laughed. In fact, they all spent the lunch hour laughing. Lesson Three: There is nothing better in life than childre laughing.
I kept 1 kept telling Zach to eat, like
do at home, then realized that he in this cafeteria every day without me. This wasn't my territory, was his. I left him alone after that. A large grown-up came aroun to tell us that it was time to go. We waiked to the trash cans, our trays with the food still on them, and she put the english peas down a really big garbage disposal.
