In the earliest stages, a cataract does not interfere with vision, and it's only during a routine examination that it's discovered. With time
though, vision gets hazy. The glare of bright light may make i worse. Sunglasses may be helpful, especially the newer glare-control lenses that filter out blue light. Some are self-darkening photochromatic lenses, available plain or ground to your prescription. Check color vision before wearing them for driving. The good news is that cataracts respond well to surgery that has been made easier and less complicated in recent years. After the cloudy Glasses may still be needed to fine-tune vision for distance and nearvision tasks.
