## TORY LYNN SNYDER Snyder's Condition Improving

At press time, his grandmother, Cora Snyder of Friona, reported that he was able to walk by himself and feed himself now. Doctors told the family that if his condition continues to improve at the current pace, he could possibly be released from the hospital in the near future.

Law enforcement officials from Parmer County visited with Snyder at the Amarillo hospital. Because of severe head injuries, he has been suffering some memory impairment.

He told officers that he could possibly identify his assailant but did not remember much about the incident. Officials planned to

**CITIZEN:** Service must be associated with a specific project or contribution to the community of Friona in the past calendar year.

**STUDENTS (boy and girl):** Display a leadership role in school activities but also in activities outside school. Contribution to school, community, church, etc. which is outstanding and makes Friona a better place in which to live.

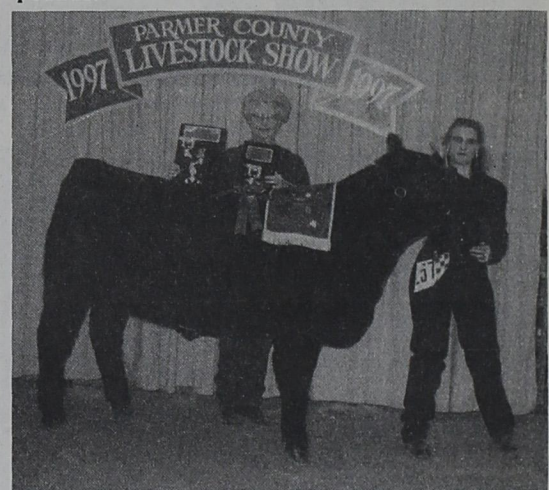

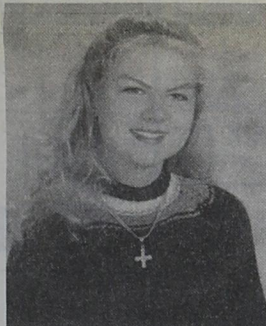
By working at West Friona Grain and attending high school, I am able to experience many responsibilities that will help me with future decisions. Also, I am learning how to better serve this community.

I grew up in Friona, married and moved away. I recall that the Friona Star has been serving your community almost as long as I can remember. Now, I find that I need to use your newspaper as a means to say, "Thank you" to some of your good citizens.

I am living now in the Farmington, N. M. area. During the Thanksgiving holidays, my wife, Tino, and I were visiting our daughter, Debbie Rector and her family in Friona.

In the middle of the night on Saturday I suddenly became violently ill with what proved to be my first heart attack.

It was bitter cold, snow on the ground and roads were hazardous to travel.

Debbie called 911 and then her good friend, Dana Hendrix who lived just across the street from where I was. Ms. Hendrix is a member of your 911 EMS crew, so she ran immediately across the street and met the other team members with the ambulance and police who arrived in just minutes.

Rapidly and skillfully they began the medical procedures while I was transported to your hospital emergency room.

Dr. Alexander and the night nursing staff were right there doing their jobs and stabilized my condition enough to transport me to High Plains Baptist-St. Anthony Hospital.

That EMS crew risked their own lives that night on some roads that were solid ice just to take care of me. When we tried to thank them they said, "We were just doing our job" but we felt and saw their concern for us and our other family members needs individually, as well, during our emergency situation.

That special attitude of compassion is beyond what their regular job skills require. We were comforted, knowing we were in "good hands" the whole time.

I realize you folk in Friona and Parmer County have to "dig down deep" in order to keep your hospital open and so well staffed and equipped.

And the EMS vehicle and services are a large investment for your community. Perhaps I am alive today because you made that investment.

I sincerely thank each one who responded to our emergency call for help. You never know when you might be the ones making a 911 call, but let me tell you from my experience, you can depend on them to respond rapidly and skillfully to meet your need. You can trust them.

At our house we consider Dr. A-the hospital staff and EMS team to be "The Good Hands People".

Also, to our families and friends and the Friona community we appreciate you. We feel truly blessed. We are recovering nicely.

Thank you Friona Star for getting our message out to the good Friona people.

