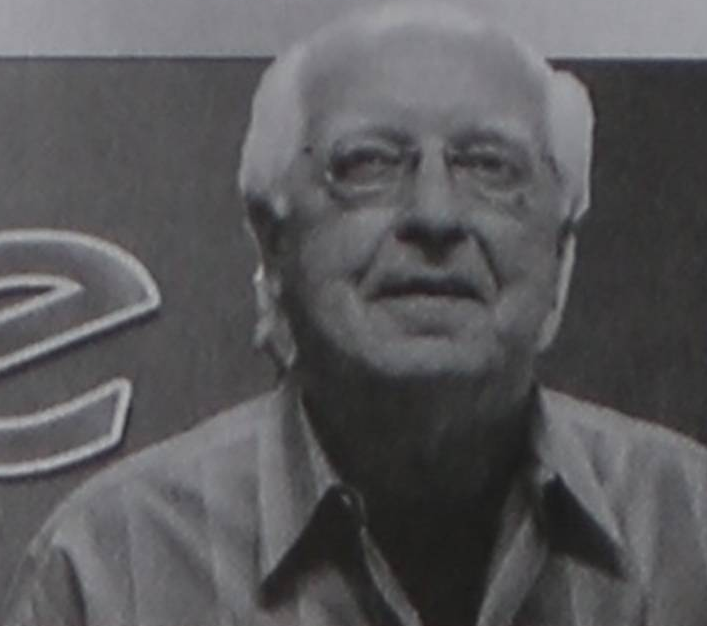

The older I get the farther I move down the intelligence scale.

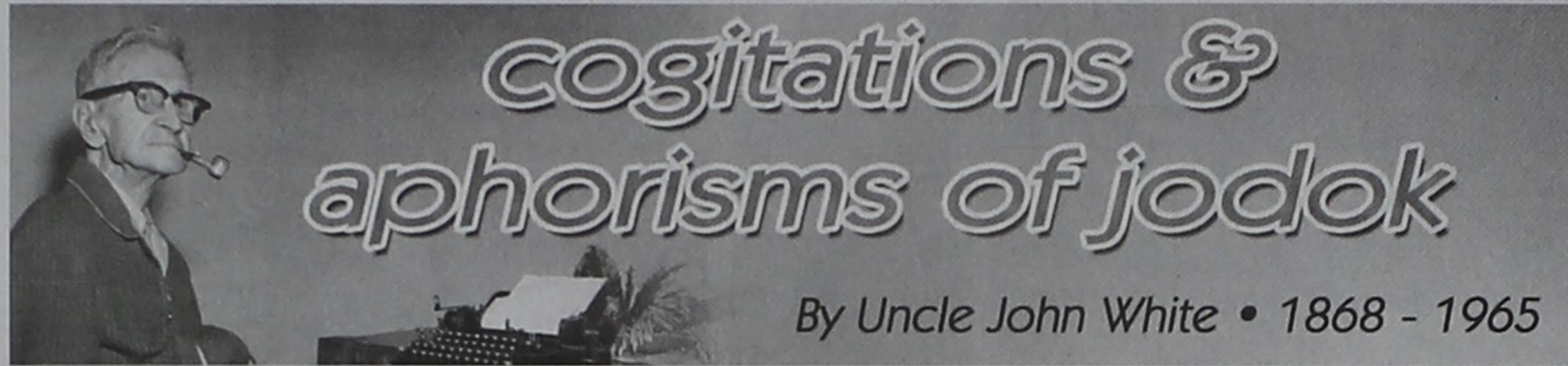

From the November 1, 1935, Friona Star. Uncle John tries his hand at sports writing although there seems to be more writing than sports. Friona lost to Hereford 33-0 and Eva Settle was crowned Football Queen. Speaking of the loss he wrote, "although the Chiefs were held scoreless by the skilled and husky Whitefaces, who outclassed them in weight and size, they carried on manfully and played a mighty good game and took their defeat like true sportsmen."

Apparently the Friona football field had lights installed for the first time in 1935 as the "floodlights" are referred to in the narrative. We are not sure where the football field was located in 1935. If anyone knows please let us know too. Several senior players mentioned were Noel Bengier, O.D. McLellan, Harry Gowers, Carl Schlinker, Lee Spring, and Eugene Boggess. Chieftain football in 1935. Here's Uncle John White.

