## PMC offering Tai Chi and fall prevention classes

If falling and stress reduction is a concern you face you may want to consider one of the two new classes being offered by the Rehabilitation Department of Parmer Medical Center.

"Fall Prevention" is a two session course that will

provide information on balance and safety in your environment. Participants will learn fall prevention, how to fall if a fall is inevitable, and what to do once you fall.

Attendees will learn exercises to improve strength, flexibility, and

balance as well as changes to reduce fall risks at home. Classes will be held on Tuesdays, September 28 and October 5 from 9:30-11:30 a.m.

The other course offered is "Tai Chi". According to the website of the Mayo Clinic, Tai Chi is some-

times described as "meditation in motion" because it promotes serenity through gentle movement—connecting the mind and body. Although originally developed in ancient China for self defense, Tai Chi evolved into a graceful form of exercise that is

now used for stress reduction and for improving balance and sleep quality.

Anyone can practice Tai Chi regardless of age or physical ability. It emphasizes technique over strength and is low impact. It may be especially suitable if you're an older adult who otherwise

may not exercise. Tai Chi classes start September 28 and will be offered twice a week on Tuesdays and Fridays at noon.

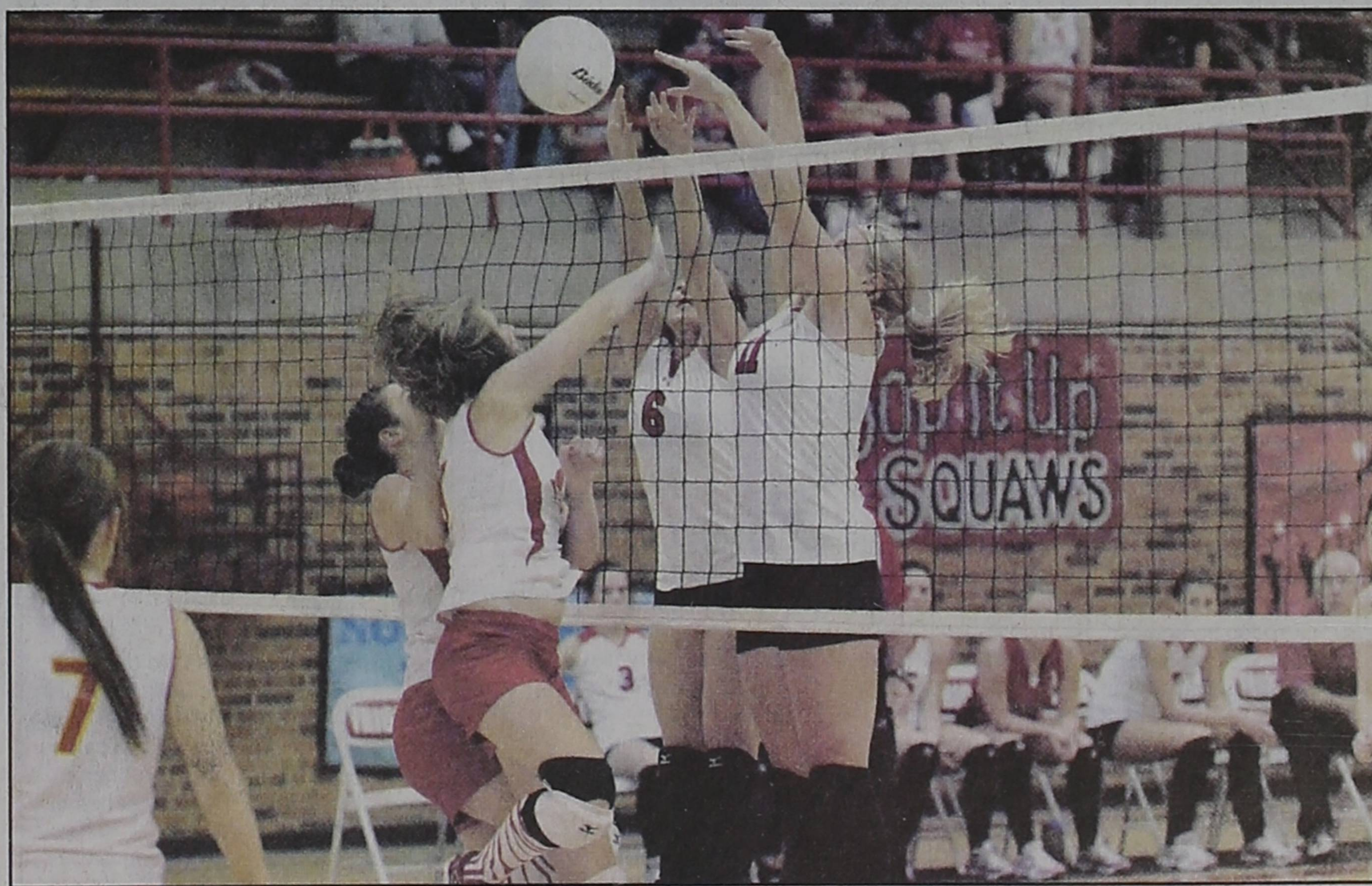

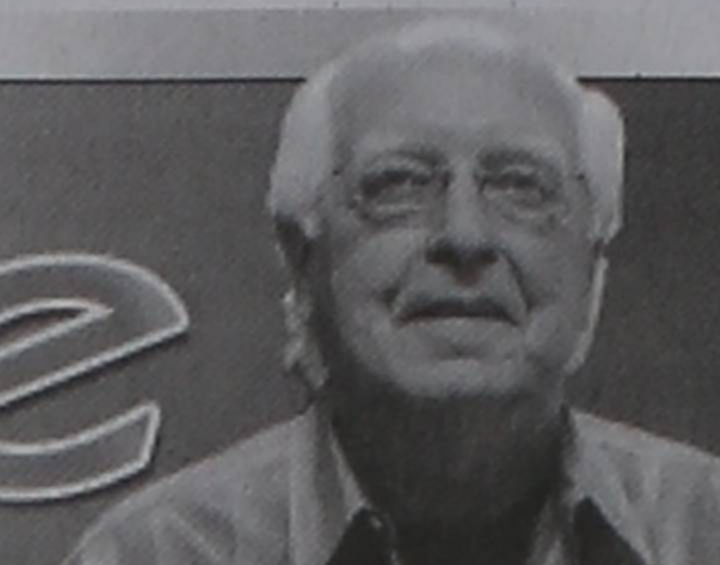

## a small civics lesson

The Texas Municipal League.

Those in city government around Texas call it TML. It is an organization made up of cities large and small. Friona is a member of the TML. The TML is a reference group to assist cities with the complex issues of running and managing a city.

Friona is a municipality, with its own government, municipal court, law enforcement, etc. The folks who run Friona's business are the city manager, mayor, and city council.

At a recent city council meeting, City Manager Patricia Phipps told the council that the State of Texas receives \$82 out of every traffic ticket written by the Friona Police Department. I was surprised and after the meeting asked Ms. Phipps if I had understood her correctly. She gave me a copy of a TML document titled Reverse Intergovernmental Aid: How Financial Assis-

tance Is Practiced In Texas.

The document was a small lesson in civics. The first sentence says, "The State of Texas, unlike most all other states, provides virtually no financial assistance to its cities". State aid to cities is practically non-existent in Texas. I did not know that. Give me a failing grade on the civics test.

I'll try to keep this simple but it is worth knowing.

The city sales taxes collected here are sent to the state who then sends them back to us after taking their 2% fee.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) imposes more than 40 fees on cities, most related to water quality. The TCEQ is said to get 88% of their revenue from fees collected from cities. They are the bunch who test our water and our sewer treatment plant.

