revenue in September was $\$ 1.76$ billion, up 11.8 percent comrevenue in September was
pared to September 2010 pared to September 2010. "Texas sales tax collections have now increased for 18
straight months." Combs said "All sectors showed in September, led by business spending, especially in the oil and gas-related sectors. Consumer sectors like restaurants and retail trade were also up. The recovery in Texas has brought sales tax collections almost back to peak 2008 levels, however the near-term outlook remains clouded due to the uneven performance of the U.S. economy.