Well! We attended the football game here last Friday night between the Hereford Whitefaces and the Friona Chiefs, and while I know so little about the game, I judge that it was a mighty good game, although our Friona boys got "skunked" to the tune of 31--or something like that--to nothing.

But the fact that everything went off peacefully and steadily, and neither team seemed to be trying to take unfair advantage of the other, led me to believe that it was a good game and we enjoyed it very much. When I say "we" I mean myself and the other members of the family. We drove out in the car and by paying an extra quarter we were allowed to drive around the opposite of the court from the stadium and sit in the car and watch the game without being exposed to the chilling atmosphere.

And the game was not all the attractions we found out at the ball court, or "gridiron" as I sometimes hear it called. Anyway what I mean by the court is the place where they play football and there is lots of room on that side for cars to park and people can sit in the cars and watch the game in comfort.

But there was one thing I noticed and that is, that this space is marked off into smaller spaces just wide enough for one car, and some of those spaces have been sold to people who expect to visit the game each week, so they have paid \$1.00 each for their special space and these spaces are reserved each game night for the ones who have paid for them, and that payment

is in addition to the admission fee which included 25-cents for the car and 25-cents for each person in the car.

I also noticed that those in charge of the grounds and the game have arranged for each person who parks there to have an equal chance with each other person or persons so parked and to this end they have erected a wire on short stakes just high enough that a car cannot pass over them and each driver is required to stop his car about three feet before he reaches the wire.

At first I was at a loss to know why we should not drive up touching the wire, but my observations later solved that problem, for I noticed when the game started many of the occupants of the cars preferred to leave their cars and follow the players as they advanced toward the goals and this space was left so that they could do so without getting over into the ball ground limits where they might interfere with the players.

Thus they were able to keep abreast of the players without getting in their way and in order that they might not obstruct the view of those who remained in their cars, they sat on some car bumper.

The Hereford band accompanied the team and pep squad and both the Hereford and Friona pep squads executed some nice maneuvers during the intermission between the two halves of the game. I do not know definitely who is deserving of the praise for the excellent planning, arranging, and execution of these football games, but I am of the opinion that three of our teachers have to bear most of the responsibility, viz Messrs Stewart, Stroud, and Morris and I know that there are not three more gentlemanly young men to be found anywhere and they had much rather suffer a discourtesy at the hands of others than to be guilty of one themselves.

Yes, we of Friona are rather proud of our football court with its spacious stadium and brilliant flood lights, which make night playing possible and I know we are glad to welcome our neighbors to enjoy it with us but we are not "puffed up" or arrogant about it.

I realize, as do all the other citizens of the town and school district, that it has taken much time and care in planning it and that it has cost considerable money to build it. But--I am also of the opinion that it is all paid for, and that it was paid for by the school district. At any rate I am sure the city has had no part in planning it or in paying for it.

