CAPTURED CAPITAL

After Stubborn Resistance on the Part of Chinese.

But Remarkably Successful Marching on the Afternoon of the 14th, and Next Day Take Possession.

Washington, Aug 19 .- The allied armies have captured and entered Pekin in the face of obstinate resistance, and the members of the foreign legation are safe. Official information of the fall of the Chinese capital came to the United States government Friday night in the shape of two cablegrams, one from Admiral Remey and the other from Consul Fowler at Chee Foo. Admiral Remey's dispatch is as fol-

Shanghai, Aug. 18.—Li Hung Chang has received a telegraphic dispatch announcing that the allied forces had entered Pekin Wednesday, Aug. 15, without opposition.

May be Disqualified.

Chicago, Ill., Aug. 18.-A special to the Record from Lincoln says:

A sensation has been caused by the discovery that Wharton Barker, middle-of-the-road candidate for president on the Populist ticket, is ineligible for the office to which he aspires. It is said that while superintending some improvements in Russia some years ago Mr. Barker was made Lord of St. Wenchelas by the czar. Before accepting the title he did not ask congress to grant him the privilege, and he is therefore said to be ineligible, because he forfeited his citizenship by accepting the honor without permission of the United States authorities. If this proves true, Mr. Barker must step down and out. Ignatius Donnelly would succeed him as candidate for president, some one else being chosen as candidate for vice-president.

Ingalls Dead.

Las Vegas, N. M., Aug. 18 .-Former United States Senator John J. Ingalls died at East Las Vegas, N. M., at 2:25 a. m. Thursday, surrounded by his wife and two sons, Ellsworth and Sheffield. The funeral will be held in Atchison, Kan.

Senator Ingalls' illness dates from March, 1899, when at Washington his throat began troubling him. He was treated by several specialists without relief, and on their advice returned with his family to Atchison.

The remains of Senator Ingalls were started for Atchison, Kan., his late home, Thursday afternoon, accompanied by Mrs. Ingalls and her youngest son, Sheffield.

Senator Ingalls leaves a widow and six children.

No Information in Washington.

Washington, Aug. 18 .- At the close of the cabinet meeting yesterday the statement was made that excepting a message from Consul Fow ler at Che Foo dated the 17th, in which no mention was made of the reported arrival of the allies at Pekin, not a word had been received from China from official sources. Since the meeting Wednesday the president and members of the cabinet have been anxiously awaiting intelligence of occurrences which must have taken place during the last four or five days and the fact that none have reached here is regarded as conclusive that the army has passed on from Tung Chow to Pekin.
