his parents, Donny and Karri Shamblin.
In the picture, Jack is holding a 23 -inch brown trout that he swears was caught by the young great-
grandson. The fish is almost as big as the youngster.
This happened on Labor Day weekend on Clay's first fishing trip with Grand-dad Jack, to the San Juan River in northwestern New Mexico.
"I can't
"I can't believe I let the child get Patterson stated, with his trademark laugh.
Jack is one of those individuals
who plans to enjoy himself. Maybe who plans to enjoy himself, Maybe that is part of the reason that he's
still as active as he is, not having still as active as he is, not
slowed his pace to speak of. Jack was a driving force in the movement to stock Parmer County with pheasants, which gave local hunters, as well as hundreds of
others from as far away as Dallas and the Houston area, the chance to hunt this popular game bird every winter in the county.
Pheasant hunting became a
source of income frem source of income from tourist dollars for the two-week, thr
weekend season in December.

But something has happened to Patterson says he is at a loss to explain what it was. But one thing's for sure, he says: the birds weren't hurt by "overkill" by the
hunters. busload of hunters to come to the Rhea community from as far away as Austin. Before the group called it quits on that beautiful December
day, every member of the party had day, every member of the party had
a bird, and virtually everyone had shot their limit.
Then, a year or two later, Patterson said he noticed in the spring and summer that there was a good flock of pheasant hens, around
$20-30$, nesting out in his wheat 20-30, nesting out in his wheat
field. There were seven or eight pretty cock-pheasants, and this made him optimistic about a nice
crop of young pheasants, and a crop of young phea
good hunting season.
good hunting season.
"They always did well in the They always did well in the
wheat. They make their nests out in the field, and the skunks and other
predators can't find them," Patterson predators can
explained.
But by hunting season that year,
it was evident that not only had it was evident that not only had
there not been a good "hatch" of there not been a good "hatch" of
young birds, but that almost all of the grown birds he had watched the grown birds he had watched
earlier in the year also had died out. "I think they were hit by some kind of disease. And we just can't seem to get the bird population
back to where it was in 1982," he back to where it was in 1982," he
explains. "The game officials try to explains. "The game officials try to
say they don't have the cover and feed they need, but that isn't the case. I haven't changed my way of doing things, and they just don't make it," he said.

## 'Dirty 30s' Type Storm Hits Area

Oldtimers and longtime residents thought back to the dust storms of the 1930s in the local area on Thursday, when a gale-force windstorm swept a cloud of reddish dust across the area. The dust cloud was hundreds of feet high. It hit the city of Friona a few minutes before 5 p.m., about closing ime for some businesses.
Being after deadline, a complete damage report was not possible. It appeared that the city may have fared somewhat better than neighboring
Bovina, where the Allsup's store had steel beams on its roof raised about a foot. The store was closed, after some bricks were blown into the store, and shelf items were blown around.

At each shift change, officers have a brief meeting to pass along information from the previous shift

helping them learn a lifetime of good eating habits, it is well worth the effort". breakfast should Aclude a dairy product such as low-fat milk or yogurt, a grain such as a high-fiber bread or a cereal, a
protein such as peanut butter cheese, or a lean cut of meat, and fruit or 100 percent fruit juice.
"It's alright to occasionally serve sweetened cereals and convenience foods such as toaster wrozen, bntreakes,", she said. Parents should carefully read labels becaus many of these foods contain high levels of sugar, sodium, and fat.

Parents should also remember Children are more likely to eat breakfast if their parents eat breakfast, Montandon said.

A Tip For Measuring Mutual Fund Performances
If you'd like to evaluate your
mutual fund more carefully, but aren't sure what to look for, you should know about total return. Total return is one of the best
indicators of a mutual fund's performance. It includes income dividends, capital gains and changes in the value of a mutual fund's
share. Your total return will vary share. Your total return will vary
slightly according to whether you slightly according to whether you
take your dividends in cash or reinvest them.

Here's an example of total return assuming all dividends and \begin{tabular}{l}

Add the change in value to total dividends, and divide this sum by the beginning balance:
$\$ 558+\$ 1,674=\$ 2,232$
$\$ 2,231$ divided by $18,000=.124$ or 12.4 per cent total return. As you can see, taking
dividends in cash rather than dividends in cash rather than
reinvesting them and letting them compound will give you a slightly lower total return. The difference becomes larger over longer periods
of time.
You can find a mutual fund's total return in its annual report. The total return reported by the fund, however, may not agree with
your calculations. Mutual fund your calculations. Mutual func performance figures are based on
specific time periods. If you do not own the fund for the entire period covered by the annual report, your
total retum will be different. total retum will be different. Total return also is affected by additional investments and redeemed
shares. If you buy more shares or sell shares right after a majo increase or decrease in the fund's share value, your total return wil reflect this.
However, long-term investors should not be overly concerned
about short-term results. Over meaningful periods--five to ten years or more--your fund's total return figures are generally a good
measure of how well your measure of how wel
investment is progressing.

There are several ways to measure the performance of any mutual fund, but total return is the most widely accepted. No other
method simultaneously takes into method simultaneously takes into
account income, gains and changes in share value.