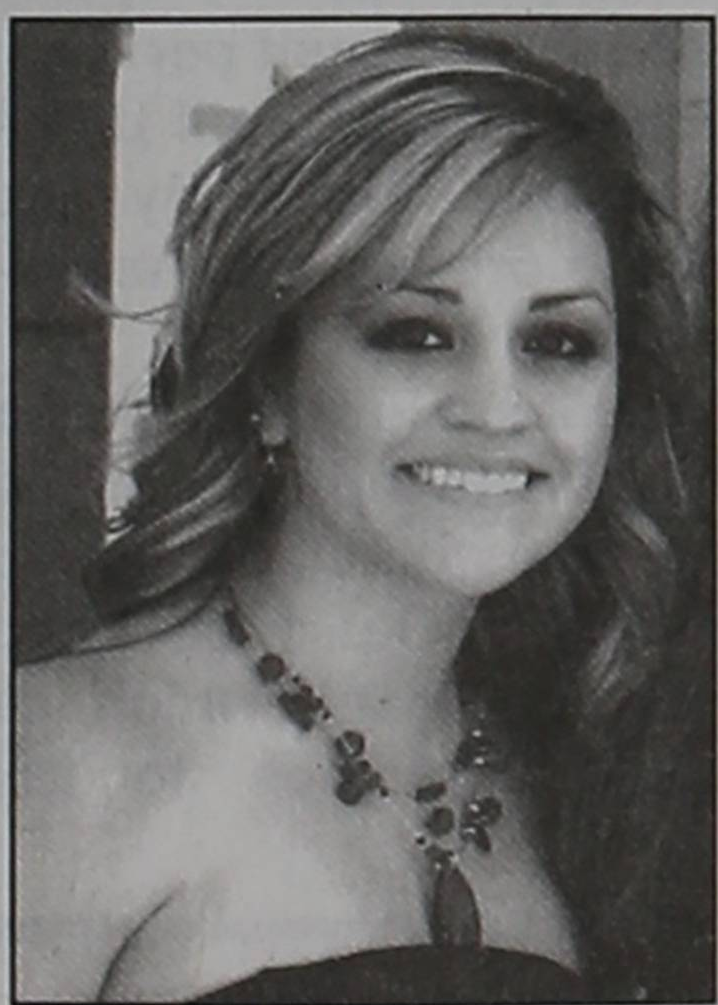

Friona 4-H holding food drive

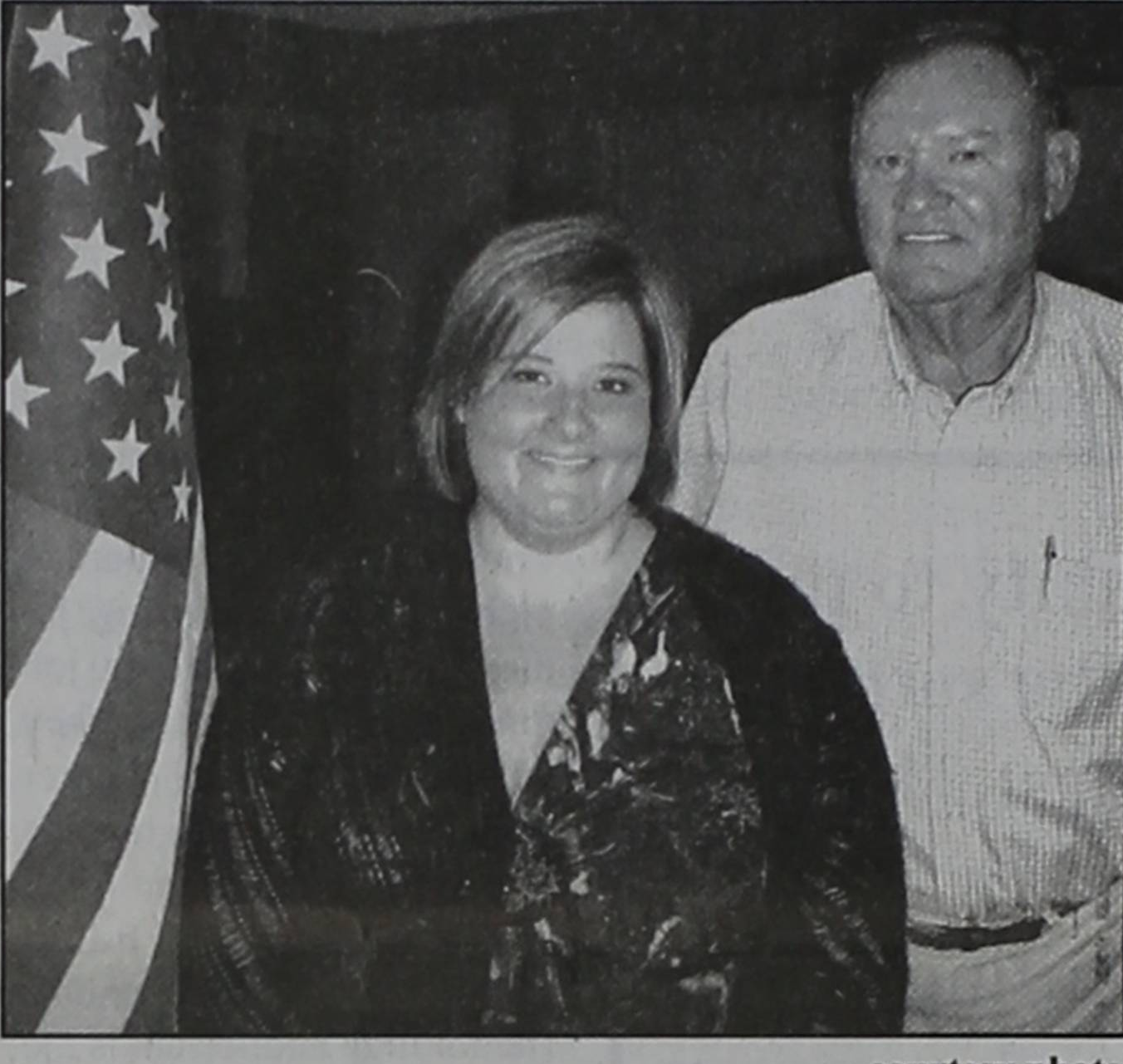

Notice to Residents of Parmer County

The Parmer County Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 11, 2011, in the county courtroom at the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas, to discuss a resolution dealing with goods-in-transit taxes.
On Oct. 1, 2011, a legislative change to Section 11.253 of the Texas Tax Code (which provides a general exemption from property taxation for certain goods-in-transit personal property) takes effect and nullifies all previous local option actions taken by the Commissioners Court to provide for the taxation of goods-in-transit.
The new statute provides a local option for the Commissioners Court to opt out of the exemption provided it takes official action to tax the goods-in-transit after Oct. 1, 2011 and before Jan. 1 of the first tax year in which the Commissioners Court proposes to tax goods-in-transit.

Chiefs fall to Childress 22-13

The Chieftains let another lead slip away in the district opener at Childress last Friday. It was perfect football weather as the Chiefs took a 13-0 halftime lead on two Caleb Monroe touchdowns, one each in the first and second quarters.

The Chief defense kept the Bobcats out of the end zone for three quarters. But Childress came out fast in the 3rd quarter, scoring two touchdowns on long runs in the first two minutes of the quarter.

A third long touchdown run for Childress was nullified when the Bobcat runner started to prance into the end zone from about the 5 yard line. Showboating at the end of a TD run is not allowed in high school and the Bobcats were penalized 15 yards. However Childress went on to score a few plays later and made a two-point conversion to take their final lead 22-13.

The Bobcats gained 306 rushing yards and only 15 passing. Friona gained 188 yards rushing and 96 passing for 284 total yards. Monroe completed 4 of 13 passes for the 96 yards, the longest a 71-yard pass play to Sawyer Osborn, which led to a Monroe touchdown. Diego Licerio and Stephen Dominguez each had pass receptions.

Monroe was the leading rusher with 86 yards on 11 attempts. Licerio was 11 carries and 44 yards, Dominguez 6 for 28, Osborn 2 for 11, and Eduardo Rojas carried 3 times for 8 yards.

The Chiefs host Lubbock Roosevelt Friday night in the homecoming game. Kickoff is at 7:30 p.m. with the crowning of the homecoming queen festivities before the game at 7 p.m.

