It is hard to imagine that the people of State Senate District 31 could have better representation in Austin than Senator Seliger, and I thank you for electing him to do just that.



Monthly sales tax received

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said that state sales tax revenue in April was \$1.87 billion, up 11.4 percent compared to April 2010.

"This is the 13th straight month in which state sales tax revenue has increased," Combs said. "Business spending in sectors such as the oil and gas industry helped boost sales tax collections. Tax revenue from retail spending also showed growth."

The sales tax allocations to local governments represent March sales reported by monthly tax filers and January, February and March sales reported by quarterly tax filers.

Parmer County's May 2011 payment totaled \$59,878.52 broken down as Bovina \$11,153.11; Farwell \$9,167.46; and Friona \$39,557.95. In May 2010 the tax payment total was \$55,297.89. Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 8.28%, broken down as Bovina 4.86%; Farwell 10.05%; and Friona 8.87%. For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$236,261.15 as compared to







If mirrors could talk, a bathroom mirror would have the most to say. It could tell...well too much. Marriage proposals have been practiced in front of them. Concerts using hairbrushes have been performed with them as the only audience. Bathroom mirrors are the keepers of many secrets, thankfully. There is little that escapes the bathroom mirror.

A mirror does one thing- reflects exactly what is in front of it. We need a mirror we can trust and that one is usually found in the bathroom above the sink, not far from the other necessities of that particular room.

God likes mirrors too! Jesus was a reflection of what was in front of Him, which was God. I realize Jesus was more than just a reflection, but just follow this thought a moment. Jesus walked around reflecting the Father. He showed God's love. He showed God's compassion for the sick, blind, lame, even the healthy sinner, Jesus offered grace.

He did not consider becoming the identity of God, just merely the reflection of it. (cf. Phil 2:5ff) If I am a mirror, spiritually speaking, what am I reflecting? The answer is simple, whatever is in front of me.

The Hebrew writer said, "fix your eyes on Jesus..." What happens if you reflect Jesus? You reflect God. So when you go into your bathroom, shut the door, turn on the light and look into the old friend on the wall, the one who knows you best, answer this question: What do you see. Look closely, is God staring back at you from the bathroom mirror?