Cities in Texas pitch in more than \$90 mil-

lion per year in cash and right-of-way donations to fund TxDOT projects. In most states the state government makes grants to cities to help build and maintain city streets. In Texas, city governments transfer municipal revenue to the state to help pay for the state highway system.

Finally, our municipal court collects funds for the state on a variety of state programs, such as the Criminal Justice Planning Fund and the Crime Victims' Compensation Fund. In most cases the fees are imposed on persons convicted of any criminal offense, such as that traffic ticket you were issued by the Friona PD. On a typical traffic offense conviction, the defendant must currently pay \$82 in state-imposed fees before the city fine is collected.

These are just four main examples of fees that cities pay the state. There are others.

The state controls the level of municipal sales tax but cities certainly don't control the level of state fees on municipal fines. The annual total cities pay the state is at least \$198,000,000 just from these four sources of reverse intergovernmental aid.

Why is this revenue transfers from cities to the state important? Because, according to the TML, it results in either reductions in municipal services or increased local fees and taxes, such as the property tax which is the only general purpose city tax our city council can raise or lower. It does not seem like a fair system for the city.

So the next time you get a traffic ticket and go see Judge Campbell be nice. Remember it is not her fault your fine is so high. The first \$82 goes to the state. This has been a small civics lesson.

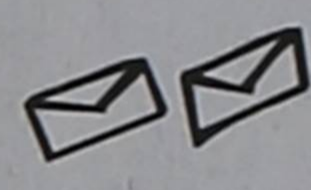


I am saddened to hear about Jessica Izaguirre but do have to admit there is a problem in Friona with too many loose dogs.

## Many mini biscuits

So we are back to the Church Supper Cookbook. When you cook for a church gathering it is usually a large dish. This recipe, submitted by Elaine Whiting of Salt Lake City, Utah, seems almost too simple. She said, "I tasted biscuits like these at a seafood restaurant and really liked them. I experimented in my kitchen until I was able to get the same flavor in these fast little bites."

I counted six ingredients and not much work it seems. Could it be a knock-off of those great cheese biscuits at Red Lobster? The recipe says 'serve warm' so guess you will have to cook them and hurry to the church. Or stick them in the church oven during the final hymn. Either way, enjoy!

## Mini Italian Biscuits

Yield: about 3 dozen

- 2 cups biscuit/baking mix
- 1/2 cup finely shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/2 tsp garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp dried oregano
- 1/2 tsp dried basil
- 2/3 cup milk

In a large bowl combine biscuit mix, cheese, garlic powder, oregano, and basil. Stir in enough milk just until moistened.

Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls onto a lightly greased baking sheet. Bake at 450 for 7-8 minutes or until golden brown. Serve warm.