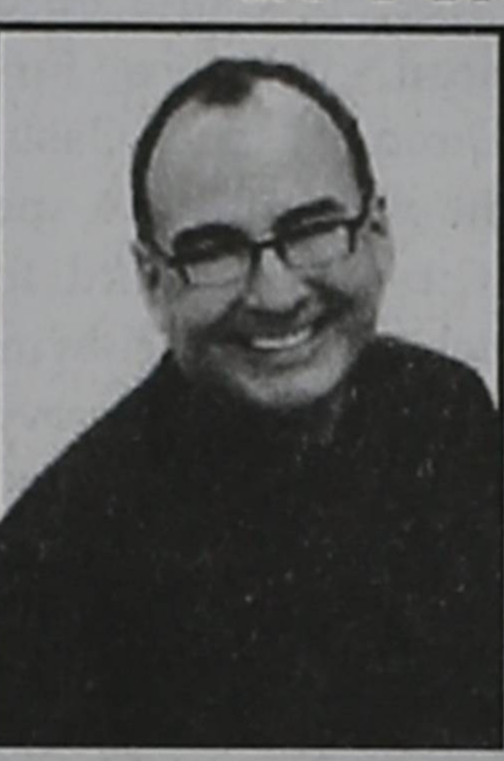

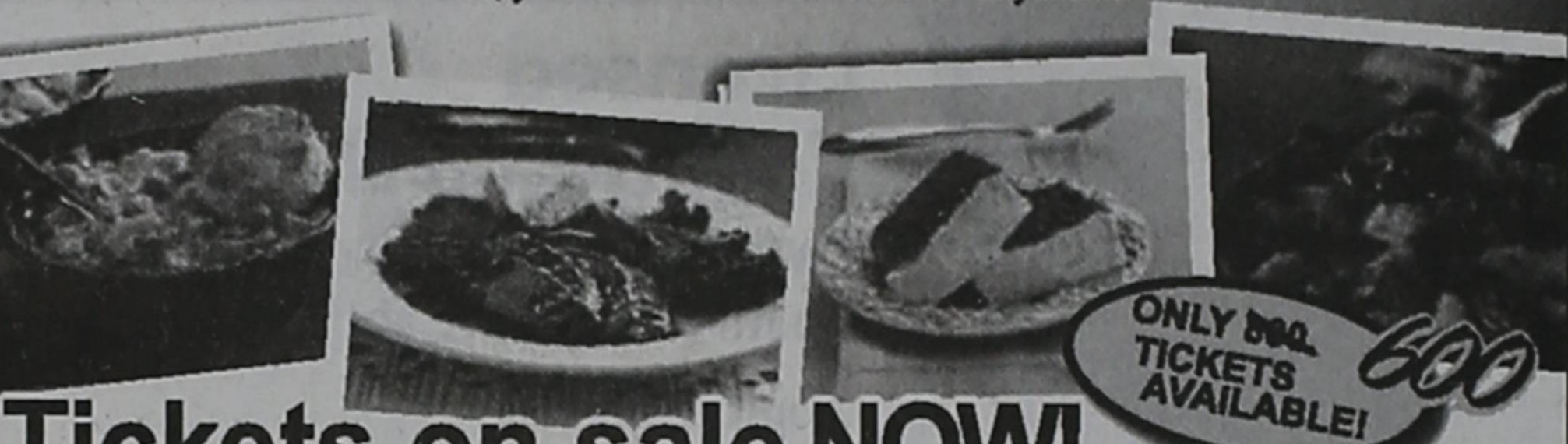

Fore County Tournament awards four scholarships

Four more West Texas A&M University students received scholarships for the 2011-2012 school year, and they have their counties and its golfers to thank for the much-needed assistance.

Proceeds from the 2011 Fore County Golf Tournament awarded scholarships to Rebecca Noggler, an equine industry and business senior from Deaf Smith County; Dennis Underwood, an agribusiness senior from Castro County; Amber Barnett, a mass communication senior from Oldham County; and Marisol Benavides, a pre-veterinary freshman from Parmer County.

In the last two years the tournament has raised enough money to give away over \$4,000 in scholarships to WTAMU students from the four counties the tournament supports, said Tim Bynum, Senior Development Officer for the College of Agriculture, Science and Engineering.

"Our job and WT's job is educating students," said Mike Mauldin, a committee member for the tournament. "We are giving scholarships that are truly helping students."

When the tournament began, it was just a WT event in Hereford where about four teams played, Mauldin said. Now the tournament has grown to over 80 players

and community support from each of the four counties over the last eight years.

At first, the event had little support and vision, Mauldin said. It took volunteers like Scott Keeling, Codi Cleavinger, Perry Kirkland and Jayson Grimsley, all Fore County Golf Tournament committee members, to improve the event, which increased the scholarship awards.

Although the years have passed and committee members don't remember who actually came up with the play-on-words name for the tournament, the group does remember to support WTAMU and their local communities, Mauldin said.

