Some add a dash of garlic juice or Worcestershire, some add
green onion or use hot sauce instead of cayenne, but that is as far as any sensible person will go, Relish says. They suggest you spread it thickly, or trim off the crusts and cut into triangles, or to warm up a cool day brush the bread with butter and grill it.

1 tablespoon grated shallot or yellow onion

mayonnaise until mixture is creamy and very smoth 2. Knead just enough to mix well: it should still have plenty of texture. Add remaining mayonnaise, if neces-sary-just enough to make it spreadable 3. Let stand 30 minutes.