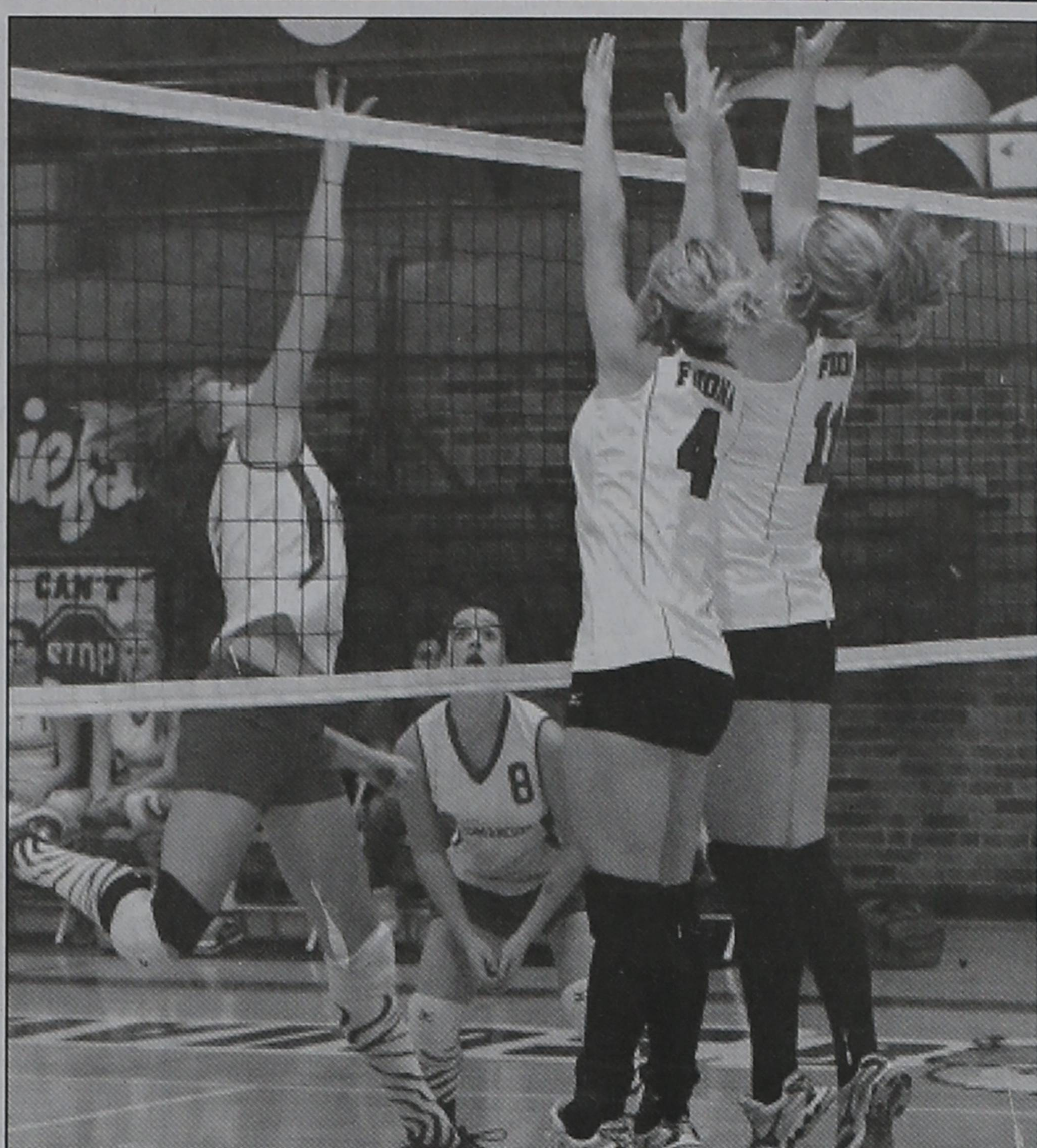

Laci Austin (8) goes up for a kill while Regan Anthony (4), Kalley Preston (1), and Megan Sharrock (6), look on.



