Filing period open for county elections, Heald, Powell will not seek re-election

The filing period for candidates in next year's county election is December 3 through January 4. Primary elections will be held in March and the general election will be in November. Elected officials will take office January 1, 2011.

County Judge Bonnie Heald and Precinct 4 County Commissioner Elvis Powell have announced they will not seek re-election.

According to a report in the Farwell Stateline Tribune, incumbents seeking re-election will be: District Judge Gordon Green, District Clerk Sandra Warren, County Treasurer Altha Herington, County Clerk Colleen Stover, and Precinct 2 County Commissioner James Clayton.

Also seeking re-election will be the three Justices of the Peace: Trey Ellis Pct 1, Sandra Clayton Pct 2, and Pam Haseloff Pct 3. Judge Green files as a Democrat. All other incumbents are Republican.

Anyone interested in running for one of the offices must first choose a party then contact either Republican county chairman Floyd Reeve of Friona or Democratic county chairman Robert White of Farwell regarding filing procedures. Filing fees are \$375 for Justice of the Peace, \$1500 for District Judge, and \$750 for all other county offices. Candidates can also file by petition which requires a minimum of 50 registered voter signatures.

The thought of an angel bringing heavenly correspondence is unimaginable, but as vember 21, at Ellis Funeral of ESA Sorority in you read over this passage it is amazing that the focus of the conversation is not Mary, but God's Son, and how God is going to use unlikely and miraculous means to fulfill His plans. In fact, the Bible lacks an abundance of personal details, descriptions and characterizations of Mary, but it is full of truth regarding the Son of God, whom she would bear. Of Jesus, Gabriel says, "He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest, and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever and of His kingdom there will be no end." There is no question as to who this child will be. He is the Messiah, Son of God, fulfiller of the Davidic Covenant, King of Kings, Lord of Lords and the one whose kingdom has no end. That is quite a description of an unborn baby!

One of the greatest dangers in this story is to focus on Mary more than Jesus. Regarding Mary we know she is chaste, engaged to be married, pleasing in God's eyes, miraculously pregnant and obedient to God's plans for her life. Gabriel's divine message delivery involves Mary no doubt, but the attention is on God's wonderful work in bringing Jesus Christ into the world. Christmas is a story of a divine delivery brought about by God, as well as a call to worship the King placed in a manger. This Christmas who or what will you choose to worship?