All tournament fees and sponsorships go directly toward the scholarship dollars awarded to WTAMU students, so what is raised is what is given. Sponsorship for the event is one area the committee would like to improve. Sponsors for this year's event were: Hi-Pro Feeds in Friona, First Financial Bank of Hereford, Kirkland Feedyard of Vega, Keeling Cattle Feeders of Hereford, Cargill of Friona, First United Bank of Dimmitt, and Castro County Farm Bureau of Dimmitt. A special thanks to the City of Hereford for hosting the event each year and allowing the Fore County Tournament to take over the course for one day.

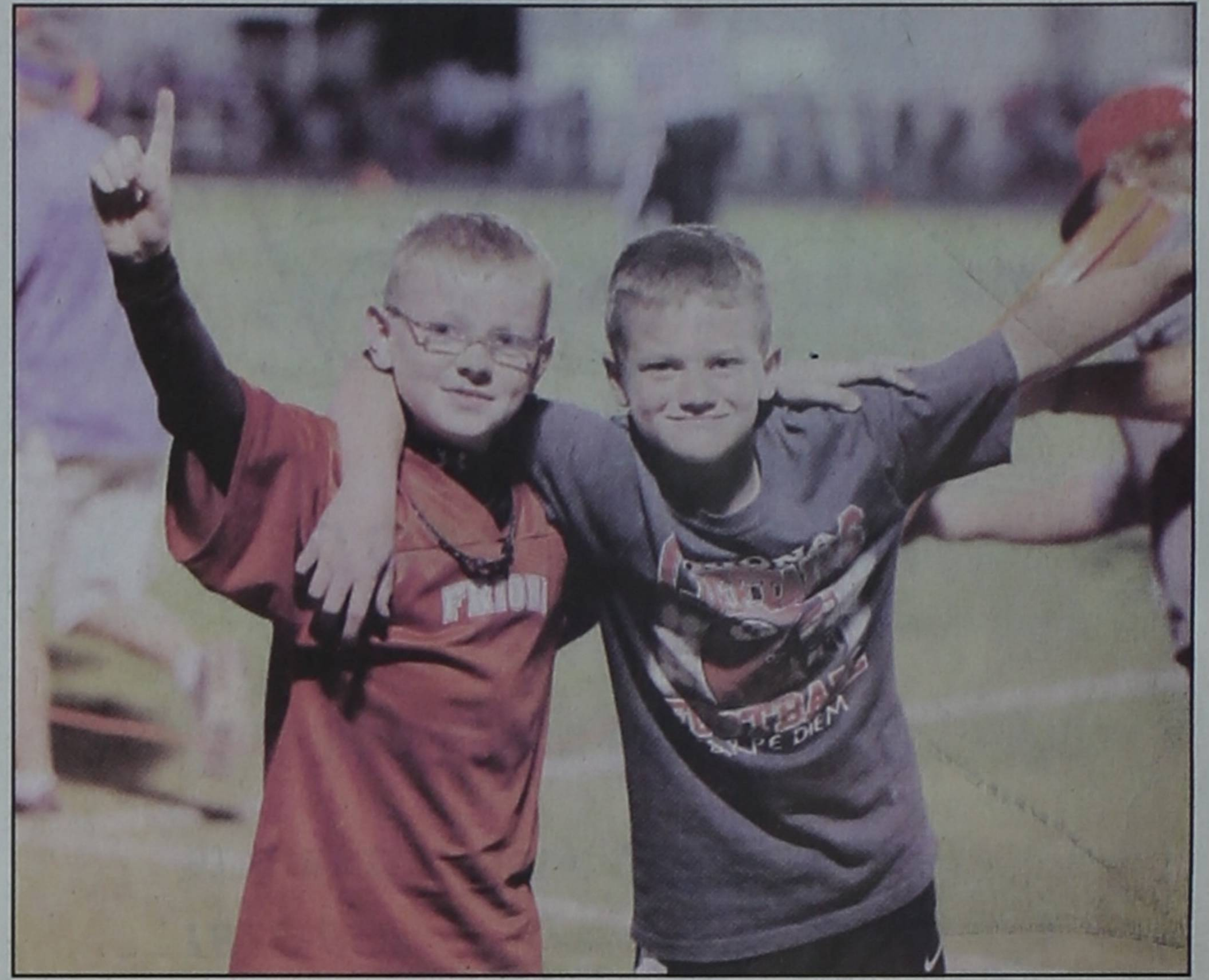