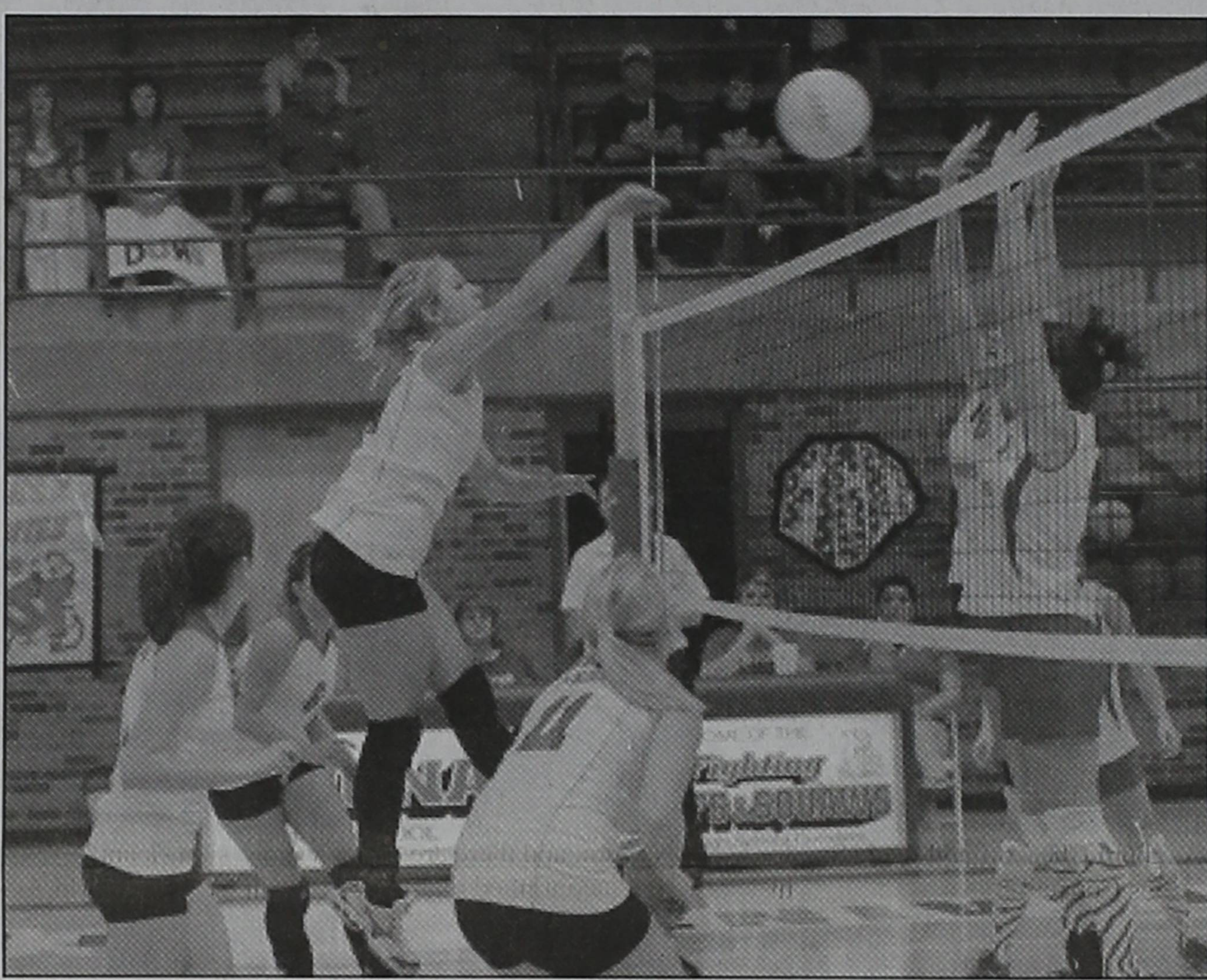

In Luke, after The Prodigal Son parable, one finds the parable of 'The Sneaky Manager'. It is the most confusing of Jesus' parables, so much so, that clergy avoid it, let someone else supply the sermon for this lectionary, or simply take a week's vacation.

I'll trust that you read it, but the summary is this: The one who is sneaky in the parable, even he, becomes blessed. The basic story revolves around an owner and a manager. The manager misappropriates funds. When he is caught, the owner sacks him, but before the day is over, behind the owner's back, the manager forgives the owner's creditors up to fifty percent, so that the owner is seen by the public as a very forgiving person, one who is nice and loving.

The owner finds out, and the manager is not sacked after all. He's forgiven. In the 1st century, honor was more valuable than money. Is it the same in the 21st century?

The only way I know to explain this parable is with a joke. There were three brothers. The oldest brother died. He was the most scandalous, sneaky, and mean person in the city. The deceased brother's brothers came to the reverend and offered him ten-thousand dollars if he would, at the funeral, say to the congregation, "This person who has died, is a saint!"

Well, this reverend was wise - yes, there was one, once, somewhere, sometime. At the funeral, he told the congregation, to the wide eyes of those and the two brothers seated on the front row, that the deceased was the sneakiest, meanest, most scandalous person he had ever met, "but comparing him to his two brothers, this person who has died, is a saint!"

