

Dumpster etiquette 101.....!

It does not take a college degree or even a high school education to understand dumpster etiquette. If you took a class in dumpster etiquette the entire lesson would go like this: "The trash goes in it, not beside it. Here's your diploma."

Walk out to the big blue container, raise the lid, insert your trash, close the lid. Some people have trouble with that last part. If the lid is closed it keeps many small rodents and felines out of the dumpster, not to mention filling up with rainwater, or keeping trash from blowing across the neighborhood.

Here is the absolute law of dumpster etiquette: items that you put on the ground beside the dumpster will never get picked up.


If you have big trash such as old refrigerators, shabby couches, used PVC pipe, or small aircraft engines, the city has a place called "the roll off box" for those. Call city hall. The roll off box dumping costs a little but it is a nice convenience. If you put big trash beside the dumpster it will just get uglier and never go away.

The trash truck drivers who come down your alley to empty your dumpster will not get out of the truck even if their pants are on fire. Stuff you put beside the dumpster, instead of in the dumpster, will remain there for eternity.
