Council to discuss continuing the juvenile curfew ordinance

The Friona city council will meet in regular session Monday July 11 at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers at 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

Item 4 on the agenda is a public hearing to receive public comments regarding renewal of the juvenile curfew ordinance. Item 7 will call for council consideration to take action to continue, abolish, or modify

the city's juvenile curfew ordinance.

In other business the council will hear a request from Bi-Wize Pharmacy to hold a sidewalk sale on Saturday July 16, consider an update on and implementation of the drought contingency plan, and authorize the city manager to solicit and accept bids for the sale of a 1987 Case backhoe.

The council will discuss and take action on the 3rd

quarter financial statement ended June 30, 2011, and approval of the accounts payable. The final item on the tentative agenda will be an executive session (public excluded) during which the council will conduct the annual evaluation of the city manager including discus-

sion regarding employment status of municipal court judge, including salary, benefits, discipline, termination, promotion, and/or reclassification as authorized by Texas Government Code.

At the conclusion of the executive session, the council will return to regular session

and consider action, if any, on items discussed during executive session. The council agenda items included here are a tentative agenda and subject to change. The final and official agenda is posted on the front window at city hall 72 hours prior to the meeting.

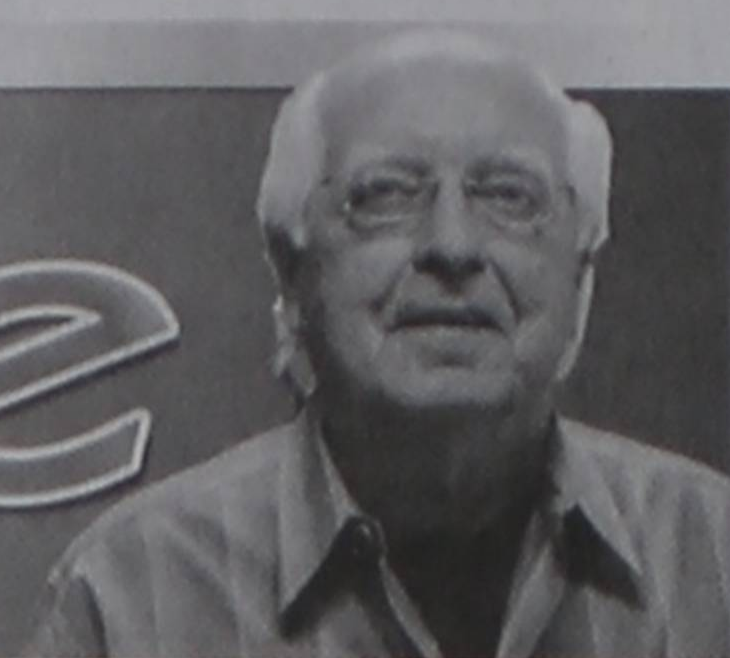

bella vita no more

Wow! Dang. Are you serious? Holy crap!

Those are just a few of the comments floating around the electronic universe after the Casey Anthony not guilty verdict. Another OJ verdict said one. God will give her the right judgment said another. (Not sure what that will be. I'm sure Miss Anthony was praying for a not guilty verdict so guess God answered her prayers.)

All along analysts said her attorney Jose Baez did not have enough experience to try a murder case. Guess he did though. Like it or not he is the "winning" attorney and I imagine his stock just went up. The same pundits who said he was not experienced enough will now be telling us what a brilliant job he did.