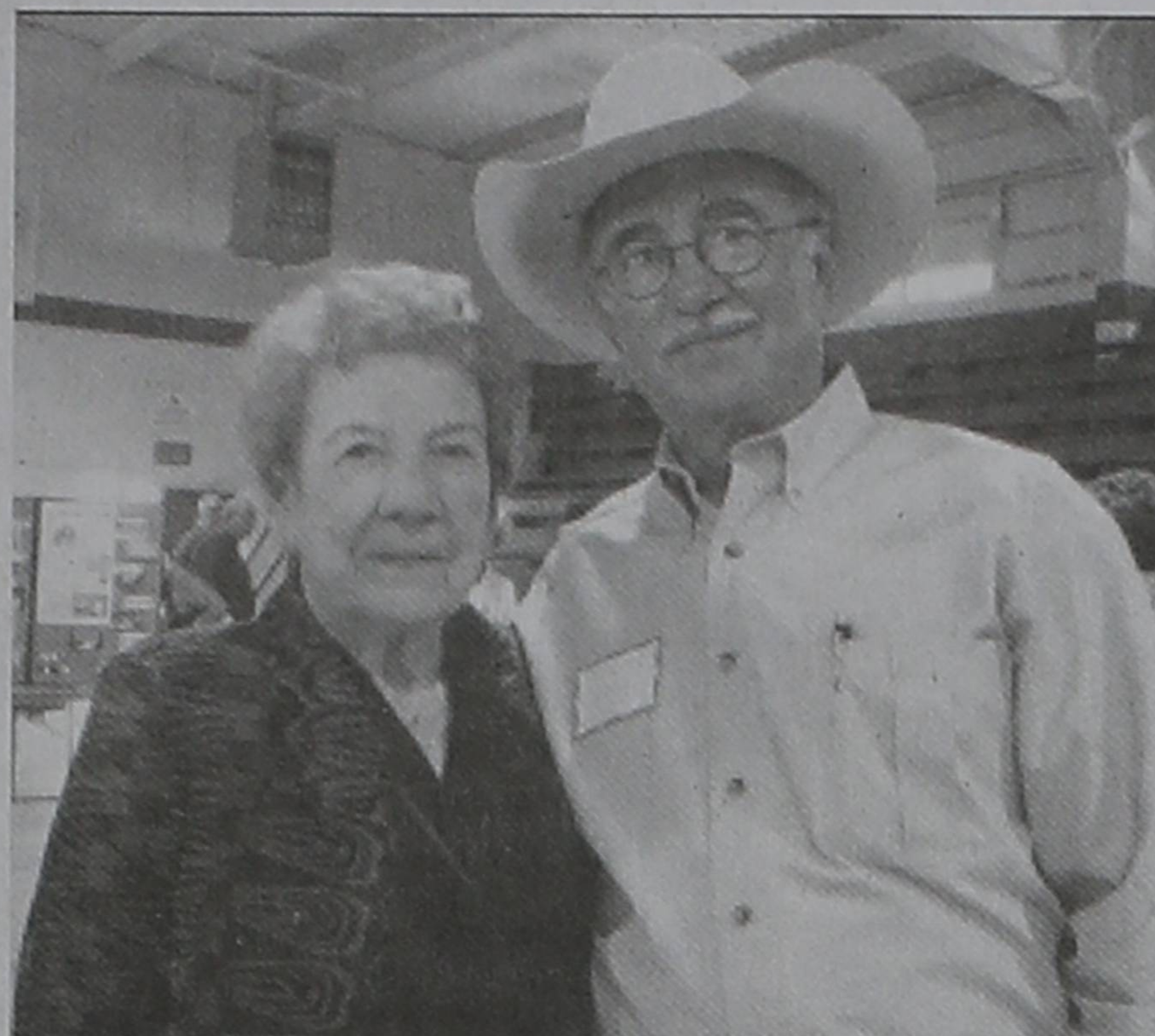

