Texas Alcohol Awareness Program For Minors Amended BY RON CARR

back. To parents of teenagers it could be an incon venient, expensive thought.
Parents, all adults, and

stricter amended laws concerning the possession or purchase of alcohol by minors, according to Police Chie
Randy Geries and Municipal Judge Eddie Mays.
The entire analysis of changes to the alcoholic bev erage code adopted by the
75 th Legislative Session covers some six pages.
Both Chief Geries and Judge Mays emphasized tha a renewed and stricter en-
forcement of the laws erning minors and alcohol is effect in Friona.