She can't talk to the media. They will ask over and over what happened to Caylee. "If you didn't kill her, who did?" "Why didn't you report her missing?" and so on through the many unanswered questions. In his opening arguments Jose Baez said Caylee drowned. 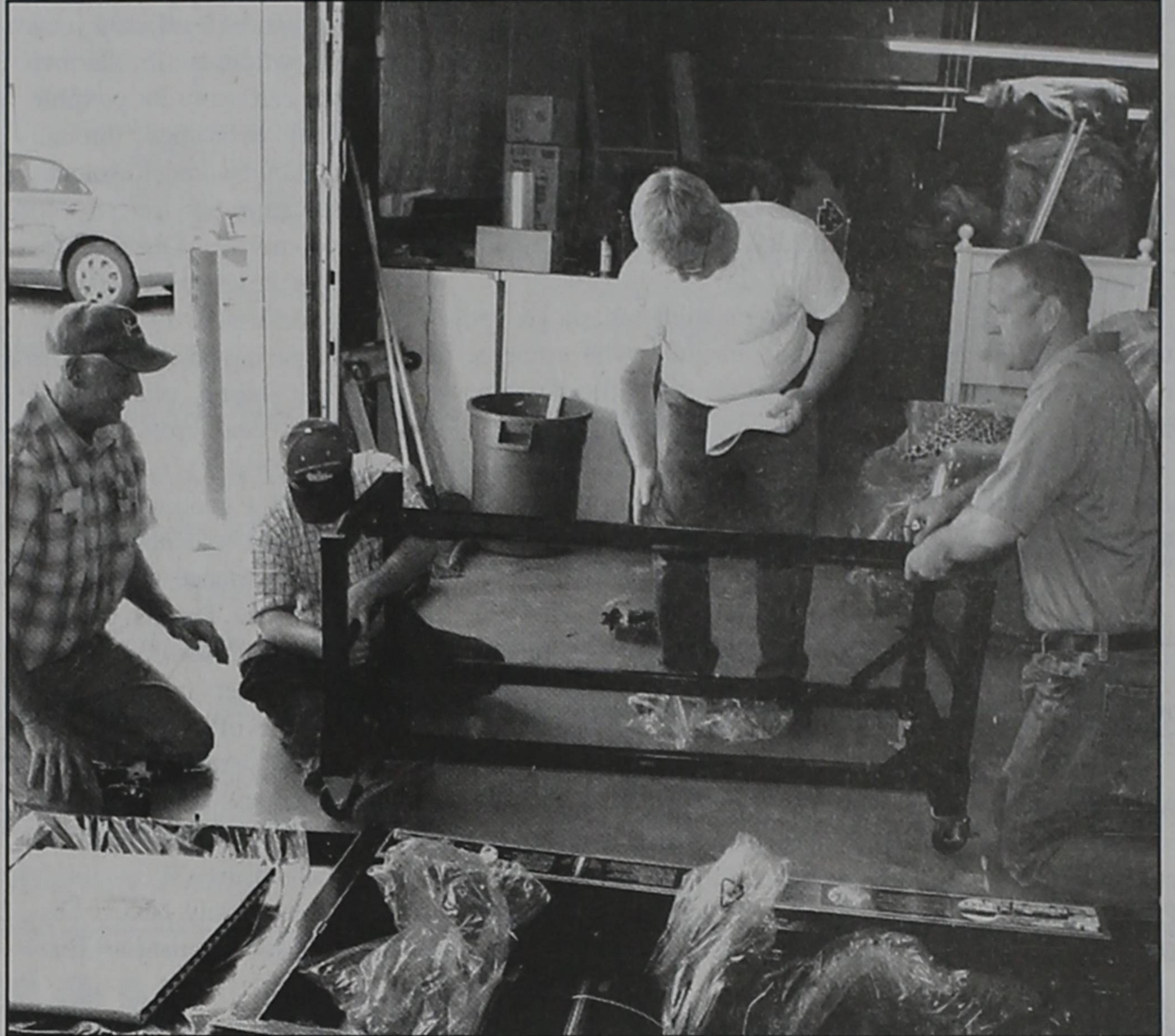
program 15 years ago. Allison Johnston and Joy Morton were his directors back then and are still directing. Will be a nice trip down memory lane for him.

Wild horse and burro adoption in Clovis

The U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will hold a wild horse and burro adoption in Clovis, N.M., July 14-16, 2011. The three-day event at the Curry County Events Center will feature over 50 spectacular animals. These are adult and yearling horses and burros that once roamed free on public lands in the West. The BLM periodically removes excess animals from the range in order to maintain healthy herds and to protect other rangeland resources. The adoption program is essential for achieving these important management goals.

Adoption begins with a competitive bid Thursday, July 14, at 2 p.m. First-come-first-served adoptions follow until 6 p.m., then again Friday, July 15, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturday, July 16, from 8 a.m. to noon.

Application approval is required and can be done on site. To qualify to adopt, one must be at least 18 years old with no record of animal abuse. Adopters must have a minimum of

400 square feet of corral space per animal, with free access to food, water and shelter. A six-foot corral fence is required for adult horses and five feet for yearlings. All animals must be loaded in covered stock-type trailers with swing gates and sturdy walls and floors. BLM staff will be on hand to assist with the short application process, answer any questions and load horses.

The standard adoption fee is \$125, as set by law. Bidding will start at that amount.

BLM pays a one-time \$500 care-and-feeding allowance to adopters of horses at least four years old. The allowance is paid in full after one year when adopters receive official ownership title for their horse(s). All standard adoption conditions and fees apply. A limited number of eligible horses will be available at Canutillo. Younger horses, burros and trained animals are not eligible for this incentive.

APPLICATION Cargill Meat Solutions Corporation, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for issuance of Air Quality Permit Number 95666, which would authorize the operations of the meat processing facility located at 1530 West U.S. Highway 60, Friona, Parmer County, Texas 79035. The facility will emit the following contaminants: organic compounds, nitrogen oxides, sulfur dioxide, carbon monoxide, hydrogen sulfide and particulate matter including particulate matter with diameters of 10 microns or less and 2.5 microns or less.

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on April 11, 2011. The application will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, the TCEQ Amarillo regional office, and the Friona City Hall, 623 Main Street, Friona, Parmer County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review in the Amarillo regional office of the TCEQ.

The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application.

PUBLIC COMMENT/PUBLIC MEETING You may submit public comments, a request for a public meeting, or request a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments is 30 days after newspaper notice is published.

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

If only comments are received on the application, the response to comments, along with notice of the executive director's action on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application.

The executive director will complete the technical review, issue a preliminary decision on the application, and a Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments. If a hearing request is timely filed in Response to this Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Air Permit, the time period for requesting a contested case hearing will be extended to thirty days after the mailing of the executive director's response to comments.

After the final deadline for public comments following the Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or is on a mailing list for this application.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING You may request a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 30 days from this notice, the executive director may approve the application. A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decisions on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues raised by you or others during the public comment period and not withdrawn.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing"; (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; and (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility. If the request is made by a group or an association, the one or more members who have standing to request a hearing and the interests which the group or association seeks to protect, must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the executive director will forward the application and any requests for contested case hearing to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact relating to relevant and material air quality concerns raised during the comment period. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.