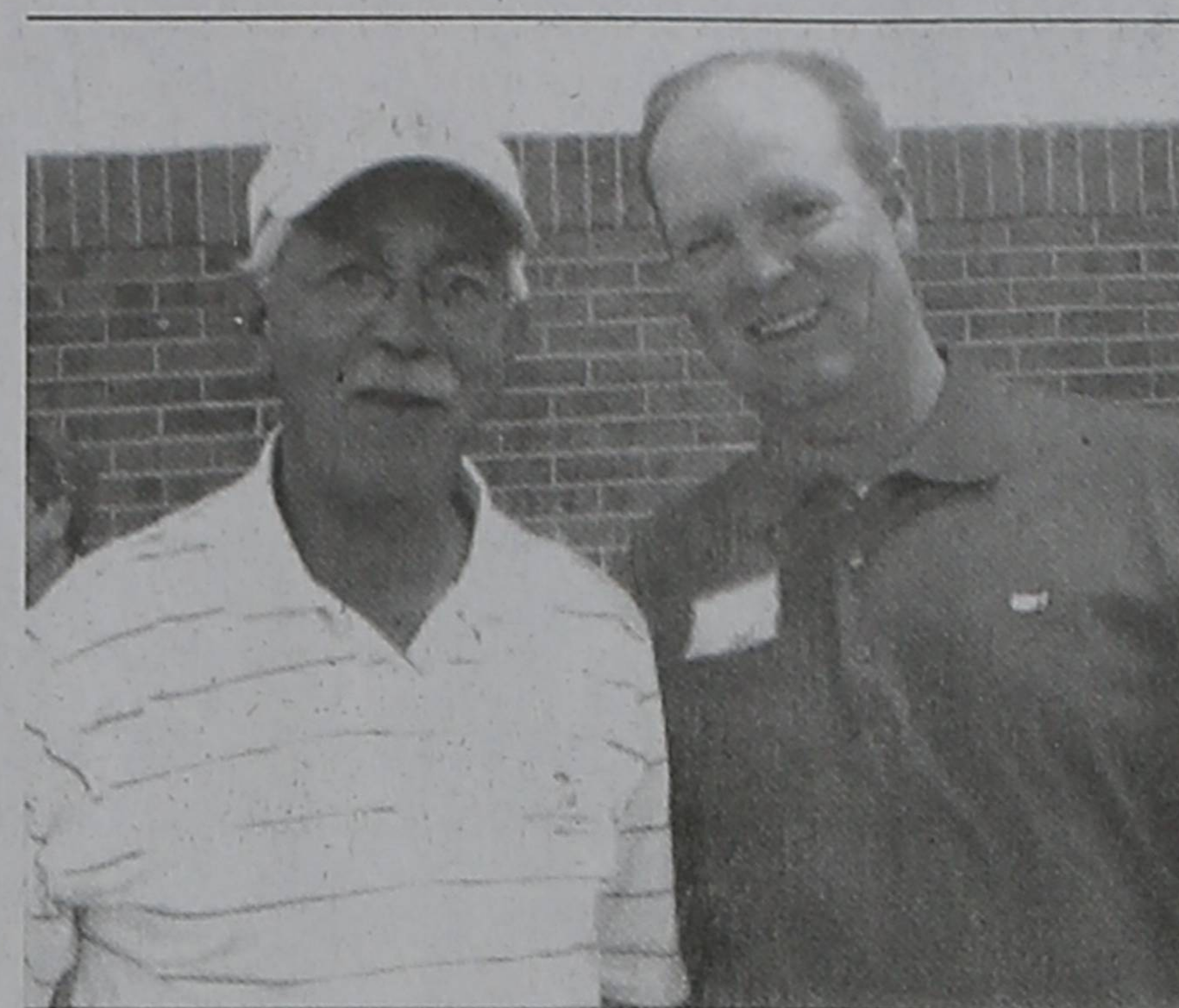