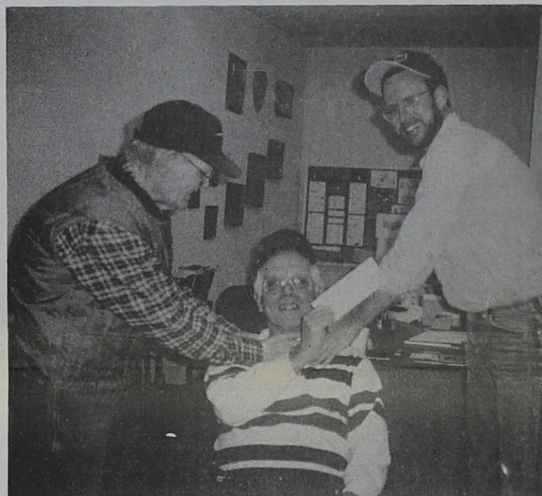
## 5 Yrs Ago-Jan. 25, 1992

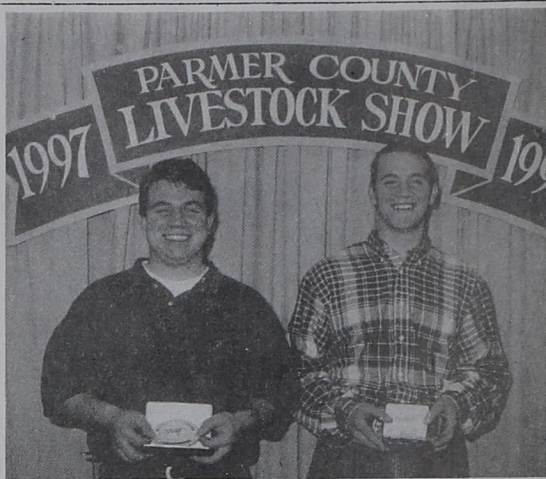

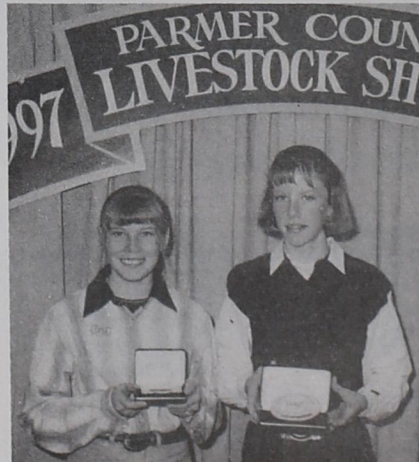

It was my responsibility to grade the weekly Friona Business Football Contest, determine the weekly winners, and keep tabs of total points to declare our overall contest winner.

Since the top prize was \$100 to the contestant who accumulated the most total points during the 13-week contest, accuracy was a required trait. Too bad.

At the end of the 13-weeks after a very close back and forth race between several loyal players, I declared veteran contestant Jack Clark of Friona as the \$100 winner.

Furthermore, I declared he had become the first three-time winner in football contest history. Jack not only plays every year (and has for over 30 years), he looks forward to it and he is good at it.

There is a bigger lesson here though. Jack could have kept the \$100 and maybe no one would have ever been the wiser. But honor intervened.

Winning fair and square still is an important goal, in a silly little football contest and in life too.

Jack feels better. Mark Neill sure does. Mr. Amstutz and Ms. Carthel probably have a better sense of satisfaction at least knowing they tied for the win.

I think I feel better too now that I have sorted this deal out. I'll let you know later. When I'm not so busy.

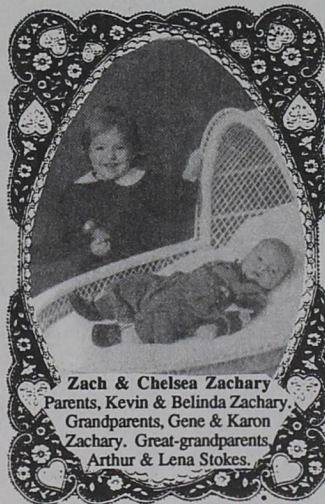

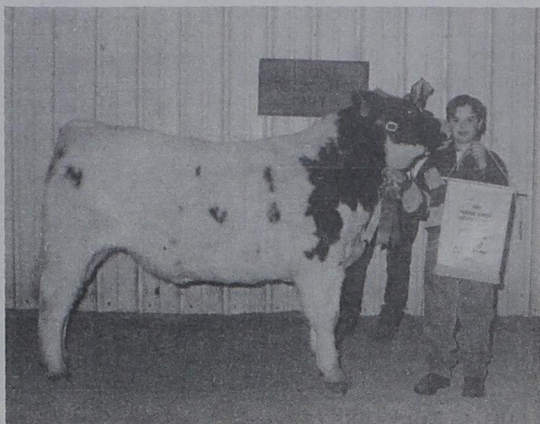

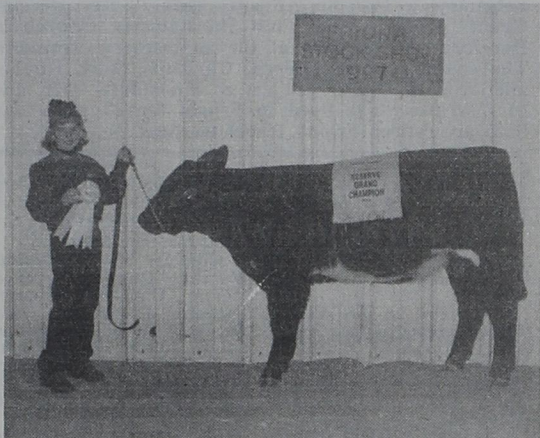

**Anti-Glare  
Coatings**

To cut the glare that often interferes with vision, many eyeglass wearers have discovered the advantages of anti-reflective coatings for their lenses.

This kind of coating can almost completely avoid the starburst effect created by coating headlights on the road at night, and limit the glare from other kinds of lighting as well. It can eliminate the annoyance of seeing your own eye or eyelashes in your glasses, or seeing double when looking at a bright light. At the same time, the anti-glare coating does away with the light that reflects off your own eyeglasses, so that viewers are able to see your eyes, too.

On the downside--and it is minimal--that coating seems to make the glasses smudge up more than others do, so that it's a little more difficult to keep lenses clean. In the works is a Teflon coating that goes over the anti-glare coating to eliminate the problem.