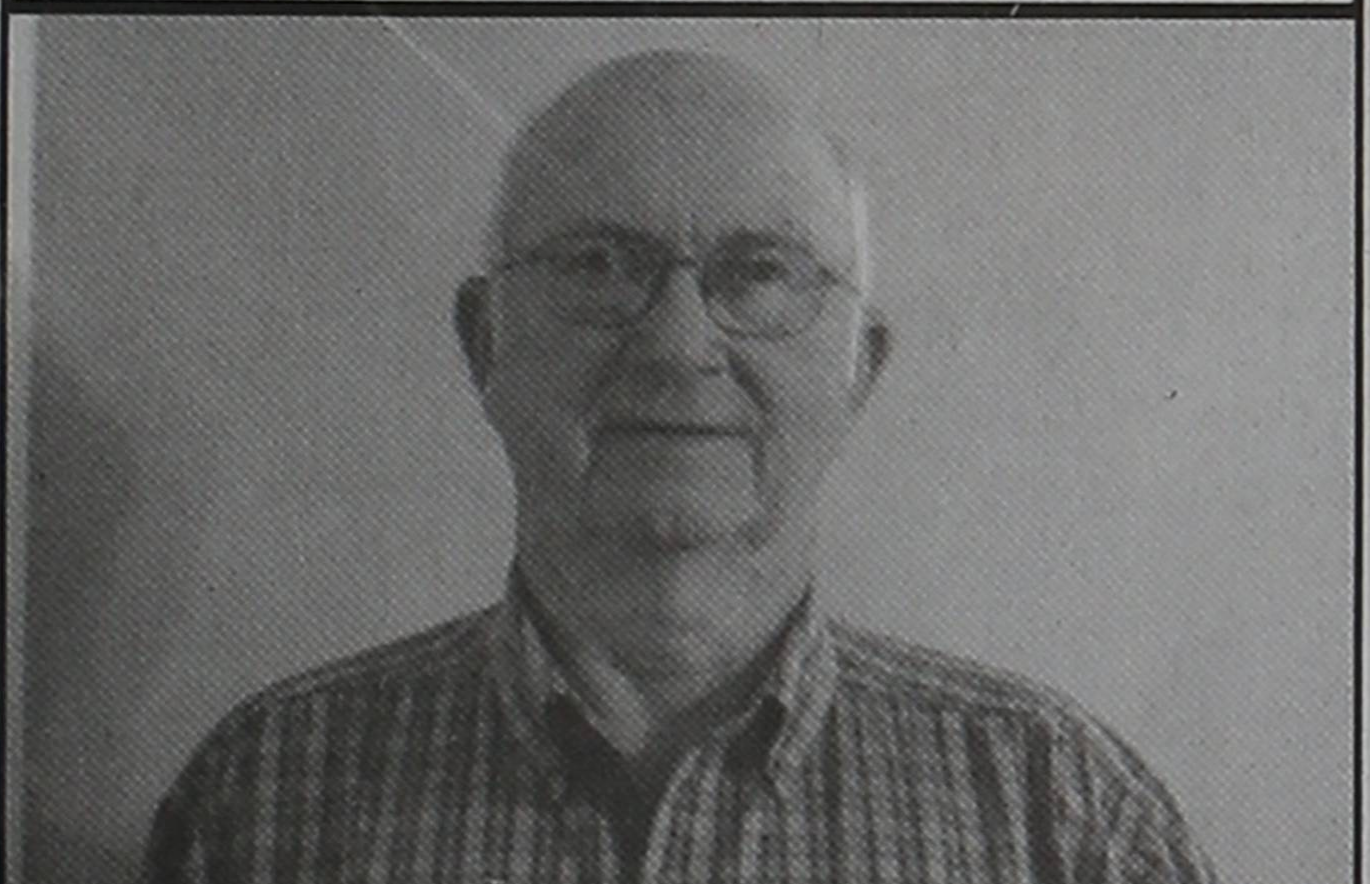
